### GAME DAY NOTABLES

- Today's game against Chicago State is the final non-conference regular season game for Michigan. The Wolverines are 9-1 so far in the 2005 non-conference season, which is the best 10-game start under coach Tommy Amaker.
- Michigan's 9-1 start is the best 10-game start to a season since the 1982-83 season (9-1) and the 1963-64 season (9-1).
- After playing two exhibition games at home, Chicago State has played its first 12 games on the road, including the opening Mid-Con conference game at IUPUI.
- Chicago State comes to Ann Arbor playing its third game in a five-day stretch. The Cougars lost at Saint Louis (58-52, Dec. 28), lost at IUPUI (87-64, Dec. 30) and will play the Wolverines in the third game (Dec. 31).
- Michigan is 4-0 all-time against Chicago State. With today's game, all five games the Wolverines have played against the Cougars have been in Ann Arbor at Crisler Arena.
- The last time Michigan and Chicago State met was in 1991 when the Wolverines defeated the Cougars 112-62 (Dec. 9, 1991) at Crisler Arena.
- In Michigan's four wins over Chicago State, the Maize and Blue have won by an average of 29.5 points -- 17 (79-62, Dec. 9, 1985); 27 (84-57, Dec. 11, 1989); 24 (102-78, Dec. 12, 1990) and 50 (112-62, Dec. 9, 1991).
- Michigan has shot over 60 percent in back-to-back games - a season-best 64.3 percent against Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22) and followed by a 60.8 percent performance against Coppin State (Dec. 28). For the season, U-M has four games shooting over 60 percent and is shooting 50.3 percent overall.
- Courtney Sims leads the Wolverines shooting 68.1 percent from the field. That mark also puts him atop the Big Ten Conference.
- Michigan has four players averaging in double figures - Courtney Sims (15.6), Daniel Horton (14.4), Lester Abram (12.0) and Dion Harris (10.1).
- Courtney Sims and Graham Brown are neck-and-neck in the rebounding battle. Sims leads with 7.4 per game, while Brown is right behind him at 7.3.
- Daniel Horton recorded a career-best-tying 10 assists against Coppin State (Dec. 28). With his 11 points, he recorded the first double-double (points-assists) in five years (1999-2000). He leads the Wolverines with 5.5 assists a game.

## TEAM ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Michigan basketball program will posthumously honor NCAA All-American Bill Buntin (1963-65) by retiring his jersey, No. 22, in a halftime ceremony during the Wolverines' Big Ten Conference home opener against Purdue (Jan. 6). Buntin becomes the fifth player in Michigan history to have his jersey to hang in the Crisler Arena rafters, joining Cazzie Russell (1964-66), whose jersey was retired Dec. 11, 1993; Rudy Tomjanovich (1967-70), whose jersey was retired Feb. 8, 2003; Phil Hubbard (1975-79), whose jersey was retired Jan. 11, 2004 and Glen Rice (1986-89), whose jersey was retired Feb. 20, 2005. Buntin's family and teammates will take part in the ceremony.

Michigan announced junior Brent Petway has missed the fall semester of the basketball season due to academic ineligibility. He will be allowed to practice but cannot participate in games during the first semester. Petway has played in 62 career games with five starts. He averaged 5.4 points, 4.4 rebounds and 1.2 blocks while shooting 60.4 percent from the field in his two seasons with the Wolverines.

The Wolverines opened the season holding their annual Maize and Blue Scrimmage. In addition to the game itself, which was a thrilling 53-50 overtime win for the Maize squad, the event took on more meaning as the Wolverines raised \$960 for Hurricane victims. Fans generously donated money as they took in the scrimmage, got autographs, won raffle prizes and watched the Wolverine football team's 33-17 victory over Northwestern on the big screens at Crisler Arena.

The Michigan basketball program and Sports Talk 1050 WTKA have teamed up for a third season of the Michigan Basketball Assistant Coaches Show. During the 2005-06 season, WTKA will host the Michigan Basketball Assistant Coaches Show, scheduled from 7 to 8 p.m. Along with WTKA Sports Beat in the Afternoon host Dennis Fithian, a U-M assistant coach -- Chuck Swenson, Andrew Moore or Mike Jackson -- will join Fithian to discuss Michigan Basketball throughout the course of the season. ESPN will be conducting a "Pride of the Program" series throughout the 2005-06 season. It features all 326 Division I college basketball programs and highlight a significant moment in each program's history. For the Wolverines, their feature will air Wednesday, Feb. 1. The U-M moment will show the Wolverines capturing the program's first national title in 1989. Coached by interim coach Steve Fisher, and led by the Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, Glen Rice (31 pts), U-M won its first national title after Rumeal Robinson sealed the win for Michigan by hitting two clutch free throws with :03 left in overtime to clinch the win 80-79.

## TEAM NOTABLES

For the first time in Michigan basketball history, the Maize and Blue have elected four players to serve as captain for the upcoming 2005-06 season. Seniors Lester Abram, Graham Brown, Sherrod Harrell and Chris Hunter were all selected in a team vote prior to the 2005 Basketball Awards Celebration. Abram, Brown and Harrell will all serve as captain for their second straight season after serving as tri-captains in 2004-05. Prior to this season's quad captains, the Wolverines have had no more than three players serve as captain in the 89 years of Michigan Basketball. The Maize and Blue have had tri-captains a total of four times - 1999-2000, 2000-01, 2002-03 and 2004-05.

Michigan started the 2005-06 season running off seven straight wins. That start was the best for the Wolverines under coach Tommy Amaker. The previous best start under Amaker was a 4-0 beginning during the 2003-04 season, where the Wolverines went on to capture the 2004 Postseason NIT championship.

Michigan's 7-0 start was the best for the program since the vacated 1996-97 season, when the Wolverines started 8-0. The last non-vacated season was when the Wolverines started 11-0 to begin the 1988-89 season, where U-M went on to win the program's only national championship.

Michigan has continued its hot start and is 9-1 overall. It is the best 10-game start to a season since the 1982-83 season (9-1) and the 1963-64 season (9-1).

Michigan has won its first three road games of the season with a 68-47 win at South Florida (Dec. 10), a 71-67 win at Notre Dame (Dec. 3) and a 51-46 win at Boston University (Nov. 22). The last time the Wolverines won three straight road games was during a 13-game winning streak in the 2002-03 season.

With the 68-47 win at South Florida (Dec. 10), Michigan won its third road game of the season. The last time the Wolverines went 3-0 on the road to start a season, was during the vacated 1996-97 season, when U-M went 5-0 in the first road or neutral site games. The last non-vacated season, was during the 1991-92 season, when U-M won its first five games on the road or at neutral sites.

Michigan has held its opponents to 60 or less points in six of its 10 games this season. The list includes: Central Michigan, (60, Nov. 18); at Boston University (46, Nov. 22); Miami (Fla.) (53, Nov. 29); Delaware State (49, Dec. 7), at South Florida (47, Dec. 10) and Coppin State (53, Dec. 28). The Wolverines are averaging 72.7 points a game, while holding their opponents to 59.7 points a game.

\* Due to NCAA sanctions, the University of Michigan has vacated the records from the 1992-93, '95-96, '96-97, '97-98 and '98-99 seasons.

Games affected are: 170 total games, 113-57 overall record, 50-36 Big Ten, 7-4 NCAA, 5-0 NIT and 4-1 Big Ten Tournament.

It also reflects vacating the 1992 Final Four appearance; the 1997 NIT championship; 1993, 1996 and 1998 NCAA Tournament appearances; and the 1998 Big Ten Tournament championship.

By holding South Florida (Dec. 10) to just 47 points, Michigan posted back-to-back games holding its opponent to under 50 points. Earlier that week, the Wolverines held Delaware State (Dec. 7) to 49 points. Michigan has held three opponents to 50 points or less this season.

With the 21-point win (68-47) at South Florida (Dec. 10), Michigan recorded back-to-back 20-plus point victories. Earlier in that week, the Maize and Blue defeated Delaware State (Dec. 7) by 20 at Crisler Arena (69-49). So far this season, U-M has won by 20-plus point five times -- Central Michigan (27, Nov. 18); Miami (Fla.) (21, Nov. 29); Delaware State (20); at South Florida (21) and Coppin State (28, Dec. 28).

Michigan has twice posted a season-best offensive output of 87 points. The Wolverines did it against both MAC teams on the schedule with 87 points against Central Michigan (Nov. 18) and then against Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22). The Wolverines have three games with 80-or-more points after an 81 outburst against Coppin State (Dec. 28). For the season, U-M is averaging 72.7 points a game.

Michigan has had at least two players score in double digits in each of the first 10 games. The Wolverines have recorded a season best five players in double figures, two times - against Miami (Fla.) (Nov. 29) in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge and against Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22). The Maize and Blue have had four players scoring in double-figures in five games.

Michigan has four players are averaging in double figures for the Wolverines as Courtney Sims is averaging a career-best 15.6 points, Daniel Horton is averaging a career-best 14.4 points, Lester Abram is averaging 12.0 points and Dion Harris is averaging 10.1 points. The quad-group of Wolverines has attributed for 71.6 percent of the Wolverines offense this season.

With 40 rebounds at South Florida (Dec. 10) and a season-high 43 against Delaware State (Dec. 7), Michigan had back-to-back games with 40-or-more rebounds. In fact, the Wolverines have recorded three games with 40-or-more rebounds after grabbing 42 against Miami (Fla.) (Nov. 29) in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. The Maize and Blue are averaging 34.8 rebounds a game, which is 7.5 better than its opponents, who are averaging 27.3 per game.

Michigan's 16 offensive rebounds at South Florida (Dec. 10), was the second best performance by the Wolverines this season. U-M had a season-best 18 against Miami (Fla.) (Nov. 19) in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. The Maize and Blue now have four games with 10-or-more offensive rebounds.

Michigan outrebounded Delaware State (Dec. 7), 43-18, which was a difference of a season-best 25. The prior season best was when the Wolverines outrebounded Central Michigan (Nov. 18) by 16 (37-21) in the season opener. The Wolverines have outrebounded their opponents in 7-of-10 games, with four of those games by 10-or-more.

Four times this season Michigan has shot 60 percent or better from the field in a game -- against Central Michigan (Nov. 18 -- 60.4 percent, 29-for-48); against Delaware State (Dec. 7 -- 60.0 percent, 27-for-45), against Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22 -- 64.3 percent, 27-for-42) and against Coppin State (Dec. 28 -- 60.8 percent, 31-for-51). For the season, Michigan is shooting 50.3 percent from the field.

Michigan shot a season-best from three-point range, connecting on 9-of-16 attempts for 56.2 percent against Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22). For the season, the Wolverines have shot 40.1 percent from long range (65-for-162).

Michigan is shooting 74.5 percent on free throws this season, which is second in the Big Ten. The Wolverines have two players shooting over 80 percent on the season -- Dion Harris (7-for-8) and Daniel Horton (82.8 (24-for-29). Jerret Smith has gone a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line through nine games.

Juniors Courtney Sims and Dion Harris have not missed a single game in their Michigan careers playing in 75 straight games. Sophomore Ron Coleman added his name to the list as he has played in 41 straight for the Maize and Blue.

Throughout 2004-05, Michigan lost 86 total games due to injuries and other various reasons. The Maize and Blue used 16 different lineups in 31 games in 2004-05 and did not have a single game the entire season with every player at Tommy Amaker's disposal.

Injuries plagued Michigan during the entire 2004-05 season. The most severe loss was Lester Abram, who was out for the year following left shoulder surgery (Dec. 16, 2004). The list of significant injuries throughout the 2004-05 season included: Daniel Horton (four weeks, knee sprain), Graham Brown (four and a half weeks, hernia) and Dani Wohl (four weeks, elbow). Chris Hunter (eight games, right ankle), Brent Petway (two games, shoulder), Amadou Ba (two games, knee and four games, lower back), Ashtyn Bell (five games, broken nose) and Alex Brzozowicz (four games, right ankle) all missed games due to injury.

For the fourth straight year, Michigan could field a starting lineup of lefties. The Wolverines could put Jerret Smith, Alex Brzozowicz and Lester Abram on the perimeter and have Brent Petway and Graham Brown in the post.

## INDIVIDUAL NOTES

### SENIOR WING LESTER ABRAM

Lester Abram was named one of four captains by his teammates for the 2005-06 season. He joins Graham Brown, Sherrod Harrell and Chris Hunter as the programs first quad-captain appointment.

Lester Abram has scored in double figures in 8-of-10 games in 2005-06. For the season he is averaging 12.0 points a game and had a season-best 19 points against Central Michigan (Nov. 18) in the season-opener. In the first game he didn't score in double figures -- at Notre Dame (Dec. 3) -- he hit four free throws, including two that sealed the road win with 1.9 seconds remaining. The other game was against Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22), when he finished with eight points.

Lester Abram has scored in double figures in 46 of 74 career games, currently holding 864 career points for the Maize and Blue. He is 136 points away from become the 40th Wolverine scoring 1,000 career points. For his career he is averaging 11.7 points a game.

Lester Abram is shooting 53.9 percent from the floor after going 41-for-76 from the field. He also 11-for-23 on three pointers (47.8 percent) and is 27-for-35 from the free throw line (77.1 percent). He has gone perfect from the free throw line in four games, including a season-best 7-for-7 performance at South Florida (Dec. 10)

Against Coppin State (Dec. 28), Lester Abram recorded a career-high five assists. Currently, he had 96 in his career for a 1.3 per game average. He needs four assists to reach 100 in his career.

Against Miami (Fla.) in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, Lester Abram recorded a career-high four steals. Currently, he has 72 in his career for a 1.0 per game average. He needs 28 steals to reach 100 in his career.

Lester Abram has been a big asset to the Wolverines when up at the free throw line. Overall, Abram is second all-time at Michigan with an 84.2 career free throw percentage. As a freshman, he set the U-M freshman-class record shooting 85.6 percent, and then came back the next season to tie Cazzie Russell's sophomore-class mark with an 84.3 percentage. To start the 2005-06 season, Abram has gone 27-for-35 for an 77.1 percentage mark.

Lester Abram missed the 28 games of the 2004-05 season following surgery (Dec. 16, 2004) for a left shoulder injury. Abram, who played in only three games, applied for and was granted a medical hardship (redshirt) to regain an additional year of eligibility. He made his return to the floor in the 2005-05 season-opener against Central Michigan (Nov. 18), scoring 19 points.

### SENIOR CENTER AMADOU BA

For two straight years, Amadou Ba has been named as U-M's Travis Conlan Sportsmanship Award winner for his dedication and work ethic for the Wolverine program. He has played in 17 career games for the Wolverines.

Amadou Ba has played in six games in 2005-06 coming off the bench. He filled in a Boston University (Nov. 22) when the U-M post players got into foul trouble and come off the bench in the final minutes against Central Michigan (Nov. 18), Miami (Fla.) (Nov. 29) in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, Delaware State (Dec. 7), Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22) and Coppin State (Dec. 28).

Amadou Ba scored his first career points on a lay-up from an Alex Brzozowicz bounce pass in the closing minutes against UNC Asheville (Dec. 21, 2004). He has tied that mark on two other occasions -- with two points against Penn State (Feb. 23, 2005), on a putback that was ruled goaltending after a Nittany Lion tipped it out of the rim, and with two points against Central Michigan (Nov. 18, 2005) on a lay-up from an inside bounce pass from Sherrod Harrell.

Amadou Ba saw a career-high seven minutes of action at Boston University (Nov. 22). Ba came off the bench after the Wolverine post players got into foul trouble in the first half. Ba finished the game with a career-high-tying two rebounds and his first career steal.

## SENIOR FORWARD GRAHAM BROWN

Graham Brown was named one of four captains by his teammates for the 2005-06 season. He joins Lester Abram, Sherrod Harrell and Chris Hunter as the program's first quad-captain appointment.

Graham Brown recorded four straight games with 10-or-more rebounds. During that streak, he had 10 at South Florida (Dec. 10), a career-high 12 against Delaware State (Dec. 7), 11 against Miami (Fla.) (Nov. 29) and 10 at Notre Dame, which helped him to his second career double-double. For the season, Brown is averaging a career-best and team-high 7.3 rebounds a game. Throughout the season, he has recorded 10-or-more rebounds in five games.

Graham Brown has drawn 14 charging calls. Recently, ESPN's Bill Raftery labeled Brown, the "Junk-man" and/or "glue-man" because he does all the little things for the Wolverines -- setting screens, drawing charges, tip-in buckets, leading by example, grabbing key rebounds and just showing how he has become a savvy veteran.

The "Maize Rage," U-M's student crowd, has made Graham Brown its second Wolverine to earn a nickname. Brown is affectionately known as "Moose" to the Maize and Blue faithful. However, Brown prefers the nickname "Hambone" given to him by his father, Rich, when he was a small boy. The Maize Rage's first dubbing was "Air Georgia" for Brent Petway.

Graham Brown has always been one of the Wolverines "Big Men." He has trimmed down for his final season, after turning his body fat into muscle. Brown worked all summer, and continues to work with U-M Strength coach Jim Plocki and U-M nutritionist Caroline Mandel on his overall strength and eating habits. He is now a chiseled 245.

Graham Brown's parents, Rich and Mary, have missed a total of three basketball games since Brown's middle school playing days. Both have travel to all the home and road games and have recently had to purchase a new car for their travels after putting over 200,000 miles on their previous car. Both are retired school teachers.

Graham Brown has exactly 500 career points. He also has 465 career rebounds, putting him 35 rebounds away from becoming the 34th member of U-M's 500 point/rebound club.

With 10 points against Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22), Graham Brown has two games this season scoring in double figures. He had a season best 13 points at Notre Dame (Dec. 3). Brown currently has 500 career points for a 5.2 per game average. He has 12 career games scoring in double figures.

With 13 points and 10 rebounds at Notre Dame (Dec. 3), Graham Brown turned in his second-career double-double. The other time Brown accomplished the feat was at Penn State (Jan. 15, 2005). On both occasions Brown has recorded a double-double, he was awarded the Player of the Game by the ESPN broadcast.

## FIFTH-YEAR SENIOR GUARD HAYES GROOMS

After transferring to Michigan and then walking on to the Wolverine squad, Hayes Grooms will be able to play his final season after having to sit out due to NCAA transfer rules last season. Prior to Michigan, Grooms played three years at Lamar University. He played in 62 games and averaging 1.5 points, 0.8 rebounds and 1.1 assists in his time at Lamar.

Hayes Grooms has played in five games this season coming off the bench during the final minutes against Central Michigan (Nov. 18), Miami (Fla.) (Nov. 29) in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, at South Florida (Dec. 10), Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22) and Coppin State (Dec. 28). Sherrod Harrell has played in five game this season coming off the bench in the final minutes against Central Michigan (Nov. 18), Miami (Fla.) (Nov. 29) in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, Delaware State (Dec. 7), Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22) and Coppin State (Dec. 28).

Sherrod Harrell started 12 games in 2004-05 after the Wolverine perimeter was riddled with injuries. With the extra time on the floor, Harrell tripled his playing time from 13.9 minutes as a junior compared to 4.5 as a sophomore. He set a career-high 31 minutes of action against Illinois (Feb. 8, 2005). He played in 20 or more minutes in seven games in 2004-05.

Sherrod Harrell set several career bests during the 2004-05 season. He scored a career-high seven points against South Florida (Dec. 11, 2004) before matching it against Minnesota (Feb. 2, 2005). ## SENIOR GUARD DANIEL HORTON

Daniel Horton has scored in double figures in 8-of-10 games. He had a season-high 28 points against Butler (Nov. 26). Horton is second on the Wolverines with a career-best 14.4 points a game. Horton is shooting 49.0 percent on the season (51-for-104). He is also shooting 37.5 percent (18-for-48) on three-pointers and a career-best 82.8 percent (24-for-29) on free throws.

Daniel Horton has been cool as ice for the Wolverines from the free throw line. Horton went a combined 10-for-10 in the closing minute of games at Boston University (Nov. 22) and against Butler (Nov. 28) to help the Wolverines seals victories. For the season he is shooting a career-best 82.8 percent (24-for-28).

With his 11-point effort against Coppin State (Dec. 28), Daniel Horton continues to move closer to the next spot on U-M's all-time scoring list. He is currently 31st all-time with 1,177 points, which is seven points away from the 30th spot held by Rickey Green (1,184 points, 1976-77). For his career, Horton has averaged 13.5 points a game with 65 career games scoring in double figures and 13 games with 20-or-more points. He has a career-best of 31 points at Purdue (Feb. 19, 2003).

Daniel Horton leads the Wolverines overall with a career-best 5.5 assists per game average. He recorded a career-high-tying 10 assists against Coppin State (Dec. 28) and six five games with five-or-more assists this season.

With his 11 points and career-high-tying 10 assists, Daniel Horton recorded his first career double-double. He became the first player to record a double-double (point-assists), since Jamal Crawford (1999-2000) had 14 points and 10

assists against Colorado State (Jan. 2, 2000).

With his 10 assists against Coppin State (Dec. 28), Daniel Horton moved into the seventh spot all-time for career assists. He has 365 career assists and needs 36 to move in the fifth spot held by Jalen Rose (401, 1992-94). Horton has recorded five or more assists in 40 career games and is averaging 4.2 a game for his career. He had a career-best 10 assists two times -- at Penn State (Jan. 15, 2005) and against Coppin State (Dec. 28).

After draining one triple against Coppin State (Dec. 28), Daniel Horton has 180 career three-point field goals to put third outright on Michigan's all-time list. He needs just nine to move past LaVell Blanchard (189, 2000-03 for No. 2 all-time. In addition, Horton is second all-time in three-point field goal attempts with 519 career attempts.

Daniel Horton tied a career-high with five steals at South Florida (Dec. 10). He has also accomplished the feat with five steals vs. Colorado (Nov. 17, 2004) in the second round of the Preseason NIT.

With one steal against Coppin State (Dec. 28), Daniel Horton moved into a tie for sixth all-time at U-M with 142 career steals. He shares the sixth spot with Thad Garner (142, 1979-82). He now needs just eight steals to join Michigan's five-member 150 steal club and grab the fifth all-time spot held by Rumeal Robinson (150, 1988-90).

## SENIOR FORWARD CHRIS HUNTER

Chris Hunter was named one of four captains by his teammates for the 2005-06 season. He joins Lester Abram, Graham Brown and Sherrod Harrell as the program's first quad-captain appointment.

Chris Hunter is enrolled in U-M's prestigious Stephen M. Ross School of Business, which is ranked as one of the top three business schools in the country. Hunter is on track to graduate with a degree in business administration and has interests in starting his own business.

Chris Hunter recorded back-to-back 15-point performances, which were season-best outputs. He had 15 against UCLA (Dec. 17) to lead the Wolverines. He also had eight rebounds in a season-best 27 minutes of action. He then enjoyed a perfect night of shooting connecting on 4-of-4 attempts from the floor, including three triples and 4-of-4 attempts from the free-throw line against Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22) for his second straight 15-point outing. For the season, he is averaging 7.2 points per game coming off the bench.

Chris Hunter saw his offensive production nearly double in 2004-05 as he averaged 9.3 points per game. He averaged 5.4 as a freshman and 5.0 as a sophomore. In 2005-06, Hunter has come off the bench to average 7.2 points and 4.1 rebounds a game.

With his 11 points against Miami (Fla.) (Nov. 29) in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, Chris Hunter surpassed 500 career points. He currently has 558 career points. For his career he is averaging 7.2 points per game. He also has 298 career rebounds, putting him 202 rebounds away from becoming the 34th member of the 500 point/rebound club.

Chris Hunter recorded a career-high 22 points against High Point (Dec. 7, 2004). Hunter posed a threat to the Panthers after putting up 15 points in the first half and, as a result, was double-teamed in the second frame. Despite the disadvantage, Hunter was still able to put up seven points in the final 20 minutes to finish the contest with 22 points.

Chris Hunter continues to have the green light when it comes to the long-range shot. So far this season he has gone 7-for-15 from long range (46.7 percent). In 2004-05, he was 11-for-31 from the three-point line for a 35.5 percentage mark. For his career he is shooting 37.3 percent (22-for-59) from three-point land.

Chris Hunter tied a career-high with three steals at Boston University (Nov. 22). He has had three steals on two other occasions -- against Iowa (March 12, 2005) and against Purdue (March 8, 2003). In his career, he had 40 career steals.

Chris Hunter has recorded at least one block in 47 of 85 career games, tallying 68 total blocks in his career. He had a career-best four swats against Eastern Michigan (Dec. 23, 2002). He needs 22 blocks to crack Michigan's all-time top 10.

## FIFTH-YEAR SENIOR GUARD TROY SANCHEZ

After starting just 11 games as a freshman, Harris received the starting nod in 30 games as a sophomore and started nine games in 2005-06. In fact, since Lester Abram surrendered his starting position to build Harris's confidence in 2003-04 with five games remaining, Harris has started in 47 of the last 49 games for the Maize

and Blue.

With his 31 assists and 11 turnovers, Dion Harris is third the Big Ten in Assist/Turnover ratio. He had four games with four-or-more assists and has not had more than two turnovers in a game the entire season. He is averaging 3.1 assists per game.

With 21 points against Coppin State (Dec. 28), Dion Harris has 888 career points in his Michigan career. He needs just 112 more to become the 40th Wolverines to reach 1,000 career points. For his career he is averaging 11.8 points a game. He has scoring in double-figures in 49 career games with nine games scoring 20 or more points.

Dion Harris had a career-best 25 points against Iowa (March 5), after going 9-for-25 from the field, which included a career-best six three-point fields. He has nine career games with 20 or more points in a game.

Dion Harris has played 30-or-more minutes in 49 of 75 career games and he has reached 40 minute mark five times, including a career-high 44 against Arizona (Nov. 24, 2004) in the Preseason NIT semifinal.

With 147 of his 301 career field goals coming from beyond the arc, Dion Harris has produced 48.8 percent of his offense from long range.

Dion Harris has a career three-point percentage of 34.6 (147-for-425). His 147 triples currently rank him fifth all-time, just 13 away from fourth place held by Robbie Reid (160, 1998-99), while his 425 attempts are fourth, 60 away from third held by LaVell Blanchard (485, 2000-03).

With three assists at Notre Dame (Dec. 3), Dion Harris passed 200 in his career. He currently has 216 assists and is averaging 2.9 assists per game in his career. As a sophomore, Harris recorded his first season with 100-plus assists after finishing with 109. He had a career-high eight assists against UNC Asheville (Dec. 31, 2004).

## JUNIOR FORWARD BRENT PETWAY

Michigan announced junior Brent Petway will miss the fall semester of the basketball season due to academic ineligibility. Petway will be allowed to practice but cannot participate in games during the first semester. Petway has played in 62 career games with five starts. He averaged 5.4 points, 4.4 rebounds and 1.2 blocks while shooting 60.4 percent from the field in his two seasons with the Wolverines.

Brent Petway underwent left shoulder surgery (May 2, 2005) following the 2004-05 season. After injuring the shoulder in high school, he aggravated the injury against Delaware State (Dec. 29, 2004). He wore a protective brace the remainder of the season. Following the season, he elected to have surgery to correct the injury and has made a full recovery.

Brent Petway showed his talents off the court at the annual student-athlete fund-raiser "Mock Rock," benefiting U-M's Mott's Children's Hospital. Petway brought the house down with his rendition of the rap song of Dem Franchize Boyz called "Tall T." He then broke out into a breakdance routine during his six-minute act. He received a perfect 50 from the judges to win the annual student-athlete competition. "Mock Rock" raised over \$10,000 for the hospital.

Prior to coming to Michigan and with his near 42-inch vertical leap, Brent Petway earned the nickname "Throw It Up" for his highlight reel dunks. Michigan's student section now calls Petway "Air Georgia" after thrilling the Crisler Arena crowd with his aerial shows.

Brent Petway is 142-for-235 for his career from the field for a 60.4 percentage mark. Of his 142 field goals, 73 of them have come via the dunk, for 51.4 percent of his offensive production coming above the rim.

Brent Petway had 47 blocks for a 1.6 per game average throughout the 2004-05 season. His total as a sophomore smashed the 28 he had as a freshman. He has 75 career swats, which is only three away from cracking into Michigan's all-time top 10. For his career he has recorded at least one block in 35 of 62 career games including 17 multi-block games.

## Morris, Sims Sign with U-M During Early Signing Period

The University of Michigan men's basketball program received National Letters of Intent (Nov. 9) from two student-athletes on the first day of the early signing period: DeShawn Sims, a 6-8 forward from Detroit, Mich., and K'len Morris, a 6-4 wing from Grand Blanc, Mich.

Sims, who is a candidate for the 2005 Michigan's Hal Schram Mr. Basketball Award, has averaged 14.8 points, 8.8 rebounds and 2.0 blocks per game over the last three seasons at Pershing High School in Detroit. Sims was a 2005 Detroit News Dream Team and Associated Press and Detroit Free Press Class A All-State selection as a junior. He was also a Detroit News and Detroit Free Press All-Detroit and All-Metro first team selection.

Morris, who is also a candidate for the 2005 Michigan's Hal Schram Mr. Basketball Award, has averaged 12.9 points, 6.7 rebounds and 4.8 assists in his high school career. As a junior, Morris led Grand Blanc to its first regional game win since 1959 in the state playoffs and was an Associated Press and Detroit News Class A All-State selection after he scored 15-plus points in 18 of 25 games. He has also been an All-Big Nine Conference first team selection in 2005 and a third team selection in 2004.

## JUNIOR FORWARD COURTNEY SIMS

Courtney Sims has played in 75 consecutive games for the Wolverines with 67 career starts. He started all 34 as a freshman, 23 as a sophomore and has started all 10 games as a junior.

Courtney Sims was named the Big Ten Player of the Week for Dec. 11 after averaging 23.0 points and 10.0 rebounds, and shooting 76.0 (19-for-25) in wins over Delaware State (Dec. 7) and at South Florida (Dec. 10). Against Delaware State, Sims tallied a career-high 33 points on a career-best 13-for-17 shooting from the field. He also had 13 rebounds to collect his sixth career double-double. Sims wrapped up the week by going 6-for-8 from the field (.750) for 13 points along with seven rebounds, all offensive, at South Florida.

Courtney Sims tallied a career-high 33 points on a career-best 13 field goals on a career-best 17 field goal attempts against Delaware State (Dec. 7). Sims also tallied 13 rebounds to help give him his sixth career double-double. The last time a Wolverine had 30-or-more points was when Daniel Horton had a career-best 31 points at Purdue (Feb. 19, 2003). Sims' previous best was 25 point against Northwestern (March 10, 2005) in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament.

Courtney Sims has now scored in double figures in 8-of-10 games, with three

games over 20 points and a career-high 33 points against Delaware State (Dec. 7). He leads the Wolverines with a career-best 15.6 points a game.

Courtney Sims remains red hot from inside the post as he is shooting 68.1 percent from the field as he is 62-for-91 on the season. He set a new career-high with 13 field goals against Delaware State (Dec. 7) as well as attempts with 17 total.

Courtney Sims is currently averaging a career-best 7.4 rebounds a game. He has 74 total boards through 10 games, with 50 coming at home and 24 on the road. He had a season-best 13 rebounds against Delaware State (Dec. 7). He set a career-high with seven offensive rebounds at South Florida (Dec. 10).

Courtney Sims has scored in double figures in 36 career games and is averaging 9.7 points per game. He has 724 career points, which is 76 points away from 800. He has four career games with 20 or more points in a game. He needs 276 to reach 1,000 points.

With his eight rebounds at Wisconsin (Feb. 16, 2005), Courtney Sims reached the 300-rebound mark in his young career. Sims has 395 career rebounds and has steadily improved his glasswork in each of his seasons – 4.7 (2003-04), 5.2 (2004-05) and 7.4 (2005-06). He needs just 105 to become the 34th member of the U-M 500 rebounding club.

Courtney Sims has 724 career points and 395 career rebounds, putting him 105 rebounds away from becoming the 34th member of the 500 point/rebound club.

Courtney Sims had a career-best 15 rebounds against Purdue (Feb. 7, 2004) as a freshman. It marked the first time a Wolverine has recorded over 15 rebounds since the 1996 season when Maceo Baston (1995-98) had 15 against Texas in the NCAA Tournament. Sims currently has six career games with 10 or more rebounds.

Courtney Sims has led U-M in blocked shots in each of his first two seasons. As a sophomore, he had 52 blocks, and as a freshman, he led the Big Ten with 68. He has 136 career blocks, which puts him in a tie for fifth all-time with Josh Asselin (136, 1997-2001). He needs two blocks to move into fourth all-time which is held by Maceo Baston (138, 1995-98). Sims also needs 14 blocks to become the fourth member of the U-M 150 block club.

Courtney Sims has recorded at least one block in 64 of 75 career games including 43 multi-block performances. Sims set a career-high with six blocks against Oakland (Nov. 21, 2003), which was his first collegiate game.

## **SOPHOMORE WING RON COLEMAN**

Ron Coleman has been reunited with his high school teammate Jerret Smith. Both starred at nearby Romulus High School, playing together during the 2003-04 season. Together they went 17-5 overall advancing to the second round of the Class A State Championship playoffs.

In the summer of 2005, Ron Coleman traveled with the Big Ten Foreign Touring Team throughout Spain. He averaged 13.0 points and 3.4 rebounds through the five-game tour, which was coached by Illinois' Bruce Weber.

Ron Coleman has not missed a game in his career, playing in 41 straight games. After injuries decimated the lineup last season, he started 24 of 31 contests and played 27.8 minutes per game in his rookie campaign. So far this year, he has played in all 10 games, with one start. He is averaging 13.1 minutes a game.

Ron Coleman earned his first start of the season against Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22). He responded as he scored a season-high 10-points against the RedHawks after going 3-for-4 from the field with a triple and a 3-for-4 performance from the free throw line.

With two rebounds against Miami (Ohio) (Dec. 22) and Ron Coleman has exactly 100 boards in his career. He has a career-best of seven rebounds at UCLA (Dec. 18, 2004) and against South Florida (Dec. 11, 2004).

With additional depth on the Wolverine 2005-06 roster, Ron Coleman will be seen playing both inside the post and on the perimeter. The jack-of-all-trades

Coleman is averaging 13.1 minutes per game coming off the bench and is averaging 3.9 points and 2.2 rebounds.

Ron Coleman scored a career-best 18 points against Fairfield (Jan. 8, 2005). Coleman topped his previous best of 17 points, which he recorded against UNC Asheville (Dec. 31, 2004). He has scored in double figures in 12 career games.

## **SOPHOMORE ALEX BRZOWICZ**

Alex Brzowicz has played in two career games and has recorded one career assist. That assist was a bounce pass to Amadou Ba, who scored his first career points.

## **FRESHMAN CENTER PHIL DEVRIES**

Newcomer Phil DeVries is the fourth member of the Wolverines freshman class. The 6-10 shot blocker from Shelby Township has been a welcome addition to the team and will continue to work with the U-M practice squads. He chose to walk-on to Michigan rather than attending Central Michigan.

## **FRESHMAN FORWARD KENDRIC PRICE**

Newcomer Kendric Price has been reunited with fellow Boston, Mass., native Courtney Sims. Both played against each other in the Independent School League during the 2003 season, as Price played a Buckingham Browne & Nichols School, while Sims played at Noble & Greenough School.

## **FRESHMAN WING JEVOHN SHEPHERD**

Even though it is very early in his career, Jevohn Shepherd showed his all-around game at Boston University (Nov. 22). He had five points, five rebounds, an assist, a steal and a block in 20 minutes of action. In addition to his production, he played the focal point of the U-M defensive pressure, along with Daniel Horton, in stopping the Terrier guards in the closing five minutes of the Wolverines 51-46 road win.

Jevohn Shepherd continues to find himself in the Michigan rotation as he has played in nine games. He is averaging 1.7 points and 1.0 rebounds in 8.6 minutes per game in his first season. He has a career-best five points two times – at Boston University (Nov. 22) and at South Florida (Dec. 10) and a career-best five rebounds at Boston U.

Because of his leaping ability, fans have already dubbed Jevohn Shepherd as "Air Canada" after he came to Michigan from Toronto, Ontario, Canada. His dunking prowess has already been on display during the team warm-ups. He joins Brent "Air Georgia" Petway in the airplane nickname department.

Jevohn Shepherd saw his first collegiate action against Central Michigan (Nov. 18). He finished the game with three points and a rebound in nine minutes of action.

## **FRESHMAN GUARD JERRET SMITH**

Newcomer Jerret Smith has reunited with his high school teammate Ron Coleman. Both starred at nearby Romulus High School, playing together during the 2003-04 season. Together, they went 17-5 overall advancing to the second round of the Class A State Championship playoffs.

Jerret Smith has come off the bench in the first nine games to help run the Wolverine offense. He is averaging 2.3 points, 0.9 rebounds 2.6 assists in 14.6 minutes per game. He had a career-best eight points and nine assists against Central Michigan (Nov. 18) in his first collegiate game.

Jerret Smith has remained perfect from the free throw line. He is a perfect 8-for-8 through nine games.

Jerret Smith has 23 assists for a 2.6 per game average. So far this season he has recorded at least one assist 8-of-9 games and had a career-best nine assists in his very first collegiate game against Central Michigan (Nov. 18).

In his first collegiate game, Jerret Smith came out and recorded nine assists, the most by a freshman since Daniel Horton had nine against IUPUI (Jan. 4, 2004), which was his 13th career game. Smith also finished the game against the Chippewas with eight points and a steal in his first game.

**TOMMY AMAKER'S MICHIGAN SEASON CAPSULES**

**2004-05: 13-18 overall; 4-12 Big Ten**

In his fourth season, Amaker's Wolverines continued to show progress despite having a host of injuries causing nine different Wolverines to lose 86 total games during the season. Using 16 different starting lineups, U-M won 12 of its first 17 games and advanced to the Final Four of the Preseason NIT before injuries riddled the second half of the season. Dion Harris, who earned All-Big Ten honorable mention honors, blossomed in his second year playing all three perimeter positions, while leading the team in scoring, assists, steals and minutes. In addition, John Andrews, J.C. Mathis and Dani Wohl all earned Academic All-Big Ten honors for their work away from the hardwood.

**2003-04: 23-11 overall; 8-8 Big Ten; 2004 NIT Champions**

In his third season, Amaker led the Wolverines to a 23-11 record and the 2004 National Invitation Tournament title. The 20-plus win season was the first for the Wolverines since the 1997-98 season. The Wolverines defeated Rutgers 62-55 in the NIT championship game. The Maize and Blue finished 8-8 in the Big Ten regular season, getting the No. 5 seed in the Big Ten Tournament, earning just the third first-round bye in history. Several Wolverines earned postseason accolades including Daniel Horton's NIT MVP and All-Tournament selection. Bernard Robinson Jr., who was selected in the second round of the NBA Draft by the Charlotte Bobcats, and Lester Abram were named to the All-Big Ten third team, while Dion Harris and Courtney Sims, who was the first freshman to lead the Big Ten in blocked shots in eight years, were selected to the All-Freshman team. Harris also was named to the NIT All-Tournament team. Colin Dill, J.C. Mathis and Dani Wohl were all recognized on the All-Big Ten Academic Team.

**2002-03: 18-12 overall; 10-6 Big Ten**

In his second season, Amaker led the Wolverines to a 17-13 record, then its best finish in five years. With a 10-6 conference mark, U-M tied for third, garnering the No. 3 seed in the Big Ten Tournament, the program's highest-ever tournament seeding and earning the second, first-round bye ever. After starting 0-6, Amaker and his Wolverines turned the season around with a 13-game winning streak that tied for the fifth-best streak in Michigan history. Michigan also snapped an eight-game losing streak to Michigan State with a 60-58 victory over its in-state rival at Crisler Arena. He guided the Wolverines to numerous individual accolades in 2002-03. LaVell Blanchard earned All-Big Ten first team honors while Daniel Horton and Bernard Robinson Jr. were named to the second and third teams, respectively. In addition, Horton was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year and to the inaugural All-Freshman team, while Colin Dill was named as an Academic All-Big Ten performer.

**2001-02: 11-18 overall; 5-11 Big Ten**

In his first season, Amaker led the Wolverines to an 11-18 overall record and a 5-11 mark in Big Ten play. The Maize and Blue were the No. 10 seed in the 2002 Big Ten Tournament and defeated No. 7 Northwestern, 72-51, in the first round before bowing out to No. 2 and eventual tournament champion Ohio State, 75-68, in the second round. The Wolverines set the single-season school record for free throw percentage with 75.4 percent, with four Wolverines averaging above 80 percent from the free throw line. The Wolverines also shot a school-record 32 three-point field goal attempts at Purdue (Feb. 13) at Mackey Arena, which bettered the previous record of 30 that was tied at Colorado State (Feb. 11). LaVell Blanchard was named to the All-Big Ten third team, while Ron Garber and Mike Gottfredson were each honored to the Academic All-Big Ten.
