**Series History:** This will be the 88th meeting between the two programs. Michigan holds a 64-21-2 advantage in the all-time series with Illinois and has compiled a 28-10-1 record at Memorial Stadium (31-11-1 mark in Champaign). The Wolverines have a 7-2-1 advantage in the last 10 games in the series, including wins in four consecutive contests and seven of the last eight matchups between the two schools. U-M has a 20-11-2 record against Illinois in games decided by seven or fewer points and has a tenuous 7-6-2 advantage in games decided by three or fewer points. Lloyd Carr has a 6-1 record vs. Illinois, including a 3-0 mark in Champaign.

**Last Meeting:** (#17 Michigan 56, Illinois 14, Michigan Stadium, Oct. 18, 2003) Head coach Lloyd Carr won his 50th conference games as No. 17 Michigan dominated Illinois, 56-14, for the 79th time homecoming victory in school history. Senior tailback Chris Perry passed the 3,000-yard career mark in the first half en route to a 140-yard, three-touchdown performance. Running backs Tim Bracken and Jerome Jackson also ran for touchdowns. Tight ends Andy Mignery and Tim Massaquoi caught touchdown passes. With his 74-yard punt return for a touchdown in the first half, sophomore Steve Breaston surpassed Tripp Welborne for first place on Michigan's single-season punt return yardage list. John Navarre and backup Matt Gutierrez combined to complete 22 of 34 passes to 12 different receivers. Sophomore wide receiver Jason Avant and sophomore fullback Brian Thompson each caught four passes.

**Did You Know?**

Lloyd Carr will participate in his 300th game as a member of the Michigan coaching staff. Carr is in his 25th season with the Wolverine program, the past 10 years as head coach and his first 15 seasons as an assistant coach. He arrived at Michigan in 1980 after coaching the defensive backs for two seasons at Illinois under Gary Moeller (1978-79).

Lloyd Carr has a 5-1 record in 2004. Carr is in his 10th year as Michigan's head coach and his 25th overall season with the Wolverine program. The fifth-winningest active Division I-A coach with a .771 winning percentage, Carr has a 91-27 career record and an impressive 59-16 Big Ten Conference mark. He has a 57-18 record over the last six seasons (1998-2003) and has led the Wolverines to seven consecutive Jan. 1 bowl games. Carr was named the 1997 national coach of the year after guiding the program to a perfect 12-0 record and the *Associated Press* national championship. Carr led the Wolverines to back-to-back Big Ten Conference titles (1997-98) a share of the 2000 championship and the outright 2003 title. His teams have finished in the top 20 nationally each of his first nine years. Carr, previously a Michigan assistant coach for 15 years, began his college coaching career as a defensive backs coach at Eastern Michigan (1976-77) before joining Gary Moeller's staff at Illinois in the same role (1978-79). Carr came to Michigan in 1980 as Bo Schembechler's secondary coach. Carr served as defensive coordinator (1987-94) and was assistant head coach (1990-94).

# Game Notes

## U-M Jumps to 13th in Coaches, Remains 14th in Associated Press

The University of Michigan football team climbed one spot in the coaches poll and stood pat in the media poll following its 27-24 victory vs. Minnesota. The Wolverines elevated one spot to No. 13 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches and rank No. 14 in the Associated Press poll for the second straight week. Michigan has appeared in the top 25 of the last 99 AP polls, the longest streak in the nation.

## Michigan vs. Illinois

The Wolverines have a 64-21-2 record against the Fighting Illini and are 7-2-1 in the last 10 meetings. Illinois is Michigan's fourth most common opponent all-time with 87 previous matchups. Michigan has been impressive in games decided by seven or fewer points, holding a 20-11-2 record against Illinois but only a slight 7-6-2 advantage in games decided by three or fewer points.

## Michigan vs. Illinois at Memorial Stadium

The Wolverines play at Memorial Stadium for the second time this season, but don't be confused, this Memorial Stadium is in Champaign, the previous one was in Bloomington, Ind. (35-14 U-M win on Oct. 2). Michigan has had much success in the past against the Illini in Champaign, holding a 31-11-1 lead in the series there. The last time Michigan lost at Illinois was back in 1983, a 16-6 setback.

## Wolverines from the State of Illinois

Four members of the 2004 Michigan football team hail from the state of Illinois. Senior wide receiver **Jason Avant** (*Chicago, Ill./Carver HS*) is a starter at wide receiver this season and junior offensive lineman **Mike Kolodziej** (*Joliet, Ill./Joliet Catholic Academy*), the team's backup at left tackle, figures to see some playing time. Also hailing from Illinois are a couple of freshmen, outside linebacker **Tim Jamison** (*Riverdale, Ill./Harvey Thornton HS*) and defensive tackle **Marques Walton** (*Chicago, Ill./Hubbard HS*).

### Michigan on Artificial Turf

The Wolverines will play their 238th game on artificial turf Saturday and the sixth contest this season (4-0 at home and 1-0 on the road). Michigan has been impressive on turf since 1969, holding a 196-37-5 record (.834), including a 120-17-3 mark (.868) when Michigan Stadium was carpeted between 1969 and 1990. Carr has compiled a 28-6 record on artificial surfaces.

### U-M in October

Michigan has compiled an impressive 389-112-13 (.769) all-time record in October. The Wolverines have a 26-7 mark in the 10th month of the year under head coach **Lloyd Carr** and have won 12 of their last 15 contests in October.

### Carr to Participate in 300th U-M Game

Head coach **Lloyd Carr** will participate in his 300th game as member of the Michigan coaching staff when the Wolverines travel to Illinois on Saturday (Oct. 16). Carr reached a milestone this year as he tied Fielding Yost for second all-time in terms of years spent coaching on Michigan's sideline (25). Only Bennie Oosterbaan with 31 years (11 as the head coach) has more service time. Carr has compiled an 91-27 record during his 10 years as head coach, including an impressive 59-16 mark in Big Ten games. He is also currently the winningest coach at Michigan Stadium by winning percentage. Carr has gone 56-6 at the Big House for an incredible winning percentage of .902. His 15 years as an assistant were spent first as secondary coach, then defensive coordinator and then he added assistant head coach into his title for his final five years as an assistant.

### Carr Seeks 60th Big Ten Win

**Lloyd Carr** enters the Illinois game looking to collect his 60th Big Ten victory in 76 tries. Carr has an impressive 59-16 career Big Ten record and is the conference's active leader in career wins in Big Ten play. He has led the Wolverines to four conference titles (1997, 1998, 2000, and 2003). Carr has compiled a 33-5 record against Big Ten foes at Michigan Stadium and has won 23 of his last 26 at the "Big House" (last loss was a 34-9 setback vs. Iowa in 2002). He has compiled a 26-11 conference mark on the road.

### Henne Top Freshman Signal Caller

Freshman quarterback **Chad Henne** (*Wyomissing, Pa./Wilson HS*) enters the Illinois game showing a greater command of the offense each and every week. He is the top true freshman signal caller nationally in completions, attempts and passing yards, and lists tied for first in touchdown passes. He is second among freshmen in pass efficiency to Tennessee's Erik Ainge. Henne has completed 116-of-184 passes (63 pct.) for 1,424 yards and 11 touchdowns while throwing seven interceptions. He threw for more than 300 yards for the second straight game, setting career highs and Michigan freshman records for attempts (49), completions (33) and passing yards (328) in U-M's come-from-behind 27-24 win over No. 13 Minnesota. Henne engineered the game-winning touchdown drive, 87 yards in 67 seconds, that culminated with a 31-yard TD pass to junior tight end **Tyler Ecker** (*El Dorado Hills, Calif./Oak Ridge HS*) with 1:57 left in the fourth quarter. Henne completed five-of-six passes on the scoring drive and distributed the ball to four different receivers. With the 328-yard performance against the Gophers, Henne joined current Arizona Cardinals quarterback and Wolverine record holder John Navarre as the only Wolverines to throw back-to-back 300-yard passing games. Navarre eclipsed the 300-yard barrier in games at Iowa (389) and Minnesota (353) last season.

### Hart Pacing Ground Game

Freshman tailback **Michael Hart** (*Syracuse, N.Y./Onondaga Central HS*) has become the featured back for the Wolverines since being inserted into the lineup against San Diego State. Hart is four rushing yards shy of 500 this season, and leads U-M with 114 carries for 496 yards (4.4 avg.) and three rushing touchdowns. He is also fourth on the team with 12 receptions for 110 yards. Hart is fifth in the Big Ten and 56th nationally in rushing yards per game (82.7 avg.).

### Hart Stopping Performer

**Michael Hart** is averaging 140.5 yards per game over the past four contests, 114.75 on the ground and another 25.75 yards through the air. He has topped the 100-yard rushing barrier twice during that stretch, a 121-yard effort vs. San Diego State (Sept. 18) and 160 yards against Minnesota (Oct. 9). Hart set Michigan true freshmen records for carries (35) and rushing yards (160) against the Gophers. He scored on an eight-yard touchdown run against Minnesota and added a career-high six receptions for 53 yards. His 213 all-purpose yards are the most by a U-M player since Chris Perry gained 236 all-purpose yards at Michigan State last season.

### Edwards Chasing History

Senior wide receiver **Braylon Edwards** (*Detroit, Mich./Bishop Gallagher HS*) heads into the Minnesota game drawing closer to his third consecutive 1,000-yard receiving season. Edwards has 50 receptions for 763 yards (15.3 avg.) and eight touchdowns. He caught 10 passes for 98 yards, including a four-yard touchdown reception, and had two laterals for 23 rushing yards vs. Minnesota. Edwards has surpassed 100 receiving yards in four of the six games this season. A Biletnikoff Award candidate, he has more receptions and yards through the first six games of a season than any receiver in Michigan history. He needs 100 or more receiving yards against Illinois to break a tie with Anthony Carter for most career 100-yard receiving games by a Wolverine (14). Edwards seeks his 30th start at wide receiver for the Wolverines and his 13th straight starting assignment.

### Edwards Equals Six

**Braylon Edwards** has found the end zone in five of the six games this season, including twice against Miami (Ohio), San Diego State and Indiana. Edwards also added a touchdown grab in conference home games against Iowa and Minnesota. He is second nationally among wide receivers in touchdowns with eight, trailing only Purdue's Taylor Stubblefield (11). Edwards is averaging a touchdown grab every 6.25 receptions this season, slightly ahead of his career average of a score every 6.4 catches. Edwards has scores in 12 of his last 15 contests dating back to 2003. He is tied with 1991 Heisman Trophy winner Desmond Howard (1989-91) for second place all-time on Michigan's career touchdown receptions list with 32 touchdown catches. Edwards is five touchdown grabs from equaling the 37 scores gained by Anthony Carter (1979-82), the U-M and Big Ten record holder.

### Edwards Among National Leaders

**Braylon Edwards** is among the top three in each of the major national receiving categories. He is second in total receiving yards (763) and 100-yard receiving games (four), trailing national leader Jarrett Hicks of Texas Tech in both categories. Edwards is tied for second in receptions (8.33 avg.) and receiving touchdowns (eight) while listing third in receiving yards (127.17 avg.). He is tops in the Big Ten in receptions and receiving yards, and trails only Purdue's Taylor Stubblefield in receiving TDs. He is the only player in the nation to collect at least 90 receiving yards in every games this season and is one of three players to record six or more catches in every game.

### Edwards Chasing Down Carter

Already the school's career reception leader, **Braylon Edwards** is closing in on Anthony Carter's records for receiving yards and touchdowns. Edwards enters the Illinois game 103 receiving yards from breaking Carter's career yardage mark of 3,076 yards that has stood for 22 years. Edwards has a U-M record 205 receptions for 2,974 yards and 32 touchdowns during his career, including a record-tying 14 career 100-yard receiving games. He has made at least one reception in a school-record-tying 32 straight games, matching the mark of Marquise Walker (1998-2001). Edwards has led the Wolverines in receptions each of the past 11 games and in receiving yards for 10 consecutive contests.

### Edwards Climbing Big Ten Charts

In addition to his pursuit of Michigan's career receiving records, **Braylon Edwards** has begun to climb the Big Ten Conference receiving annals. Edwards is tied for fourth in receiving touchdowns (32), fifth in receptions (205) and 10th in yardage (2,974). He needs six catches to move ahead of Northwestern's D'Wayne Bates into fourth on the receptions list and 165 receiving yards to climb into the top five in receiving yards in the conference record book. Edwards needs 26 receiving yards against Illinois to become the eighth player in Big Ten history to gain 3,000 receiving yards in a career.

### Amazing Avant

Junior wide receiver **Jason Avant** (*Chicago, Ill./Carver HS*) has a knack for making key catches for Michigan especially during the conference season. An All-Big Ten second team performer last season, Avant has 11 catches for 156 yards in three conference games this season, moving his amazing conference statistics to 42 receptions for 690 yards and one TD in 11 career Big Ten games. He is second on the team in receiving yards (213) and third in receptions (16) and looks to collect his first touchdown of the season when the Wolverines enter his home state of Illinois. A Biletnikoff Award candidate, Avant set season highs with six receptions for 87 yards vs. Minnesota, including passes of 17 and 20 yards on the game-winning drive. All six of his catches against the Gophers produced first downs for the Wolverines.

### Avant Tops 1,000 Career Yards

With 87 receiving yards vs. Minnesota, **Jason Avant** became the 21st receiver in Michigan football history to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards. He has hauled in at least one reception in 18 straight games played and enters Illinois with 65 career receptions for 1,006 yards and two touchdowns. Avant looks to make his 15th career start at wide receiver when U-M faces the Fighting Illini.

### Breaston Second in Receptions

Junior wide receiver **Steve Breaston** (*North Braddock, Pa./Woodland Hills HS*) enters the Illinois game second on the team in receptions and third in receiving yards despite missing the Indiana game due to injury. He has 18 receptions for 128 yards this season and scored his lone touchdown on a 25-yard pass from Chad Henne at Notre Dame (Sept. 11). Breaston made three catches for 16 yards vs. Minnesota and extended his streak to 15 games played with at least one reception. A threat to score every time he touches the football, Breaston has snared three or more passes in each of his five games. He has 56 receptions for 572 yards and four TDs in 18 career games.

### Lentz Eyes 20th Start

Senior offensive lineman **Matt Lentz** (*Ortonville, Mich./Ortonville HS*) enters the Illinois game looking to make his 20th straight start at right guard. Lentz has started every game over the past two seasons at right guard and has played in 28 career contests for the Wolverines. He is third among U-M offensive linemen in career starts, trailing fifth-year senior co-captain **David Baas** (*Sarasota, Fla./Riverview HS*) and senior left tackle **Adam Stenavich** (*Marshfield, Wis./Marshfield HS*). Baas has started 33 career games along the offensive line while Stenavich has 22 assignments at left tackle.

### Offensive Line Shuffle

The Wolverines enters Champaign looking to start the same five starters from the previous game along the offensive line for just the third time this season. U-M has produced four different starting combinations in its first six games, with the recent adjustment coming at left guard. Junior **Rueben Riley** (*Grand Rapids, Mich./Creston HS*) stepped into the starting lineup against Minnesota after the Wolverines lost two-game starter and senior **Leo Henige** (*Chesaning, Mich./Chesaning HS*) for the season to a knee injury. Adam Stenavich, David Baas and Matt Lentz are the only members of the offensive line unit to start all six games, with Baas shifting from left guard to center after three games.

### Massaquoi Sets Career High in Catches

Senior tight end **Tim Massaquoi** (*Allentown, Pa./Parkland HS*) is rounding into midseason form as the Wolverines get set to face Illinois. Massaquoi had a career-best four receptions for 31 yards against Minnesota, doubling his season totals to eight catches for 82 yards. He has started five of the six games at tight end this season and 14 games overall during his career. Massaquoi has 25 career receptions for 301 yards and two touchdowns.

### Ecker Catches Gamer

The second tight end in the Wolverines' formidable 1-2 punch is junior **Tyler Ecker**. Ecker matched his career high with three catches for 38 yards vs. Minnesota, including the game-winning 31-yard touchdown play from Chad Henne with 1:57 left in the fourth quarter. It was the first score of Ecker's career. He equaled his three-catch, 31-yard output against Southern California in the 2004 Rose Bowl game. Ecker has a career-high eight receptions for 80 yards and one TD this season. He has played in 19 career games, contributing 15 catches for 178 yards.

### Breaston Produces Special Results

**Steve Breaston** creates opportunities for big plays with his elusiveness on special teams and ranks among the top return men all-time at Michigan in just 18 career games. Breaston is fifth all-time at Michigan in total returns (74) and return yards (1,116) with two touchdowns. He averages 15.1 yards per return. Anthony Carter (1979-82) holds the school marks with 144 returns for 2,510 yards. Breaston has 10 punt returns for 83 yards and 10 kickoff returns for 223 yards this season.

### Breaston Climbing Career Punt Return List

**Steve Breaston** has etched his name in the top four on Michigan's career punt return lists. He has 55 career punt returns for 702 yards and two touchdowns. Breaston is tied for third in career punt returns and is fourth in yardage. He scored two touchdowns on returns last season and has 10 career 20-yard-plus returns. He needs 49 return yards to pass Gene Derricotte (1944-48) for third place on the career yardage list. Anthony Carter (1979-82) holds Michigan's career punt return records with 81 attempts for 904 yards.

### Shazor Spearheading Stops

Senior strong safety **Ernest Shazor** (*Detroit, Mich./Martin Luther King HS*) enters the Illinois game after posting career highs in the 27-24 win over No. 13 Minnesota. Shazor became the first Wolverine to collect a double-digit tackle performance this season, registering career highs in total tackles (12), solo stops (11) and tackles for loss (four). He is the team's top tackler with 40 stops this season, and is tied for top honors with seven TFLs. Shazor has also contributed three pass breakups, two interceptions and one fumble recovery this season. A Jim Thorpe Award candidate, he has 122 tackles, 16 TFLs, three sacks, four interceptions, one fumble recovery and 12 PBU's during his career.

### Dr. Watson Leading Defensive Line

Junior defensive tackle **Gabe Watson** (*Novi, Mich./Southfield HS*) is becoming a formidable force in the middle of Michigan's defense. He leads all Wolverine defensive linemen with a career-best 22 tackles this season, including three tackles for loss, two sacks and one forced fumble. Watson contributed five stops against Minnesota, including a key sack on third down that halted a Gophers drive late in the fourth quarter. He has started five straight games in the middle. Watson has registered 37 career tackles in 27 games of action, with four TFLs and two sacks.

### Massey Sacking Opposition

Senior defensive end **Pat Massey** (*Brecksville, Ohio/St. Ignatius HS*) heads into the Illinois game leading the defense with four sacks this season, with each coming in the past four games. Massey made four tackles and one sack against Minnesota. Massey is second to **Gabe Watson** in tackles among defensive linemen, posting 19 total tackles as well as his four sacks. Massey has 47 career stops, 15 in the opposition's backfield, and eight sacks. He has played in 30 career games and made 15 starts.

### Reid-ing and Tackling

Senior inside linebacker **Lawrence Reid** (*Pickerington, Ohio/Pickerington HS*) heads into the Illinois game second on the team in tackles and tied with Ernest Shazor for the team-lead in tackles for loss. Reid has 27 tackles on the year, including seven TFLs, one sack, one interception, one fumble recovery and one forced fumble. A Butkus Award candidate, he contributed five tackles and one TFL vs. Minnesota. Reid has three or more stops in each of the six games this season. He has contributing 122 stops, 14 TFLs, three sacks, one interception, two fumble recoveries and four pass breakups during his career. He has played in 24 career games and made 19 straight starts at inside linebacker.

### Woodley Bringing the Wood

Sophomore outside linebacker **LaMarr Woodley** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) is playing the best and most consistent football of his career since the start of the Big Ten season. Woodley has matched his career high with 23 tackles this season, including 16 of those stops in three conference games. He has tallied season-best six-tackle efforts the past two games. Woodley is four tackles shy of 50 on his career. He has played in 19 career games and made seven starts, contributing 46 tackles, nine TFLs and two sacks.

### Manning Up

Fifth-year senior outside linebacker **Roy Manning** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) continues to be a resilient force in Michigan's defense entering Illinois. Manning is tied for third on the team with a career-high 26 tackles this season. He has also contributed three tackles for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles. Manning made six stops against Minnesota. He has 57 tackles, seven TFLs, three sacks and two forced fumbles in 32 career games.

### Jackson Ties Woodson

Senior co-captain and starting cornerback **Marlin Jackson** (*Sharon, Pa./Sharon HS*) enters the Illinois game looking to play in his team-leading 40th game and make his 33rd start in the secondary. A Thorpe Award and All-America candidate, teams have shied away from Jackson's side of the field this season. He made four solo tackles against Minnesota. Jackson had a season-high seven passes thrown his direction by the Gophers, with only two receptions. He is tied with 1997 Heisman Trophy winner Charles Woodson (1995-1997) for the second slot on U-M's career PBU list. He has started all six games this season at cornerback, contributing 17 tackles, two TFLs, one sack, one forced fumble and one PBU this season. For his career, Jackson leads the Wolverines with 165 stops, nine TFLs, three sacks, eight interceptions and 30 PBUs.

### McClintock Continues Strong Play

Senior inside linebacker **Scott McClintock** (*Belle Vernon, Pa./Belle Vernon HS*) has had a strong season this year for the Wolverines. He tallied three assisted tackles vs. Minnesota, giving him 25 stops on the season to place fifth on the team. McClintock also has three tackles for loss for a total of 12 yards, two pass breakups and one fumble recovery. With three stops against the Gophers, he became the fifth current defensive player to surpass 100 tackles in his career (Markus Curry, Marlin Jackson, Lawrence Reid and Ernest Shazor are the others). McClintock has 101 career tackles. He has added eight tackles for loss, one sack, one interception, two fumble recoveries and two pass breakups during his career.

### Mundy Among Team Leaders in Tackles

Sophomore free safety **Ryan Mundy** (*Wilkins Township, Pa./Woodland Hills HS*) is tied for third on the team with 26 tackles. That puts him behind Ernest Shazor (40) and Lawrence Reid (27), and even with Roy Manning (26). Mundy recorded three tackles vs. Minnesota (Oct. 9). For the season, in addition to his 26 tackles, Mundy has two interceptions and two pass breakups. He has started all six games at safety.

### Rivas Second in Scoring

Sophomore kicker **Garrett Rivas** (*Tampa, Fla./Jesuit HS*) is second on the team and tied for seventh in the Big Ten in scoring this season (7.5 avg.). Rivas has connected on nine-of-12 field goals and hit 18 point-after-attempts for a total of 45 points. He hit field goals from 38 and 22 yards and connected on all three PATs vs. Minnesota. Rivas is tied for second in the conference and lists tied for 16th nationally in field goals per game (1.5 avg.), with his 75 percent conversion rate on field goal tries listing second only to Ohio State's Mike Nugent in the Big Ten. He has converted 18 of 24 field goal attempts (75.0 pct.) during his brief career.

### Finley Among Nation's Best Punters

Fifth-year senior punter **Adam Finley** (*Greenwood, Ind./Center Grove HS*) is listed among the nation's best punters this season, ranking 26th in punting average at 42.9 yards per punt. Finley has punted 31 times for 1,330 yards, with six boots for more than 50 yards and six kicks dropped inside the opposition's 20-yard line. A three-time Ray Guy Award candidate, Finley has 157 career punts for 6,532 yards (41.6 avg.), with 20 boots of 50 yards or more and 43 punts knocked inside the opponent's 20-yard line. Finley is sixth in Michigan history in career punts and yardage, and ranks second in punting average.

### Nation's No. 4 Rushing Defense

Michigan enters the Illinois game ranked fourth nationally in rushing defense, allowing the opposition a mere 70.8 yards per game on the ground. U-M limited the nation's third-best rushing attack in Minnesota (323.4 avg.) to 189 yards on the ground. The Wolverines dropped from the nation's top spot last week to fourth this week, behind Nebraska (60.2 avg.), Boise State (63.2 avg.) and Florida State (65.6 avg.). The Wolverines have held three opponents to less than 35 rushing yards, including a minus 15-yard effort from the defense vs. Iowa. The last time U-M held an opponent to negative rushing yards was 1987, when the Wolverines held the Hawkeyes to negative 13 rushing yards on 20 carries (Oct. 17, 1987).

### U-M Falls to Second in Turnovers Forced, Interceptions

Michigan has dropped out of the lead nationally in turnovers forced (19), since hitting a two-game spell without forcing a turnover. Ohio University leads the nation with 20 forced turnovers, with the Wolverines and Kansas tied for second in the national rankings with 19. U-M is also tied for second with 11 interceptions, trailing Kansas (12). Michigan's eight fumble recoveries are tied for ninth nationally. The 11 picks by the Wolverines are three shy of last season's total of 14 interceptions. The school record for turnovers forced in a season is 42 held by the 1969 squad.

### Points off Turnovers

The Wolverines have been impressive converting the opposition's turnovers into points this season, registering 79 of the team's 179 points off miscues. U-M has scored 10 touchdowns and four field goals on the 19 turnovers this season. The Wolverines were unable to force a turnover in the past two games. It was the first time U-M was unable to force an opponent miscue since the Oregon game last year (Sept. 20, 2003). Michigan turned four Iowa turnovers into 27 points in the 30-17 victory to open the conference season.

### Defense Providing Points

Michigan's defense has scored three touchdowns this season, two on interceptions and another on a five-yard fumble recovery by **Lawrence Reid** against San Diego State. **Ernest Shazor** scored the team's first defensive points of the season on an 88-yard interception and return vs. Miami (Ohio), the third longest in Michigan history. **Grant Mason** picked off a pass against Iowa and returned it 25 yards for the Wolverines' third defensive touchdown in four games. The last time Michigan scored more than three defensive touchdowns in a season was 1998, when the Wolverines had four scores. The 1998 total included a pair of interceptions for TDs in both the Eastern Michigan game and Citrus Bowl vs. Arkansas.

## BOWL HISTORY

- The Wolverines' streak of 29 straight bowl games is the second longest current streak in NCAA history.
- Michigan ranks ninth in NCAA history with 35 all-time bowl appearances.
- U-M is tied for 11th in all-time bowl victories (18).
- Michigan has appeared in more Rose Bowls (18) than any other Big Ten Conference school.
- The Wolverines have won four consecutive bowl games on two different occasions.
- Michigan has appeared 24 times since 1975 on Jan. 1 or Jan. 2, the year the Big Ten allowed more than just the champion to go to bowls.
- U-M beat Stanford 49-0 on Jan. 1, 1902, to win the first-ever Rose Bowl.
- Michigan has an overall bowl record of 18-17.

## NATIONAL POLLS

- U-M has appeared in the top 25 of the last 99 Associated Press polls, the longest streak in the nation, a streak that spans 76 games.
- U-M has been ranked in every poll for the past six seasons and has been listed in the national rankings every time since Oct. 24, 1998.
- Since the preseason 1988 poll, U-M has been ranked in every poll but three in 1993 and four in 1998.
- The Wolverines have been ranked in the top 25 for all but four of Lloyd Carr's 118 career games (all during the 1998 season).
- Since the preseason 1988 poll, U-M has been listed in every poll except three in 1993 and four in 1998.
- Michigan has been listed in the top 10 of the polls 58 times during Carr's tenure.
- U-M ranks No. 1 all-time in composite AP final football polls (1936-2003), passing Notre Dame for the top spot after last season's No. 6 final ranking.
- The Wolverines have finished in the top 10 of the AP poll 36 times since its inception in 1936.
- Michigan has finished in the final top 25 rankings 52 times since the inception of the AP poll in 1936.
- Michigan has been ranked in the final Associated Press top 25 poll the last 19 years and has been listed in the final rankings 34 of the last 36 years (was not ranked in 1984 and did not receive a final AP ranking in 1982).

## BIG TEN CONFERENCE

- U-M ranks first in all-time Big Ten football titles with 41.
- The Michigan football program is the only Big Ten team in any sport to win a conference title in each decade.
- Michigan has won or shared 20 Big Ten titles since 1969, including two conference crowns in the 2000s.
- The Wolverines have had 254 players named All-Big Ten Conference first team a total of 361 times, the most of any conference school.
- Michigan has won 23 consecutive Big Ten openers and 36 of the last 37.
- U-M has an overall record of 477-167-23 (.732) vs. Big Ten opponents.

## WOLVERINES IN THE NFL

- The Wolverines had 59 former players in 2004 NFL Training Camps.
- Michigan has placed 270 former players onto NFL rosters, including 40 players active in 2003.
- U-M lists fifth all-time with 39 first-round NFL draft picks.
- A total of 10 Michigan players have been selected in the top 10 of the NFL Draft.
- A total of 36 former U-M players have made 51 Super Bowl appearances.
- Two Wolverines have been selected Super Bowl MVP's: Desmond Howard and Tom Brady (twice).
- Wolverines have made 69 appearances in the NFL Pro Bowl.
- Six former Wolverines have been enshrined in the NFL Hall of Fame: George Allen, Tom Mack, Dan Dierdorf, Len Ford, Bill Hewitt and Elroy Hirsch.
