Series History: Michigan and San Diego State will meet on the gridiron for the first time on Saturday (Sept. 18). The Wolverines have a 3-1 record against schools that currently make up the Mountain West Conference. Michigan defeated Utah, 10-7, on Sept. 21, 2002, in the only game the school has played against a school in the MWC, while it was a member of the conference. U-M defeated Air Force (24-7 in 1964) and Colorado State (24-14 in the 1994 Holiday Bowl) but lost to Brigham Young (24-17 in the 1984 Holiday Bowl) prior to their inclusion in the MWC.

Last Meeting: *This will be the first meeting between the two schools.*

Did You Know?

Lloyd Carr will roam the Michigan Stadium sidelines for his 60th game as head coach when the Wolverines host San Diego State on Saturday (Sept. 18). Carr is looking for his 54th victory in 60 contests, and could improve his school-record winning percentage at the Big House to 90 percent. Carr has a 53-6 mark (.898).

Lloyd Carr has a 1-1 record in 2004. Carr is in his 10th year as Michigan's head coach and his 25th overall season with the Wolverine program. The fifth-winningest active Division I-A coach with a .763 winning percentage, Carr has a 87-27 career record and an impressive 56-16 Big Ten Conference mark. He has a 57-18 record over the last six seasons (1998-2003) and has led the Wolverines to seven consecutive Jan. 1 bowl games. Carr was named the 1997 national coach of the year after guiding the program to a perfect 12-0 record and the *Associated Press* national championship. Carr led the Wolverines to back-to-back Big Ten Conference titles (1997-98) a share of the 2000 championship and the outright 2003 title. His teams have finished in the top 20 nationally each of his first nine years. Carr, previously a Michigan assistant coach for 15 years, began his college coaching career as a defensive backs coach at Eastern Michigan (1976-77) before joining Gary Moeller's staff at Illinois in the same role (1978-79). Carr came to Michigan in 1980 as Bo Schembechler's secondary coach. Carr served as defensive coordinator (1987-94) and was assistant head coach (1990-94).

Game Notes

U-M Drops to 17th in Both Polls

The University of Michigan football team dropped out of the top 10 in both national polls following its 28-20 loss at Notre Dame. The Wolverines are ranked No. 17 in both the ESPN/USA Today Coaches and Associated Press media polls released Sept. 12. The last time Michigan was not listed in the top 10 of the polls was Oct. 26, 2003, prior to its game at Michigan State. The Wolverines had been ranked in the top 10 the previous nine polls.

Michigan Following a Loss

The Wolverines have suffered back-to-back losses just four times during **Lloyd Carr's** coaching career. UM has compiled a 19-4 record following a setback under Carr, and has won nine of 10 games following a loss dating back to the start of the 2000 season. U-M was 2-0 last season.

First Time Meetings

San Diego State becomes the 134th different opponent to face the Wolverines in 125 years of gridiron action. The Michigan football team has compiled a 108-21-4 all-time record in first-time matchups with a school. Head coach Lloyd Carr has compiled a 5-1 record in inaugural meetings with schools, beating Memphis (1995), Arkansas (1999 Citrus), Rice (1999), Bowling Green (2000) and Utah (2002), while losing to Tennessee (2002 Citrus). A first-time matchup has taken place in bowl games on 12 occasions, with the Wolverines holding a 7-5 record.

Wolverines vs. Mountain West Conference

The Wolverines hold a 3-1 record against the teams currently in the Mountain West Conference. They defeated Air Force 24-7 in 1964, Colorado State 24-14 in the 1994 Holiday Bowl and Utah 10-7 in 2002. They lost to eventual national champion Brigham Young 24-17 in the 1984 Holiday Bowl. The meeting with the Utes is the only game Michigan has played against a school in the Mountain West, while it was a member of the conference. In addition to this first game ever with San Diego State, the Wolverines have never faced MWC members New Mexico, UNLV and Wyoming.

San Diego State Connection

Spencer Brinton has the unique distinction of taking snaps under center for both San Diego State and Michigan during his career. Brinton began his collegiate playing career with the Aztecs, starting five of the team's final six contests as a true freshman. He completed 73-of-162 passes for 1,097 yards and threw six touchdowns over those six games in 1997. Brinton started the first two games in 1998 before receiving an NCAA medical redshirt because of a season-ending thumb injury suffered against Southern California. After a two-year Mormon Mission, Brinton transferred to the University of Michigan. He has played in 11 career games with the Wolverines, completing 11-of-21 passes for 121 yards.

U-M Looks to Extend Home Winning Streak

The Wolverines host the Aztecs looking to claim their 11th consecutive win at Michigan Stadium. U-M opened the season with a 43-10 victory against Miami (Ohio) at the Big House, posted a perfect 7-0 record during last season's Big Ten title run and closed out the 2002 season with victories against Michigan State and Wisconsin. The last Michigan home loss came on Oct. 26, 2002, a 34-9 setback to eventual Big Ten Champion Iowa on homecoming.

Edwards Eyes Career Reception Mark

Senior wide receiver **Braylon Edwards** (*Detroit, Mich./Bishop Gallagher HS*) is four receptions shy of breaking Marquise Walker's school record for career receptions (176, 1998-2001) heading into the San Diego State game. Edwards has 173 career receptions for 2,431 yards and 26 touchdowns. He has made at least one reception in 28 straight games, the third longest stretch with a reception in school history. A Biletnikoff Award candidate, Edwards has led the Wolverines in receptions each of the past seven games and in receiving yardage for six consecutive contests entering the San Diego State game.

Edwards Among National Leaders

Braylon Edwards continues to be among the most productive wide receivers in the nation. He leads the Wolverines with 18 catches for 220 yards and two touchdowns in two games. Edwards hauled in 12 passes for 129 yards against Notre Dame, his 11th career 100-yard receiving game and fourth contest with double-digit receptions. He lists tied for fourth in receptions (9.0 avg.), 18th in receiving yards (110.0 avg.) and is 16th in total receiving yardage.

Edwards Nears 30th Touchdown

Braylon Edwards enters the San Diego State game four touchdowns shy of 30 in his career. Edwards will look to become the 15th player in the history of Michigan football to collect 30 or more touchdowns in a career. He had his streak of five straight regular season games with at least one touchdown grab snapped against the Irish. Edwards listed third all-time on Michigan's career touchdown receptions list with 26 scores. Edwards needs six receiving TDs to tie 1991 Heisman Trophy winner Desmond Howard (1989-91) for second place on the school's career list, and 11 touchdown grabs to equal the 37 scores gained by Anthony Carter (1979-82).

Junior receiver and return man extraordinaire **Steve Breaston** (*North Braddock, Pa./Woodland Hills HS*) finds himself ranked 19th nationally in both punt return and kickoff return average. His 11.75-yard punt return average is slightly behind his breakout 2003 average of 13.8 yards per return when Breaston set school records in both punt returns (45) and yards (619) in a season. He has added kickoff return duties this season, and has responded with an impressive 25.67-yard average per return. Breaston returned three kickoffs for 77 yards at Notre Dame and had one punt return for seven yards. He was second on the team with five receptions for 42 yards against the Irish, including a 25-yard touchdown reception and subsequent catch-and-run for the two-point conversion. Breaston has nine receptions for 75 yards in two games.

Henne Completing 60 Percent of His Passes

Freshman quarterback **Chad Henne** (*Wyomissing, Pa./Wilson HS*) enters the San Diego State game after making starts at home and on the road. He completed 25-of-40 passes for 240 yards and one touchdown in a losing effort at Notre Dame. Henne was named the ABC Player of the Game after completing 14-of-24 attempts for 142 yards and two scores in the opener vs. Miami (Ohio). He joined Rick Leach (at Wisconsin in 1975) as the only true freshman signal callers in school history to start the opener. Henne lists 18th nationally in completions (19.5 per game) and 75th in total offense (180.0 avg.). He has completed 39-of-64 passes (60.9 pct.) for 382 yards and three touchdowns on the season.

Rivas Second Nationally in Field Goals

Sophomore placekicker **Garrett Rivas** (*Tampa, Fla./Jesuit HS*) enters the San Diego State game tied for second nationally in field goals with an average of 2.5 per game. Rivas has connected on all five field goal attempts this season, including four successful tries at Notre Dame. He hit field goals from 38, 33 and 22 yards in the first half against the Irish, and matched his career-best with a 47-yarder in the third quarter. Rivas needs four points for 100 in his career. He is 14-of-17 on field goals and 54-for-57 on PATs during his career.

Nation's Leader in Interceptions, Turnovers Forced

Michigan leads the nation in interceptions (eight) and turnovers forced (11) after two games, with Big Ten foe Indiana listing second in the national rankings with nine forced turnovers. The eight picks by the Wolverines are more than halfway to last season's total of 14 interceptions.

U-M Second in Turnover Margin

The Wolverines are tied for second place nationally in turnover margin with a 3.5 average per game. Michigan is tied with Texas in the second spot, trailing national leader Southern Mississippi with a 4.0 average. U-M has 11 takeaways to four turnovers in two games.

Finley Named to Guy Award List

The Greater Augusta Sports Council announced that fifth-year senior punter **Adam Finley** (*Greenwood, Ind./Center Grove HS*) is one of 36 players to be on the watch for the 2004 Ray Guy Award. Finley is 15th nationally in punting with a 44.46-yard average. He has punted 13 times for 578 yards with a 56-yard long and one pooch punt inside the opposition's 20-yard line. Finley has punted 138 times for 5,780 yards (41.9 avg.) during his career, with 19 boots of 50 yards or more and 36 punts knocked inside the opposition's 20-yard line.

Curry Collecting Picks, Setting Up Others

Senior cornerback **Markus Curry** (*Detroit, Mich./Bishop Gallagher HS*) has played an integral part of five Michigan interceptions this season. Curry is tied for third nationally with three interceptions and deflected two opposition passes that were intercepted this season. He returned a pair of interceptions for 46 yards against Miami (Ohio), and followed with an interception and five-yard return at Notre Dame. He has seven career interceptions and 23 pass breakups. Curry has contributed eight tackles and a team-leading four pass breakups in two games.

Jackson Making Presence Felt

Senior co-captain and starting cornerback **Marlin Jackson** (*Sharon, Pa./Sharon HS*) has made his presence felt despite the fact that teams are shying away from his side of the field in passing situations. A Thorpe Award candidate, Jackson made three stops in each of the first two games. He leads all defensive players in career tackles (154), interceptions (eight) and pass breakups (29).

Corners Among Top 10 in Career Pass Breakups

The starting cornerback pairing of **Markus Curry** and **Marlin Jackson** list among Michigan's top 10 in career pass breakups. Jackson lists third all-time with 29 PBUs and Curry is tied with Thom Darden (1969-71) for eighth place with 23 pass breakups. Jackson is one PBU from tying 1997 Heisman Trophy winner Charles Woodson (1995-97) for second place. Curry needs four breakups to break into the top five all-time.

Watson Filing Middle Gap

Junior defensive tackle **Gabe Watson** (*Novi, Mich./Southfield HS*) enters the San Diego State after having the top statistical game of his career. Watson tied for the team lead with eight tackles at Notre Dame, including a key stop on fourth-and-goal at the U-M one-yard line to thwart an Irish scoring chance. He also contributed one tackle for loss and forced one fumble. His eight stops were the most by a defensive lineman since LaMarr Woodley recorded nine stops from his defensive spot in U-M's 38-35 win at Minnesota last season. Watson leads the defensive line with nine tackles this season.

Shazor Paces Squad in Stops

Senior safety **Ernest Shazor** (*Detroit, Mich./M.L. King HS*) leads the team in tackles after two games, tallying 12 stops. He tied Gabe Watson for team-high honors with eight stops at Notre Dame, including one tackle for loss. The eight tackles against the Irish matched his career high set previously on three occasions (road contests at Oregon, Iowa and Minnesota last season). Shazor needs six stops against the Aztecs to reach the 100-tackle mark in his career. He has 94 stops in 25 career games, including 10 TFLs, three sacks, three interceptions and 10 PBUs.

Mundy Making Plays

Sophomore free safety **Ryan Mundy** (*Wilkins Township, Pa./Woodland Hills HS*) has picked off a pass in each of the first two games this season and lists tied for seventh nationally in interceptions. He had career-high four-tackle efforts against Miami (Ohio) and Notre Dame to go along with his picks. Mundy started both games at safety this season after playing primarily on special teams as a true freshman in 2003. He tallied 10 tackles last season, eight of which came on special teams units.

Reid Wreaking Havoc in Backfield

Senior inside linebacker **Lawrence Reid** (*Pickerington, Ohio/Pickerington HS*) leads the Wolverines with four tackles for loss entering the San Diego State game. A Butkus Award candidate, Reid is second on the team with 11 tackles. He made five stops and one TFL at Notre Dame. Reid's first career interception led to the team's fourth field goal against the Irish. He has four or more stops in each of the past 12 games. Reid has contributed 106 career stops in 20 games, 15 of those starts at inside linebacker.

Massey Matches Career High

Senior defensive end **Pat Massey** (*Brecksville, Ohio/St. Ignatius HS*) heads into the San Diego State game second on the defensive line in tackles this season. Massey matched his career high, previously set against Indiana last season, with five stops at Notre Dame. He contributed three tackles in the season opener vs. Miami (Ohio). Massey is tied for fourth on the team with eight tackles this season, raising his career totals to 36 stops, 11 tackles for loss, four sacks and three pass breakups.

Captains Seek 30th Starts

Co-captains **David Baas** and **Marlin Jackson** will look to make their 30th career starts when Michigan takes the field against San Diego State on Saturday (Sept. 18). Baas has started 28 straight games at left guard for the Wolverines, while Jackson has made 22 overall starts at cornerback. The duo rank 1-2 in terms of games played, with Jackson first with 34 contests and Baas tying Braylon Edwards for second with 33 games of action.

Strong Septembers Under Carr

Starting the season off strongly has been a trademark of U-M while under **Lloyd Carr**, posting a 30-7 record during the month of September. Carr won the first 10 September games of his career, and his teams have outscored the opposition by a 1,137-587 differential during the ninth month of the year. Carr is 24-1 at Michigan Stadium, 7-6 on the road and 9-6 against top 25 teams in September. Michigan has a 128-32-3 all-time record during the month of September.

Carr vs. Non-Conference Teams

Lloyd Carr enters the San Diego State game with an impressive 28-7 record against regular-season non-conference opponents. Carr has claimed victories in 18 of his last 23 contests against non-conference foes, and is 1-1 this season. He won his first 10 career non-conference games before suffering back-to-back 1998 setbacks against Notre Dame (20-36) and Syracuse (28-38).

Carr on U-M Sideline for 25th Season

Lloyd Carr reaches a milestone this year as he ties Fielding Yost for second all-time in terms of years spent coaching on Michigan's sideline. Only Bennie Oosterbaan with 31 years (11 as the head coach) has more service time. Carr over his first nine years as head coach has compiled an 87-27 record, including an impressive 56-16 in Big Ten games. He is also currently the winningest coach at Michigan Stadium by winning percentage. Carr has gone 53-6 at the Big House for an incredible winning percentage of .898. Carr has led the Wolverines to four Big Ten championships and the 1997 national championship in his nine seasons at the helm. His 15 years as an assistant were spent first as secondary coach, then defensive coordinator and then he added assistant head coach into his title for his final five years as an assistant.

Michigan Tops Big Ten Preseason Poll

Defending Big Ten football champion Michigan was voted the pre-season conference favorite in a poll of media members attending the Big Ten Media Day in Chicago, the league announced Aug. 4. Ohio State and Iowa, both U-M opponents in 2004, were second and third in the preseason poll. The Wolverines return 47 lettermen from last season, including 17 starters (seven offense, six defense, four specialists). The last time Michigan received the conference's preseason nod to win the championship was 2000, a year in which the Wolverines solidified the media's selection with a 38-26 victory against Ohio State in Columbus to claim the title.

Michigan Looks for Second Straight Big Ten Title

Last year Michigan won the Big Ten title with a 7-1 conference record. It was the Wolverines' first conference championship since 2000. Michigan has a long history of winning back-to-back titles. In fact, they have created streaks of conference championships nine times. That includes three streaks of two titles in a row, one streak of three titles in a row, four streaks of four titles in a row, and from 1988-1992 Michigan won an incredible five Big Ten conference championships in a row.

125th Season of Michigan Football Action

The football program is in its 125th season of college football action this fall. The Wolverine program was established in 1879 when a group of 13 men fielded the first football team in school history and played a pair of off-campus games. U-M defeated Racine, 1-0, at White Stocking Park in Chicago, Ill., on May 30, 1879, for the first victory in school history. The Wolverines tied Toronto, 0-0, in Detroit to finish the year 1-0-1. U-M is in its 122nd year of uninterrupted gridiron action, with 1882 being the only season that the program did not play any varsity games. The Wolverines are the sixth oldest football program in NCAA history (see chart below), but U-M has won more game than any team in college football history (834).

- Michigan has 334 television appearances, the most of any college football program in NCAA history.
- U-M has compiled a 222-104-8 record when appearing on television.
- Michigan has appeared in 109 consecutive televised games.
- Michigan's 41 Big Ten Conference titles are the most of any college football program in any conference.
- U-M is fifth all-time with 11 national titles.
- U-M has had 254 players named All-Big Ten Conference first team a total of 361 times, the most of any conference school.
