Series History: This will be the 93rd meeting between the Wolverines and Golden Gophers. Michigan has a 66-23-3 record in the all-time series and has won the last 15 matchups between the two programs. The Wolverines have a 34-11-1 record against the Golden Gophers in Ann Arbor, and have a 28-9-1 mark at Michigan Stadium. U-M has won 23 of the last 25 games and 32 of the last 34 contests in the "Little Brown Jug" series. Head coach Lloyd Carr has a 7-0 record against Minnesota and is 3-0 at the Big House.

Last Meeting: (#20 Michigan 38, #17 Minnesota 35, H.H.H. Metrodome, Oct. 10, 2003) The 100th anniversary of the game that began the Little Brown Jug rivalry proved to be a memorable one as Michigan mounted the greatest comeback in school history to pull out the 38-35 victory at Minnesota. Freshman Garrett Rivas' 33-yard field goal with 47 seconds remaining capped a 31-point fourth quarter for the Wolverines. Trailing 28-7 in the fourth quarter, fifth-year senior quarterback John Navarre orchestrated a 10-play, 80-yard drive that cut the deficit to 28-14. On the following Minnesota drive, sophomore safety Jacob Stewart stepped in front of a pass and returned his first career interception 34 yards for a touchdown that cut the Gophers lead to 28-21. After a Minnesota touchdown put them back up 14, three consecutive unanswered Michigan scoring drives proved to be the difference in the game. Junior receiver Braylon Edwards hauled in a 52-yard TD reception, Chris Perry ran 10 yards for a TD and Rivas kicked his first career game-winner from 33 yards away to complete an improbable come-from-behind victory. Navarre completed 33 of 47 passes for 353 yards and two touchdowns. Perry ran for 85 yards and caught a U-M running back record 11 passes for another 122 yards. Edwards grabbed seven receptions for 93 yards and one touchdown. The largest deficit Michigan previously had to overcome was 17 points vs. Virginia in the 1995 Pigskin Classic.

Did You Know?

The Battle for the Little Brown Jug between Michigan and Minnesota is the oldest trophy game in college football history, with its existence dating back to 1903. Michigan holds a 62-21-2 edge in Little Brown Jug games.

Lloyd Carr has a 4-1 record in 2004. Carr is in his 10th year as Michigan's head coach and his 25th overall season with the Wolverine program. The fifth-winningest active Division I-A coach with a .769 winning percentage, Carr has a 90-27 career record and an impressive 58-16 Big Ten Conference mark. He has a 57-18 record over the last six seasons (1998-2003) and has led the Wolverines to seven consecutive Jan. 1 bowl games. Carr was named the 1997 national coach of the year after guiding the program to a perfect 12-0 record and the *Associated Press* national championship. Carr led the Wolverines to back-to-back Big Ten Conference titles (1997-98) a share of the 2000 championship and the outright 2003 title. His teams have finished in the top 20 nationally each of his first nine years. Carr, previously a Michigan assistant coach for 15 years, began his college coaching career as a defensive backs coach at Eastern Michigan (1976-77) before joining Gary Moeller's staff at Illinois in the same role (1978-79). Carr came to Michigan in 1980 as Bo Schembechler's secondary coach. Carr served as defensive coordinator (1987-94) and was assistant head coach (1990-94).

Game Notes

U-M Climbs to 14th in Both National Polls

The University of Michigan football team climbed into the top 15 in both national polls following its 35-14 victory at Indiana. The Wolverines jumped four spots to No. 14 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches and five slots to No. 14 in the Associated Press poll. Minnesota is ranked No. 13 in both polls and will enter the Battle for the Little Brown Jug as the higher ranked team for the second consecutive year.

Michigan vs. AP Ranked Teams

The Wolverines will face a nationally ranked team for the first time this season when they battle No. 13 Minnesota on Saturday (Oct. 9). U-M has a 33-18 overall record against Associated Press nationally ranked teams under Lloyd Carr (he is 14-4 against top 10 opponents). The Wolverines have compiled a 123-104-8 (.540) all-time record against Associated Press nationally ranked teams.

Michigan vs. Minnesota

The Wolverines have won 48 of the last 59 and 32 of the last 34 meetings between the two schools. With the 38-35 victory at the Metrodome last season, the Wolverines have won the last 15 meetings between the two schools, while holding the series advantage 66-23-3 and a 62-21-3 edge in the Little Brown Jug games. Michigan's 66 wins vs. Minnesota are the most the Wolverines have over any school, with the Gophers being U-M's third most common opponent all-time with 92 previous matchups. The Wolverines have been impressive in games decided by seven or fewer points, holding a 15-9-3 record against the Gophers but only a slight 8-6-3 advantage in games decided by three or fewer points.

Nation's Oldest Trophy Game

The Wolverines will be looking to claim possession of the "Little Brown Jug" for the 16th consecutive time when they face Minnesota in the 86th battle for the oldest trophy game in college football history. The Little Brown Jug traces its roots back to 1903. The Wolverines traveled to 10-0 Minnesota with a 28-game winning streak. Michigan head coach Fielding Yost questioned whether the Gophers would provide fresh water and sent manager Tommy Roberts to purchase a jug for the team to bring its own fresh water to the game. With the Wolverines up 6-0, Minnesota rallied to tie the game with less than two minutes left. The Gopher fans, so elated at the tied score, rushed the field and forced the officials to call the game at 6-6. Michigan, in its haste to leave and catch a train back to Chicago, forgot the five-gallon jug on the sidelines. When asked to return the jug, Minnesota claimed that if Michigan wanted the jug the Wolverines would have to come up and win it, thus the first trophy game in college football was born.

Streaking Wolverines in Streaking Series

Michigan enters the Minnesota game (Oct. 9) having won 15 consecutive games over the Gophers, the best winning streak in the series. Minnesota won nine straight contests (1934-42) and was unbeaten in 10 straight including a 0-0 tie in 1933. Michigan has had winning streaks of nine (1968-76), eight (twice, 1920-26 -- winning two games in the 1926 season -- and 1978-85) and seven (1943-49) while Minnesota's second longest winning streak in the series is four games (1960-63).

Streak Breakers

The Wolverines face the Golden Gophers with a 2-0 Big Ten record and wins in 32 of the last 34 games in the series. However, the two Golden Gopher wins in that span have come against unbeaten Wolverine squads with Top 10 national rankings. In 1977, Michigan was 6-0 and ranked No. 1 in the nation by the Associated Press but was upset by Minnesota, 16-0. In the 1986 season, Michigan was 7-0 and ranked No. 2 only to fall 20-17 to the Gophers. This year Michigan is 4-1 and ranks No. 14 in both national polls.

104th Michigan Homecoming Game

This will be the 104th homecoming game (excluding four alumni exhibitions) and the 108th all-time homecoming game played by the Wolverines in Ann Arbor. Michigan has a 79-24 record in homecoming games and is 8-1 under head coach Lloyd Carr. The only loss was a 34-9 setback to Iowa during the 2002 season. Minnesota as Homecoming Opponent

Minnesota will serve as U-M's homecoming opponent for the 31st time in school history. The Golden Gophers are the Wolverines' most common homecoming opponent. Minnesota first became U-M's homecoming opponent in 1910 (6-0 win on Nov. 19) and last served as the school's homecoming opponent in 1997 (24-3 win on Nov. 1). Michigan holds a 23-7 advantage vs. Minnesota when the Gophers serve as the homecoming opponent.

Michigan at Homecoming

Michigan has won eight of its last nine homecoming games and has claimed victories in 32 of its last 36 games dating back to 1968, the year prior to Bo Schembechler's arrival at U-M. Schembechler compiled a 21-0 homecoming record during his Michigan coaching career, while Lloyd Carr has an 8-1 mark. The only homecoming loss during Carr's career came Oct. 26, 2002, a 34-9 loss to Iowa.

U-M in October

Michigan has compiled an impressive 388-112-13 (.769) all-time record in October. The Wolverines have a 25-7 mark in the 10th month of the year under head coach Lloyd Carr and have won 11 of their last 14 contests in October.

Carr vs. Big Ten Conference

Lloyd Carr will coach his 75th Big Ten game when U-M hosts Minnesota on Saturday (Oct. 9). Carr heads into the Minnesota game with an impressive 58-16 career Big Ten record and is the conference's active leader in career wins in Big Ten play. He has led the Wolverines to four conference titles (1997, 1998, 2000, and 2003). Carr has compiled a 32-5 record against Big Ten foes at Michigan Stadium and has won 22 of his last 25 at the "Big House" (last loss was a 34-9 setback vs. Iowa in 2002). He has compiled a 26-11 conference mark on the road.

U-M Looks to Extend Home Winning Streak

The Wolverines host the Gophers looking to claim their 13th consecutive win at Michigan Stadium. U-M has a 3-0 record at the Big House this season, posted a perfect 7-0 record during last season's Big Ten title run and closed out the 2002 season with victories against Michigan State and Wisconsin. The last Michigan home loss came on Oct. 26, 2002, a 34-9 setback to eventual Big Ten champion Iowa on homecoming.

Edwards Chasing History

Senior wide receiver **Braylon Edwards** (*Detroit, Mich./Bishop Gallagher HS*) heads into the Minnesota game drawing closer to his third consecutive 1,000-yard receiving season. Edwards has 40 receptions for 665 yards (16.6 avg.) and seven touchdowns. He caught eight passes for a career-best 165 yards at Indiana, including a 69-yard career long touchdown pass. He added a 39-yard TD grab against the Hoosiers to collect his third multi-touchdown game of the season and the 10th of his career. Edwards has surpassed 100 receiving yards in each of the past four games, matching his own school record for consecutive 100-yard games. A Biletnikoff Award candidate, he has more receptions and yards through the first five games of a season than any receiver in Michigan history. He needs 100 or more receiving yards against Minnesota to break a tie with Anthony Carter for most career 100-yard receiving games by a Wolverine (14).

Edwards Equals Six

Braylon Edwards has found the end zone in four of the five games this season, including twice against Miami (Ohio), San Diego State and Indiana. Edwards also added a touchdown grab against Iowa. He is second nationally among wide receivers in touchdowns with seven, trailing only Purdue's Taylor Stubblefield (10). Edwards is averaging a touchdown grab every 5.7 receptions this season, slightly ahead of his career average of a score every 6.3 catches. Edwards has scores in 11 of his last 14 contests dating back to 2003. He is third all-time on Michigan's career touchdown receptions list with 31 touchdown catches. He needs one receiving TD to tie 1991 Heisman Trophy winner Desmond Howard (1989-91) for second place on the school's career list, and six touchdown grabs to equal the 37 scores gained by Anthony Carter (1979-82), the U-M and Big Ten record holder.

Edwards Seeks 200th Reception

Braylon Edwards needs five receptions to become the sixth player in Big Ten history to gain at 200 career receptions. Edwards has 195 receptions for 2,876 yards and 31 touchdowns during his career. He needs 124 receiving yards to become the eighth receiver in conference history to reach 3,000 in his career.

Edwards Nears Receiving Yardage Mark

After setting his career high in receiving yards for the second straight week, **Braylon Edwards** is exactly 200 yards from Anthony Carter at the top of Michigan's career receiving yardage list. Already the school's career reception leader, Edwards is closing in on the top spots in receiving yards and touchdowns. Edwards has a U-M record 195 receptions for 2,876 yards and 31 touchdowns during his career, including a record-tying 14 career 100-yard receiving games. He has made at least one reception in 31 straight games, one game shy of tying Marquise Walker's (1998-2001) school record of 32 consecutive games. Edwards has led the Wolverines in receptions each of the past 10 games and in receiving yards for nine consecutive contests entering the Minnesota game.

Henne Tops 1,000 Passing Yards

Freshman quarterback **Chad Henne** (*Wyomissing, Pa./Wilson HS*) heads into the Minnesota game having topped the 1,000-yard passing mark through five games. Henne has completed 83-of-135 passes (61.5 pct.) for 1,096 yards and nine touchdowns while throwing five interceptions. He was named the ABC Player of the Game for the second time this season after completing 17 of 21 passes for a career-best 316 yards and three touchdowns at Indiana. Henne converted all five third-down passes for 115 yards and one TD against the Hoosiers. He has not thrown an interception since the fourth quarter of the San Diego State (47 attempts). Henne is third in the Big Ten in passing offense (219.2 avg.) and pass efficiency (144.3 rating). He is tops among true freshman signal callers nationally in completions, attempts and passing yards, and lists tied for first in touchdown passes. Henne is second in pass efficiency and total offense to Air Force's Shaun Carney.

Hart Among Top U-M Freshman Runners

Freshman tailback **Michael Hart** (*Syracuse, N.Y./Onondaga Central HS*) enters the Minnesota game seeking his first career start at Michigan Stadium. Hart made his first career start at Indiana, rushing 20 times for 79 yards and adding two catches for 36 yards. He became the first true freshman to start at tailback for the Wolverines since Ricky Powers in 1991. Hart leads the Wolverines in rushing with 79 carries for 336 yards (4.3 avg.) and two touchdowns. He has also added six receptions for 57 yards. Hart is 92nd nationally in rushing yards per game with a 67.2-yard average.

Martin Becomes Eighth True Freshman to See Action

Freshman tailback **Max Martin** (*Madison, Ala./Bob Jones HS*) enters the Minnesota game after making his career debut at Indiana. He became the eighth true freshman to see action this season, a record number of first-year players to play under head coach Lloyd Carr. Martin played on special teams against the Hoosiers and made his debut at tailback during the fourth quarter. He finished second to classmate Michael Hart in rushing vs. Indiana, carrying seven times for 21 yards.

Gonzales Making Major Contribution

Fifth-year senior wide receiver **Jermaine Gonzales** (*Pontiac, Mich./Orchard Lake St. Mary's HS*) continues to make a major contribution at wide receiver as the season progresses. He opened the scoring at Indiana, catching a 40-yard touchdown strike from Chad Henne. Gonzales finished with two receptions for 48 yards against the Hoosiers. He has a reception in each of the past three games. Gonzales is fourth among receivers with four catches for 62 yards (15.5 avg.) this season.

Avant Stepping Up Play

Junior wide receiver **Jason Avant** (*Chicago, Ill./Carver HS*) has a knack for stepping up in conference play for the Wolverines, catching 36 passes for 603 yards and one TD in 10 Big Ten games over the past two years. Avant is second on the team in receiving yards (126) and is third in receptions (10) this season. He grabbed two catches for 27 yards at Indiana, including a 14-yard pass on third down to keep U-M's opening touchdown drive alive. Avant has caught at least one pass in 17 consecutive games played. He continues to creep closer to the 1,000-yard receiving mark in his career, boasting 59 receptions for 919 yards and two touchdowns. Avant needs 81 receiving yards to become the 21st player in Michigan history to reach the 1,000-yard barrier.

Rivas Second in Scoring

Sophomore kicker **Garrett Rivas** (*Tampa, Fla./Jesuit HS*) is second on the team and tied for eighth in the Big Ten in scoring this season (7.2 avg.). Rivas has connected on seven-of-10 field goals and hit 15 point-after-attempts for a total of 36 points. He hit all five PAT attempts at Indiana. Rivas is tied for third in the Big Ten and lists tied for 25th nationally in field goals per game (1.4 avg.), with his 70 percent conversion rate on field goal tries listing second only to Ohio State's Mike Nugent in the conference. Rivas notched eight points in last season's record comeback at Minnesota, including the game-winning 33-yard field goal with 47 seconds left in the game. He has converted 16 of 22 field goal attempts (72.7 pct.) during his brief career.

Finley Among Nation's Best Punters

Fifth-year senior punter **Adam Finley** (*Greenwood, Ind./Center Grove HS*) is listed among the nation's best punters this season, ranking 10th in punting average at 44.1 yards per punt. Finley has punted 26 times for 1,146 yards, with six boots for more than 50 yards and four kicks dropped inside the opposition's 20-yard line. A three-time Ray Guy Award candidate, Finley punted twice for a 44-yard average in the fourth quarter at Indiana. He has 152 career punts for 6,348 yards (41.8 avg.), with 20 boots of 50 yards or more and 41 punts knocked inside the opponent's 20-yard line. Finley is sixth in Michigan history in career punts and yardage, and ranks second in punting average.

Shazor Pacing Defense in Stops

Senior strong safety **Ernest Shazor** (*Detroit, Mich./Martin Luther King HS*) is pacing the Wolverine defense in tackles this season with 28. A Jim Thorpe Award candidate, Shazor has contributed three tackles for loss, three pass breakups, two interceptions and one fumble recovery this season. He made two solo stops and one TFL at Indiana. Shazor has played in 28 career games and made 16 starts at safety, tallying 110 tackles, 12 TFLs, three sacks, four interceptions and 11 PBUs. He has recorded a career-best eight tackles in a game four times during his career, including an eight-stop effort in last season's Minnesota game.

Mundy Provides Consistency at Safety

Sophomore free safety **Ryan Mundy** (*Wilkins Township, Pa./Woodland Hills HS*) continues to develop into a solid complement to Ernest Shazor, with the starting safety tandem ranking 1-2 in tackles for the Wolverines. Mundy has been a consistent performer in the secondary, matching his career high with five stops the past three games after tallying four-tackle efforts in the team's first two games of the season. Mundy has started all five games at safety and is second on the squad with 23 tackles. He is tied for fourth in the Big Ten with two interceptions.

Reid Stopping Opposition Behind the Line

Senior inside linebacker **Lawrence Reid** (*Pickerington, Ohio/Pickerington HS*) leads the defense in tackles for loss and is third in stops entering the Minnesota game. The team's top returning tackler from a year ago, Reid has 22 stops on the year, including a team-best six TFLs and one sack. Reid has contributed one interception, one pass breakup, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery that he returned five yards for a touchdown against San Diego State. He made five solo tackles, two TFLs and one sack at Indiana. A Butkus Award candidate, Reid has 117 career tackles, 13 TFLs, three sacks, four PBUs, two fumble recoveries and one interception. He has played in 23 career games and made 18 straight starts at inside linebacker.

McClintock Seeks 100th Stop

Senior inside linebacker **Scott McClintock** (*Belle Vernon, Pa./Belle Vernon HS*) needs two tackles in the Minnesota game to become the fifth current defensive player to surpass 100 tackles in his career (Markus Curry, Marlin Jackson, Lawrence Reid and Ernest Shazor are the others). McClintock has 98 career tackles. He has added eight tackles for loss, one sack, one interception, two fumble recoveries and two pass breakups during his career. McClintock tied for the team lead with six solo tackles at Indiana. He is tied for third on the team with 22 tackles this season, including three for loss, one fumble recovery and one PBU.

Manning Making Big Plays

Fifth-year senior outside linebacker **Roy Manning** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) is playing at a high level entering the Minnesota game. Manning has started all five games this season and with 20 tackles has

matched his career high set a year ago. He is fifth on the team with 20 stops and is tied for the Big Ten lead with two forced fumbles. Manning has also contributed three tackles for loss and one sack on the year. Manning made four tackles at Indiana after posting a career-best seven tackles, one TFL and one forced fumble in the conference opener vs. Iowa. He has 51 tackles, seven TFLs, three sacks and two forced fumbles in 31 career games.

Watson Filling Middle of U-M Defense

Junior defensive tackle **Gabe Watson** (*Novi, Mich./Southfield HS*) has been a force on the inside of Michigan's defense as he leads the defensive front in tackles this season. Watson heads into the Battle for the Little Brown Jug with a career-best 17 stops this season, including two tackles for loss, one sack and one forced fumble. He recorded six stops, one TFL and his first career sack in the conference opener against Iowa. Watson achieved his career high in stops, eight tackles and one TFL, at Notre Dame (Sept. 11). He has recorded 32 tackles in 26 career games.

Woodley Bringing the Wood

Sophomore outside linebacker **LaMarr Woodley** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) enters the Battle for the Little Brown Jug after playing his best two games of the season in Big Ten wins over Iowa and Indiana. Woodley registered a season-high six solo tackles and two tackles for loss at Indiana after making four stops, two TFLs and one sack vs. Iowa. He has 17 tackles, five TFLs, one sack and one pass breakup this season. Woodley set his career high with nine tackles and one TFL in last season's win at Minnesota.

Mason Contributing on Special Teams and in Secondary

Senior cornerback **Grant Mason** (*Pontiac, Mich./Orchard Lake St. Mary's HS*) has become a major factor on special teams units for the Wolverines and in the secondary on nickel and dime packages. Mason returned three kickoff returns for 136 yards at Indiana, including a 97-yard return that set up Michigan's first of three successive scores during the third quarter. It was the longest kickoff return by a Wolverine since Seth Smith returned a kickoff 100 yards for a TD against Wisconsin on Oct. 29, 1994. Mason also added one stop against the Hoosiers. He has 12 tackles on the season, seven of which have come on special teams, and has one interception that was returned 25 yards for a touchdown vs. Iowa.

Hall Scoring, Stopping Opposition

Sophomore cornerback **Leon Hall** (*Vista, Calif./Vista HS*) heads into the Minnesota game playing his best football of the season. Hall scored the first special teams touchdown of the season for the Wolverines, returning a punt 76 yards for a TD at Indiana. He added four tackles and one pass breakup against the Hoosiers from his starting right cornerback spot. A starter the past three games, Hall has tallied four-tackle efforts against Big Ten foes Iowa and Indiana and a career-best five-stop game vs. San Diego State. He has tallied a pass breakup in each of the past three contests and is tied with Markus Curry for the team lead with four PBUs. Hall has played in 18 career games and made six starts, recording 41 stops, two TFLs, one sack, one fumble recovery, four interceptions and 10 PBUs.

Nation's Leader in Turnovers Forced; Tied for Lead in Interceptions

Michigan continues to lead the nation in turnovers forced (19) through five games, despite not forcing a turnover by Indiana. Kansas and Ohio University are tied for second in the national rankings with 17 forced turnovers. U-M is also tied with Kansas for the national lead with 11 interceptions. Michigan's eight fumble recoveries are tied for fifth nationally. The 11 picks by the Wolverines are three shy of last season's total of 14 interceptions. The school record for turnovers forced in a season is 42 held by the 1969 squad.

U-M Nears Top of Turnover Margin

The Wolverines are third in the Big Ten and tied for 16th nationally in turnover margin with a 1.4 average per game. U-M has 19 takeaways to 12 turnovers in five games. Minnesota leads the Big Ten in turnover margin with a 1.6 average, followed closely by Purdue (1.5 avg.) and Michigan. The Gophers have only turned the ball over twice this season (one fumble, one interception) while the Boilermakers have yet to have a miscue.

Points off Turnovers

The Wolverines have been impressive converting the opposition's turnovers into points this season, registering 79 of the team's 152 points off miscues. U-M has scored 10 touchdowns and four field goals on the 19 turnovers this season. The Wolverines were unable to force the Hoosiers into a turnover. It was the first time U-M was unable to force an opponent miscue since the Oregon game last year (Sept. 20, 2003). Michigan turned four Iowa turnovers into 27 points in the 30-17 victory to open the conference season.

Nation's Top Ranked Rushing Defense

Michigan leads the nation in rushing defense through five games, allowing the opposition a mere 47.2 yards per game on the ground. U-M will test the ranking against the nation's third-best rushing offense in Minnesota (323.4 yards per game). The Wolverines have held three of their first four opponents to less than 35 rushing yards, including a minus 15-yard effort from the defense vs. Iowa. The last time U-M held an opponent to negative rushing yards was 1987, when the Wolverines held the Hawkeyes to negative 13 rushing yards on 20 carries (Oct. 17, 1987).

Defense Providing Points

Michigan's defense has scored three touchdowns this season, two on interceptions and another on a five-yard fumble recovery by **Lawrence Reid** against San Diego State. **Ernest Shazor** scored the team's first defensive points of the season on an 88-yard interception and return vs. Miami (Ohio), the third longest in Michigan history. **Grant Mason** picked off a pass against Iowa and returned it 25 yards for the Wolverines' third defensive touchdown in four games. The last time Michigan scored more than three defensive touchdowns in a season was 1998, when the Wolverines had four scores. The 1998 total included a pair of interceptions for TDs in both the Eastern Michigan game and Citrus Bowl vs. Arkansas.

Michigan Tops Big Ten Preseason Poll

Defending Big Ten football champion Michigan was voted the preseason conference favorite in a poll of media members attending the Big Ten Media Day in Chicago, the league announced Aug. 4. Ohio State and Iowa, both U-M opponents in 2004, were second and third in the preseason poll. The Wolverines return 47 lettermen from last season, including 17 starters (seven offense, six defense, four specialists). The last time Michigan received the conference's preseason nod to win the championship was 2000, a year in which the Wolverines solidified the media's selection with a 38-26 victory against Ohio State in Columbus to claim the title.

Michigan Looks for Second Straight Big Ten Title

Last year Michigan won the outright Big Ten title with a 7-1 conference record. It was the Wolverines' first conference championship since 2000. Michigan has a long history of winning back-to-back titles. In fact, they have created streaks of conference championships nine times. That includes three streaks of two titles in a row, one streak of three titles in a row, four streaks of four titles in a row, and from 1988-1992 Michigan won an incredible five Big Ten conference championships in a row.

Carr on U-M Sideline for 25th Season

Lloyd Carr reached a milestone this year as he tied Fielding Yost for second all-time in terms of years spent coaching on Michigan's sideline. Only Bennie Oosterbaan with 31 years (11 as the head coach) has more service time. Carr over his first nine years as head coach has compiled a 90-27 record, including an impressive 58-16 mark in Big Ten games. He is also currently the winningest coach at Michigan Stadium by winning percentage. Carr has gone 55-6 at the Big House for an incredible winning percentage of .901. Carr has led the Wolverines to four Big Ten championships and the 1997 national championship in his nine seasons at the helm. His 15 years as an assistant were spent first as secondary coach, then defensive coordinator and then he added assistant head coach into his title for his final five years as an assistant.
