**Radio Coverage:** The Michigan Sports Network is comprised of 27 stations. Frank Beckmann (play-by-play), Jim Brandstatter (analyst) and Steve Courtney (sideline reports) will originate the game on NewsTalk 760 WJR-AM in Detroit.

**TV Coverage:** ABC Sports will broadcast the game to a regional audience. Brent Musburger (play-by-play), Gary Danielson (color commentary) and Jack Arute (sideline reports and analysis) will call the game.

**Series History:** This will be the 52nd meeting between Michigan and Iowa. The Wolverines hold a 37-10-4 lead in the all-time series, and have a 20-4-3 mark at Michigan Stadium (21-5-3 all-time in Ann Arbor). Michigan has won seven of the last 10 games in the series. U-M head coach Lloyd Carr has a 3-2 record against Iowa.

**Last Meeting:** (#23 Iowa 30, #9 Michigan 27, Kinnick Stadium, Oct. 4, 2003) The Wolverines scored on four consecutive first-half possessions to take a 20-10 lead, but the Hawkeyes defense kept Michigan without any points for nine straight series. As it had done two weeks earlier, U-M came up just short in its attempt to pull out a victory in the game's final minutes. With the score 30-20 in favor of Iowa, fifth-year senior quarterback John Navarre completed a 41-yard slant pass to junior receiver Braylon Edwards for a touchdown. After a defensive stop, the Wolverines were able to get to the 49-yard line with 1:07 left, but U-M fell short on a fourth-and-12 play. Navarre was 26 of 49 passing for a school-record 389 yards and two touchdowns. Edwards caught seven passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns, and sophomore Jason Avant grabbed seven receptions for 175 yards. Senior Chris Perry contributed 87 yards and a touchdown on 24 carries. Freshman Garrett Rivas kicked field goals of 47 and 26 yards.

**Did You Know?**

Michigan will look to win its 23rd consecutive Big Ten Conference opener Saturday (Sept. 25) against Iowa. Michigan has won 22 straight conference openers dating back to Sept. 11, 1982, a 20-9 victory over Wisconsin at Michigan Stadium, and has claimed victories in 35 of its last 36 Big Ten openers. The only setback during the string was a 21-14 loss to Wisconsin in Madison on Sept. 12, 1981.

Lloyd Carr has a 2-1 record in 2004. Carr is in his 10th year as Michigan's head coach and his 25th overall season with the Wolverine program. The fifth-winningest active Division I-A coach with a .765 winning percentage, Carr has a 88-27 career record and an impressive 56-16 Big Ten Conference mark. He has a 57-18 record over the last six seasons (1998-2003) and has led the Wolverines to seven consecutive Jan. 1 bowl games. Carr was named the 1997 national coach of the year after guiding the program to a perfect 12-0 record and the *Associated Press* national championship. Carr led the Wolverines to back-to-back Big Ten Conference titles (1997-98) a share of the 2000 championship and the outright 2003 title. His teams have finished in the top 20 nationally each of his first nine years. Carr, previously a Michigan assistant coach for 15 years, began his college coaching career as a defensive backs coach at Eastern Michigan (1976-77) before joining Gary Moeller's staff at Illinois in the same role (1978-79). Carr came to Michigan in 1980 as Bo Schembechler's secondary coach. Carr served as defensive coordinator (1987-94) and was assistant head coach (1990-94).

# Game Notes

## U-M Drops One Slot to 18th in Both Polls

The University of Michigan football team dropped one slot in both national polls following its 24-21 victory against San Diego State. The Wolverines are ranked No. 18 in both the ESPN/USA Today Coaches and Associated Press media polls released Sept. 19. This is the lowest Michigan has been ranked in the AP poll since Oct. 5, 2003, when the media voted Michigan 20th for its game with Minnesota following the 30-27 loss at Iowa.

## Big Ten Opener Streak on the Line

The Wolverines face the Hawkeyes looking to win their 23rd consecutive Big Ten opener. Michigan has won 22 straight conference openers dating back to Sept. 11, 1982 (20-9 victory over Wisconsin at Michigan Stadium) and has claimed victories in 35 of its last 36 Big Ten openers. The only setback during the string was a 21-14 loss to Wisconsin in Madison on Sept. 12, 1981.

## Wolverines and Hawkeyes

Michigan holds a 37-10-4 edge in the all-time series but the Wolverines look to end a two-game losing streak to the Hawkeyes. U-M lost 30-27 last season at Kinnick Stadium and suffered a 34-9 home setback to Iowa during the 2002 season. The Wolverines had claimed seven straight victories against the Hawkeyes prior to current two-game skid. U-M last defeated Iowa in 2001, a 32-26 victory against the Hawkeyes at Kinnick Stadium. Michigan holds a 14-5-4 edge over Iowa in games decided by seven or less points and is 6-4-4 in games decided by three or fewer points.

## Michigan vs. Iowa at Michigan Stadium

The Wolverines look to continue their recent strong play against the Hawkeyes at Michigan Stadium on Saturday (Sept. 25). Michigan holds an impressive 20-4-3 advantage in games played at the 'Big House' and is 21-5-3 all-time against Iowa in Ann Arbor. U-M had won three straight in Ann Arbor before 2002's 34-9 setback and has an 8-3 record in the last 11 games played at Michigan Stadium.

## Carr vs. Big Ten Conference

**Lloyd Carr** will coach his 73rd Big Ten game when U-M faces Iowa on Saturday (Sept. 25). Carr heads into the Iowa game with an impressive 56-16 career Big Ten record and is the conference's active leader in career wins in Big Ten play. He has led the Wolverines to four conference titles (1997, 1998, 2000, and 2003). Carr has compiled a 31-5 record against Big Ten foes at Michigan Stadium and has won 21 of his last 24 at the "Big House" (last loss was a 34-9 setback vs. Iowa in 2002). He has compiled a 25-11 conference mark on the road.

### Conference Openers vs. Iowa

Iowa is currently the sixth most common opponent for U-M in conference openers. This will be the 11th meeting between the Wolverines and Hawkeyes in a conference opener. Michigan has compiled a perfect 10-0 record in Big Ten openers against Iowa. The two programs last met in a conference opener during Michigan's 1994 season, in which Michigan rebounded from its famous "Hail Mary" defeat at the hands of Colorado to beat the Hawkeyes, 29-14. ### Wolverine from Iowa

True freshman wide receiver **Adrian Arrington** (*Cedar Rapids, Iowa/Washington HS*) is the lone Wolverine to hail from the state of Iowa. Arrington played wide receiver in the first two games of the season.

### U-M Looks to Extend Home Winning Streak

The Wolverines host the Hawkeyes looking to claim their 12th consecutive win at Michigan Stadium. U-M opened the season with non-conference wins against Miami (Ohio) and San Diego State at the Big House, posted a perfect 7-0 record during last season's Big Ten title run and closed out the 2002 season with victories against Michigan State and Wisconsin. The last Michigan home loss came on Oct. 26, 2002, a 34-9 setback to eventual Big Ten co-champion Iowa on homecoming.

### Hart Provides Pulse

True freshman tailback **Michael Hart** (*Syracuse, N.Y./Onondaga Central HS*) enters the Big Ten season having provided the Wolverines ground game with some much needed support. Hart had Michigan's first 100-yard rushing effort of the season, rushing 25 times for 121 yards against San Diego State (Sept. 18). He is the first U-M true freshman 100-yard rusher since Chris Perry carried 10 times for 103 yards and scored one touchdown vs. Bowling Green on Sept. 2, 2000. Hart leads the Wolverines in rushing with 158 yards on 33 carries (4.8 avg.). He also has two receptions for seven yards.

### Henne Eyes First Big Ten Start

Freshman quarterback **Chad Henne** (*Wyomissing, Pa./Wilson HS*) looks to make his first Big Ten start when the Wolverines host Iowa on Saturday (Sept. 25). Henne completed 50-of-88 passes (56.8 pct.) for 544 yards during the non-conference season, with five touchdown passes and five interceptions. He was 11 of 24 for 162 and two TDs to **Braylon Edwards** vs. San Diego State after setting career highs in the 28-20 loss to Notre Dame. Henne completed 25 of 40 passes for 240 yards and a 25-yard touchdown pass to junior wide receiver **Steve Breaston** (*North Braddock, Pa./Woodland Hills HS*) against the Irish.

### Breaston Second in Receiving

**Steve Breaston** enters the Iowa game second on the team in every receiving category this season. Breaston has 12 receptions for 94 yards and one touchdown this season. He has 50 catches for 538 yards in 16 career games including four receiving TDs. Breaston has at least one pass reception in 13 straight games.

### Breaston Climbing Career Punt Return List

With three punt returns for 35 yards against San Diego State, **Steve Breaston** has etched his name in the top five on Michigan's career punt return lists. He has 52 career punt returns for 701 yards and two touchdowns. Breaston is fifth in career punt returns and ranks fourth in yardage. He scored two touchdowns on returns last season and has 10 career 20-yard-plus returns. He needs three punt returns to capture a share of third place on the career attempts list and 51 return yards to pass Gene Derricotte (1944-48) for third place on the career yardage list. Anthony Carter (1979-82) holds Michigan's career punt return records with 81 attempts for 904 yards.

### Edwards Among National Leaders

Senior wide receiver **Braylon Edwards** (*Detroit, Mich./Bishop Gallagher HS*) enters the conference season among the top seven in each of the three national receiving categories. Edwards is fourth in receptions (8.67 avg.), sixth in total receiving yards (350) and ranks seventh in receiving yards per game (116.67 avg.). He lists tops in the Big Ten in both receptions and receiving yards, and is tied for fourth in touchdowns scored (8.0 avg.). Edwards has hauled in 26 receptions for 350 yards (13.5 avg.) and four touchdowns.

### Edwards Sets Reception Mark; Eyes Second Place in Yardage

**Braylon Edwards** enters the conference season after setting the Michigan career reception record in the San Diego State game. He is also within striking distance of second place on the school's receiving yardage list. Edwards has a school-record 181 receptions for 2,561 yards and 28 touchdowns during his career, including 12 career 100-yard receiving games. He had his second straight 100-yard receiving game in 2004, catching eight passes for a season-high 130 yards and two touchdowns against the Aztecs. The previous week he snared 12 passes for 129 yards in the loss at Notre Dame. A Biletnikoff Award candidate, Edwards has made at least one reception in 29 straight games, the third longest stretch with a reception in school history. He has led the Wolverines in receptions each of the past eight games and in receiving yards for seven consecutive contests entering the Iowa game.

### Edwards Seeks 30th Touchdown

**Braylon Edwards** begins the Big Ten season two touchdowns shy of 30 in his career. Edwards will look to become the 15th player in the history of Michigan football to collect 30 or more touchdowns in a career. He has caught two touchdown passes in each of the past four home games dating back to last season (Purdue, Ohio State, Miami and San Diego State). Edwards is third all-time on Michigan's career touchdown receptions list with 28 scores. He needs four receiving TDs to tie 1991 Heisman Trophy winner Desmond Howard (1989-91) for second place on the school's career list, and nine touchdown grabs to equal the 37 scores gained by Anthony Carter (1979-82).

### Avant Keeps Reception Streak Alive

Junior wide receiver **Jason Avant** (*Chicago, Ill./Carver HS*) opens the Big Ten season with a streak of 15 games played with at least one reception. Avant snared a 16-yard pass from **Chad Henne** against San Diego State to extend his reception streak. He is third on the team with five receptions for 57 yards (11.4 avg.) this season. A Biletnikoff Award candidate, Avant has 54 career receptions for 850 yards and two touchdowns. A two-year letterman, Avant needs 150 receiving yards to become the 21st player in Michigan history to reach the 1,000-yard barrier. He set career highs for receptions (seven) and receiving yards (175) in last season's game at Iowa.

### Jackson Making Moves

Sophomore tailback **Jerome Jackson** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) enters the conference season after making his first career start at running back. Jackson rushed eight times for 28 yards against San Diego State after topping the team with 15 carries for 32 yards at Notre Dame. He has played in 12 games at tailback for the Wolverines, rushing 59 times for 272 yards (4.6 avg.) and three touchdowns. Jackson is second to **Michael Hart** with 30 carries for 85 yards and one score this season.

### Stenavich Seek 20th Start at Left Tackle

Senior offensive lineman **Adam Stenavich** (*Marshfield, Wis./Marshfield HS*) enters the Iowa game looking to make his 20th career start at left tackle. Stenavich has started 17 straight games at left tackle dating back to the 2003 Outback Bowl victory vs. Florida. His other two starts came in back-to-back games against Illinois and Penn State in 2002. Stenavich is second only to fifth-year senior left guard **David Baas** (*Sarasota, Fla./Riverview HS*) in starts along the offensive line, and is third among offensive players in career starts behind Baas (30) and **Braylon Edwards** (26).

### Baas Eyes 30th Straight Start at Left Guard

Senior left guard and co-captain **David Baas** (*Sarasota, Fla./Riverview HS*) will look to make his 30th consecutive start at left guard when the Wolverines open Big Ten play against the Hawkeyes on Saturday (Sept. 25). Baas seeks his 31st start and will look to play in his 35th overall game when U-M faces Iowa. An Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award candidate this season, Baas is looking to become the 11th player in Michigan football history to earn All-Big Ten first team honors at least three times during his career. Baas is a three-year letterman and two-year starter at left guard. A 2004 preseason All-America selection, Baas earned second-team All-America honors from the Associated Press last year.

### Manning Making Plays

Fifth-year senior outside linebacker **Roy Manning** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) enters the Big Ten season playing the best football of his career. Manning had season highs in tackles (five), tackles for loss (two) and sacks (one) against San Diego State. He also forced a fumble against the Aztecs that senior inside linebacker **Lawrence Reid** (*Pickerington, Ohio/Pickerington HS*) scooped up and returned five yards for a Michigan

touchdown. Manning has started all three games this season, recording nine tackles, two TFLs, one sack and one forced fumble. He will look to play in his 30th career game when Iowa enters the Big House. Manning has had success against Iowa, setting a career high with six tackles and one TFL against the Hawkeyes last season. He also scored the only points of his career, recovering a blocked punt in the end zone for a touchdown at Iowa in 2001.

### McClintock Nears 100 Career Stops

Senior inside linebacker **Scott McClintock** (*Belle Vernon, Pa./Belle Vernon HS*) opens the Big Ten season 10 tackles shy of 100 for his career. McClintock has 90 career tackles, including seven tackles for loss and one sack, in 29 career games. He made a season-high seven tackles, one TFL and one pass breakup against San Diego State. McClintock is tied for fourth on the team with 14 tackles this season, including two for loss and two PBUs.

### Reid-ing and Reacting

**Lawrence Reid** roams the middle of the Wolverine defense and looks to make big plays and hits when the opportunity presents itself. Reid registered his first career interception in the Notre Dame game (Sept. 11) and followed that up with the team's second defensive touchdown of the 2004 season with a fumble recovery and five-yard run to paydirt against San Diego State (Sept. 18). He scored his first career touchdown on a first-quarter play when **Roy Manning** sacked and stripped Aztec quarterback Matt Dlugolecki. Reid added three tackles vs. SDSU but had his streak of 12 straight games with four or more stops come to end against the Aztecs. Reid has contributed 109 career tackles in 21 games (16 starts). For the season, Reid has 14 tackles, four of them for loss, has one fumble recovery and has one interception.

### Massey Sacking Opponents

Senior defensive end **Pat Massey** (*Brecksville, Ohio/St. Ignatius HS*) enters the conference season tied with junior defensive tackle **Gabe Watson** (*Novi, Mich./Southfield HS*) for the team lead among defensive line in stops this season. Massey and Watson are tied for sixth on the squad with 11 tackles. Massey is pacing the squad with two sacks, both coming against San Diego State. He tallied three tackles against the Aztecs, matched his career high with five stops at Notre Dame and tallied three stops vs. Miami (Ohio). Massey has played in 27 career games, registering 39 tackles, 13 TFLs, six sacks and three pass breakups.

### Jackson Ties Woodson

Senior co-captain and starting cornerback **Marlin Jackson** (*Sharon, Pa./Sharon HS*) begins the Big Ten season tied for second place all-time at Michigan with 30 career pass breakups. Jackson made two tackles and recorded one sack against San Diego State. He also tied 1997 Heisman Trophy winner Charles Woodson (1995-1997) for the second slot on U-M's career PBU list with a breakup against the Aztecs. A Thorpe Award candidate, Jackson has started all three games at cornerback, after playing a season at safety last year. He has eight tackles, one TFL, one sack and one forced fumble this season. For his career, Jackson leads the Wolverines with 156 stops, eight TFLs, two sacks, eight interceptions and 30 PBUs.

### Curry Among the National Interception Leaders

Senior cornerback **Markus Curry** (*Detroit, Mich./Bishop Gallagher HS*) begins the Big Ten season tied for second nationally and is tops in the conference in interceptions. Curry leads the team with three interceptions and four pass breakups this season, with his four PBUs tying for sixth-best in the conference. He tallied a team-high eight tackles vs. San Diego State. He has started all three games at cornerback and is second on the team with 16 stops. With 23 career PBUs, Curry is tied eighth place on Michigan's career pass breakup list with Thom Darden (1969-71).

### Shazor Will Tackle You

Senior strong safety **Ernest Shazor** (*Detroit, Mich./Martin Luther King HS*) leads the Wolverines into the conference season with a team-high 19 tackles on the year. Shazor has 19 stops, 13 of which are solos, and two tackles for loss. He recorded seven tackles vs. San Diego State, including one TFL, one interception and two pass breakups, to top the 100-tackle barrier for his career. Shazor has two tackles for loss, three PBUs and two interceptions to go along with the 19 tackles, including an 88-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. Miami (Ohio). A Thorpe Award candidate, he has tallied 101 tackles in 26 career games of action. Shazor looks to make his 15th start at safety when Iowa enters the Big House on Saturday.

### Mason Sets Career High

Senior cornerback **Grant Mason** (*Pontiac, Mich./Orchard Lake St. Mary's HS*) enters the Iowa game after having his best game since transferring to Michigan from Stanford. Mason registered a career-high six tackles against San Diego State, three of which came on kickoff coverage. He also tallied three stops playing in the nickel and dime packages against the Aztecs. Mason has seven tackles on the season.

### Nation's Leader in Interceptions, Turnovers Forced

Michigan leads the nation in interceptions (nine) and turnovers forced (14) after three games, with defending national champion and 2004 Rose Bowl foe Southern California listing second in the national rankings with 12 forced turnovers. Michigan's five fumble recoveries are tied for 10th nationally. The nine picks by the Wolverines are five shy of last season's total of 14 interceptions.

### U-M Tied for Eighth in Turnover Margin

The Wolverines are tied for eighth nationally in turnover margin with a 2.0 average per game. Michigan is tied with Minnesota for the Big Ten lead. U-M has 14 takeaways to eighth turnovers in three games.

### Strong Septembers Under Carr

Starting the season off strongly has been a trademark of U-M while under **Lloyd Carr**, posting a 31-7 record during the month of September. Carr won the first 10 September games of his career, and his teams have out-scored the opposition by a 1,161-608 differential during the ninth month of the year. Carr is 25-1 at Michigan Stadium, 7-6 on the road and 9-6 against top 25 teams in September. Michigan has a 129-32-3 all-time record during the month of September.

### Michigan Tops Big Ten Preseason Poll

Defending Big Ten football champion Michigan was voted the preseason conference favorite in a poll of media members attending the Big Ten Media Day in Chicago, the league announced Aug. 4. Ohio State and Iowa, both U-M opponents in 2004, were second and third in the preseason poll. The Wolverines return 47 lettermen from last season, including 17 starters (seven offense, six defense, four specialists). The last time Michigan received the conference's preseason nod to win the championship was 2000, a year in which the Wolverines solidified the media's selection with a 38-26 victory against Ohio State in Columbus to claim the title.

### Michigan Looks for Second Straight Big Ten Title

Last year Michigan won the outright Big Ten title with a 7-1 conference record. It was the Wolverines' first conference championship since 2000. Michigan has a long history of winning back-to-back titles. In fact, they have created streaks of conference championships nine times. That includes three streaks of two titles in a row, one streak of three titles in a row, four streaks of four titles in a row, and from 1988-1992 Michigan won an incredible five Big Ten conference championships in a row.

### Carr on U-M Sideline for 25th Season

**Lloyd Carr** reached a milestone this year as he tied Fielding Yost for second all-time in terms of years spent coaching on Michigan's sideline. Only Bennie Oosterbaan with 31 years (11 as the head coach) has more service time. Carr over his first nine years as head coach has compiled an 87-27 record, including an impressive 56-16 in Big Ten games. He is also currently the winningest coach at Michigan Stadium by winning percentage. Carr has gone 53-6 at the Big House for an incredible winning percentage of .898. Carr has led the Wolverines to four Big Ten championships and the 1997 national championship in his nine seasons at the helm. His 15 years as an assistant were spent first as secondary coach, then defensive coordinator and then he added assistant head coach into his title for his final five years as an assistant.

### 125th Season of Michigan Football Action

The football program is in its 125th season of college football action this fall. The Wolverine program was established in 1879 when a group of 13 men fielded the first football team in school history and played a pair of off-campus games. U-M defeated Racine, 1-0, at White Stocking Park in Chicago, Ill., on May 30, 1879, for the first victory in school history. The Wolverines tied Toronto, 0-0, in Detroit to finish the year 1-0-1. U-M is in its 122nd year of uninterrupted gridiron action, with 1882 being the only season that the program did not play any varsity games. The Wolverines are the sixth oldest football program in NCAA history (see chart below), but U-M has won more game than any team in college football history (834).

- Michigan's 41 Big Ten Conference titles are the most of any college football program in any conference.
- U-M is fifth all-time with 11 national titles.
