Radio Coverage: The Michigan Sports Network is comprised of 29 stations. Frank Beckmann (play-by-play), Jim Brandstatter (analyst) and Steve Courtney (sideline reports) will originate the game on NewsTalk 760 WJR-AM in Detroit.

TV Coverage: ABC Sports will broadcast the game to a regional audience. Mike Tirico (play-by-play), Tim Brant (color commentary) and Suzy Shuster (sideline reports and analysis) will call the game.

Series History: This will be the 53rd meeting between Michigan and Iowa. The Wolverines hold a 38-10-4 lead in the all-time series, and have a 14-4-1 mark at Kinnick Stadium (15-4-1 all-time in Iowa City). Michigan has won eighth of the last 10 games in the series. U-M head coach Lloyd Carr has a 4-2 record against Iowa.

Last Meeting: (#18 Michigan 30, Iowa 17 -- Michigan Stadium, Sept. 25, 2004) Michigan won its 23rd consecutive conference opener with a 30-17 victory over Iowa at Michigan Stadium.

The Wolverines' victory was highlighted by a strong defensive effort that sparked five Hawkeye turnovers that resulted in 27 points. The U-M offense was led by senior receiver Braylon Edwards, who gained a career-high 150 yards on six receptions along with a touchdown.

Michael Hart scored his first career touchdown, rushing for 99 yards on 26 carries. Chad Henne turned in another solid performance, completing 16-of-26 passes for 238 yards. Henne threw one touchdown pass on the afternoon and scored his first career touchdown on a one-yard quarterback sneak.

Roy Manning and Ernest Shazor paced the Wolverines' defense with seven tackles apiece, while Leon Hall and Grant Mason collected interceptions from Iowa quarterback Drew Tate. Mason's interception was returned 25-yards for a touchdown. All told, U-M held the Hawkeyes to a negative 15-yards rushing.

After Iowa got on the board first with a two-yard touchdown pass, Michigan responded with 16 unanswered points to close out the half. The Hawkeyes opened the second half with a field goal, but Michigan answered with a seven-yard Hart touchdown and Mason's interception return. Iowa scored midway through the fourth quarter, cutting the U-M lead to 30-17, but that proved to be the final score of the game.

Did You Know?

Lloyd Carr seeks his 100th victory as Michigan head coach when the Wolverines travel to Iowa on Saturday. Carr would join Fielding H. Yost (165-29-10) and Bo Schembechler (194-85-5) as the only Wolverine coaches to reach 100 career victories at Michigan

Lloyd Carr has a 4-3 record in his 11th year as Michigan's head coach and his 26th overall season with the Wolverine program. The fifth-winningest active Division I-A coach with a .756 winning percentage, Carr has a 99-32 career record and a 65-19 Big Ten Conference mark. He has guided the program to five Big Ten titles in the last eight years (1997-98-2000-03-04) and has led the Wolverines to nine consecutive Jan. 1 bowl games. Carr was named the 1997 national coach of the year after guiding the program to a perfect 12-0 record and the *Associated Press* national championship. Carr led the Wolverines to back-to-back Big Ten Conference titles (1997-98), a share of the 2000 championship and back-to-back conference crowns in 2003 and 2004. His teams have finished in the top 20 nationally each of his first 10 years. Carr, previously a Michigan assistant coach for 15 years, began his college coaching career as a defensive backs coach at Eastern Michigan (1976-77) before joining Gary Moeller's staff at Illinois in the same role (1978-79). Carr came to Michigan in 1980 as Bo Schembechler's secondary coach. Carr served as defensive coordinator (1987-94) and was elevated to assistant head coach for five seasons under Moeller (1990-94).

U-M Remains Outside of Top 25

The University of Michigan football team is unranked in the top 25 of both national polls for the second straight week and third time in the past four weeks. The Wolverines moved closer to the top 25 nationally following its 27-25 victory against Penn State on the game's final play (Oct. 15).

U-M received 58 votes in the Associated Press poll and collected 49 votes in the USA Today Coaches poll this week (Oct. 16). The Wolverines would list No. 29 in the AP poll and 30th in the coaches rankings. Iowa collected 68 votes (27th) in the USA Today poll and 29 votes (32nd) in the AP poll.

Michigan was not ranked in the Sept. 25 national polls for the first time since Oct. 18, 1998, a streak that was snapped at 114 consecutive weeks ranked in the AP poll.

Associated Press Poll Notes:

-- Michigan has the most weekly appearances in the AP poll, appearing 716 times (including preseason poll).

-- Since the preseason 1988 poll, U-M has been listed in every poll except three in 1993, four in 1998 and two in 2005.

-- Michigan has been listed in the top 10 of the polls 62 times during Carr's tenure.

-- The Wolverines have been ranked in the top 25 for all but six of Lloyd Carr's 131 career games (four in 1998 and two in 2005).

-- U-M ranks No. 1 all-time in composite AP final football polls (1936-2004).

-- The Wolverines have finished in the top 10 of the AP poll 36 times since its inception in 1936.

-- Michigan has finished in the final top 25 rankings 53 times since the inception of the AP poll in 1936.

-- U-M has finished in the top 25 rankings each of the past 20 seasons and 35 of the past 36 years (was not ranked in 1984 and did not receive a final AP ranking in 1982).

Michigan vs. Iowa Game Notes

Wolverines and Hawkeyes

Michigan holds a 38-10-4 edge in the all-time series against Iowa, but lost in its last appearance at Kinnick Stadium by a 30-27 score in 2003. The Wolverines had claimed seven straight victories against the Hawkeyes prior to back-to-back Iowa victories in 2002 and 2003. U-M's last win in Kinnick Stadium was 2001, a 32-26 victory in which wide receiver Marquise Walker made one-handed game-winning touchdown grab. Michigan holds a 14-5-4 edge over Iowa in games decided by seven or less points and is 6-4-4 in games decided by three or fewer points.

U-M at Kinnick Stadium

The Michigan football team heads into Iowa City having claimed victory in five of its last seven trips to Kinnick Stadium with one tie against the Hawkeyes (5-1-1). The Hawkeyes won the last meeting between the two programs in Iowa, a 30-27 game played on Oct. 4, 2003, when both teams were ranked among the top 25 (U-M 9/IA 23). Prior to the 2003 loss, the last road setback by the Wolverines against the Hawkeyes came on Oct. 19, 1985, a 12-10 game when the two schools were ranked No. 2 and No. 1 in the nation, respectively. U-M has a 14-4-1 record at Kinnick Stadium and is 15-4-1 all-time in Iowa City, Iowa. The Wolverines have a 7-0 record at Kinnick Stadium when the Hawkeyes are unranked.

Wolverine from Iowa

Sophomore wide receiver **Adrian Arrington** (*Cedar Rapids, Iowa/Washington HS*) is the lone Wolverine to hail from the state of Iowa. Arrington was injured in the season opener vs. Northern Illinois and has not played since that game.

Carr Seeks 100th Victory

Lloyd Carr enters the Iowa game looking to earn the 100th victory of his head coaching career. Carr has compiled a 99-32 record during his 11 seasons at Michigan. He will join Fielding H. Yost (165-29-10) and Bo Schembechler (194-48-5) as the only Wolverine coaches to reach the century mark in career victories. Carr will become the 11th coach in Big Ten history to amass 100 victories at his institution.

Carr vs. Big Ten Conference

The Big Ten's active leader in conference wins, **Lloyd Carr** will direct his 85th Big Ten game when the Wolverines face Iowa. Carr has a 65-19 career Big Ten record and has guided U-M to victories in 15 of his last 18 conference games. He has led the Wolverines to five conference titles (1997, 1998, 2000, 2003 and 2004) in the past eight years. Carr has compiled a 36-6 record against Big Ten foes at Michigan Stadium and has won 26 of his last 29 at the "Big House." He has a 28-14 conference mark on the road.

Back-to-Back Wins?

Michigan looks to claim back-to-back wins for the first time this season when it travels to Iowa on Saturday (Oct. 22). The last time the Wolverines won consecutive games was last season, winning their first seven conference games of the season. U-M's last back-to-back victories came against Michigan State (45-37 in triple overtime) and Northwestern (42-20) last season.

Down to the Wire

All four of Michigan's conference games have gone down to the wire this season, with the Wolverines claiming victory in two of those four contests. Both of U-M's wins came on the last play of the game as Garrett Rivas converted a game-ending 35-yard field goal in the first overtime session at Michigan State and Mario Manningham caught a 10-yard touchdown pass from Chad Henne with no time remaining in regulation against Penn State. Following is a breakdown of the game-winning plays in Michigan's four Big Ten games:

Hart Attacking Opponents

Sophomore tailback **Mike Hart** (*Sycaruse, N.Y./Onondaga Central HS*) has been a difficult back to stop since returning from injury. Hart is averaging 145 yards over the last three games and has cracked the 100-yard barrier in each contest, including a 208-yard effort at Michigan State. He carried the ball 23 times for 108 yards vs. Penn State, and scored the team's first offensive touchdown of the season in the third quarter on a two-yard run. Hart also matched his season-best with four receptions for 40 yards against the Nittany Lions. Hart has carried the ball 117 times for 556 yards (4.8 avg.) and scored four rushing touchdowns this season. He has also contributed in the passing game, listing fourth on the team with 11 receptions for 99 yards and one score. A Doak Walker Award candidate, Hart has cracked the 100-yard barrier in all four games that he has completed (five total games played).

Hart Protecting the Pigskin

Mike Hart enters the Iowa game with 380 offensive touches without a fumble. Hart has 128 touches this season, 117 carries and 11 receptions without a miscue, after carrying the ball 230 times and adding 22 receptions in eight-plus games last year following his only career fumble. The only time Hart fumbled the ball in his career was on a running play near the Iowa end zone during the fourth quarter of the Big Ten opener (Sept. 25, 2004).

Hart Dominating Big Ten Play

Mike Hart has been a productive back in Big Ten play during his short career, cracking the century mark in rushing during eight of his 11 career games. Hart has rushed 312 times for 1,649 yards (5.3 avg.) in conference play during his career for an average of 150 yards per contest. He has carried the ball 84 times for 435 yards (5.2 avg.) and scored three touchdowns in three games this season. Hart is third in conference play in rushing at 145 yards per contest, trailing only Minnesota's Laurence Maroney (163 avg.) and Northwestern's Tyrell Sutton (148.3 avg.). The 2004 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and first-team all-conference selection, Hart led the conference in rushing attempts (228) and yards (1,214) during Big Ten action last year. He has four 200-yard rushing efforts in those 11 career conference games.

Hart Surpasses 2,000 Career Yards

With his 108-yard effort against Penn State, **Mike Hart** moved into 20th place on Michigan's career rushing list and eclipsed 2,000 career rushing yards in the process. Hart's 11-yard run on the game-winning drive pushed him over 2,000 career yards and converted a key third down for the Wolverines. He has rushed 396 times for 2,011 yards (5.1 avg.) and scored 13 rushing touchdowns during his career. Hart has cracked the century mark in rushing 10 times during his career including a school record four 200-yard rushing efforts. Eight of his 10 career 100-yard rushing games have come in Big Ten contests (11 games), including all four 200-yard rushing efforts.

Henne Engineering Game-Winning Drives

Sophomore quarterback **Chad Henne** (*Wyomissing, Pa./Wilson HS*) heads into the Iowa game looking to make his 20th consecutive start at signal caller for the Wolverines. Henne rallied Michigan to a 27-25 victory against Penn State, directing an eight-play scoring drive that covered 53 yards in 53 seconds. He completed the game-winning 10-yard touchdown pass to Mario Manningham as time expired for the game-winning score. Henne completed five-of-seven passes for 42 yards on the final drive and finished the fourth quarter on 11-of-17 passing for 110 yards and two touchdowns. He has directed five game-winning drives/series during his career, twice in overtime games against Michigan State the last two years, and in 2004 games vs. Minnesota and at Purdue. Henne has completed 129-of-228 passes (56.6 pct.) for 1,478 yards with 13 touchdowns and three interceptions. He has thrown for over 200 yards in five of the seven games this season, including a pair of 250-yard outputs at Wisconsin (258) and Michigan State (256).

Henne Climbs Into Top 5 in Passing TDs

With a pair of touchdown passes to Mario Manningham against the Nitanny Lions, **Chad Henne** vaulted past Todd Collins (1991-94) and into fifth place on Michigan's career passing touchdown list. Henne is fifth with 38 scores and is halfway to John Navarre's school record of 72 passing scores attained from 2000-03. Henne has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 18 of his 19 career games but had his school record streak of 17 straight games with a touchdown pass snapped against Minnesota. Henne has 13 multi-touchdown passing games, including school-record-tying four passing TD games against Michigan State and Texas in the Rose Bowl game last year.

Henne Climbing Career Passing Charts

In addition to ranking fifth in career passing TDs, **Chad Henne** lists among the top 10 in career passing at Michigan. He is sixth in career pass completions (369) and passing attempts (591) and lists ninth in passing yards (4,221). Henne has thrown for at least 200 yards in 12 of his 19 career starts, including career-best 328-yard efforts at Indiana and Ohio State

last year. He reached 3,000 and 4,000 career passing yards faster than any quarterback in Michigan history, achieving the feat in just 14 and 18 games respectively.

Manningham Makes Magic Moment

True freshman wide receiver **Mario Manningham** (*Warren, Ohio/Warren G. Harding HS*) heads into the Iowa game after producing a magical moment in Michigan history. He caught a game-winning 10-yard touchdown pass from Chad Henne as time expired to secure a 27-25 victory for the Wolverines. Manningham made all three receptions in the fourth quarter, catching a 33-yard touchdown pass from Henne to help even the score at 18-18 with 9:32 left in regulation. Manningham caught a six-yard pass on an out pattern with six seconds left in the game and made the game on a slant pass from the right side of the formation with no time remaining.

Super Mario Stepping Up

Mario Manningham has become a big-play receiver for the Wolverines, scoring on nearly one-third of his receptions. He has scored receiving touchdowns on five of his 16 receptions. Manningham is second on the team in receptions (16) and receiving yards (296) while tying Jason Avant for the team lead in receiving scores. Manningham leads the team with an 18.5-yard average per catch. He has 13 catches for 235 yards and four TDs in conference play.

Avant Charting Course to 1,000

Senior wide receiver **Jason Avant** (*Chicago, Ill./Carver HS*) is charting a course to 1,000 receiving yards as the Wolverines travel to Iowa. Avant leads the team, ranks third in the Big Ten and is among the top 25 nationally in all receiving categories. He has career highs in receptions (53) and receiving touchdowns (five) and is 110 yards shy of his career-best 772 receiving yards attained as a sophomore. Avant has 53 catches for 662 yards (12.5 avg.) and five TDs this season. He grabbed eight passes for 75 yards in the thrilling victory vs. Penn State, but was held without a receiving touchdown for the second straight game and third time this year. Avant has five or more receptions and 70 or more receiving yards in all seven games. He has scored a touchdown in four of the seven contests and has receiving TDs in seven of his past 10 games played dating back to last season.

Big Time, Big Ten Performer

Jason Avant heads into the Iowa game as the Big Ten's third-leading receiver in conference play. He has 31 receptions for 352 yards (11.4 avg.) and two touchdowns in four games. Avant is third in receptions (7.75 avg.) and is fourth in receiving yards (88.0 avg.) per contest. Avant has 96 receptions for 1,276 receiving yards and six touchdowns in 20 Big Ten games. A two-time All-Big Ten second team performer by the coaches, Avant averages 4.8 receptions and 64 yards per conference game during his career. He had 33 receptions for 390 yards and three TDs in Big Ten games last year.

Third Down Performer

A Biletnikoff Award candidate, **Jason Avant** has provided the Wolverines with a new set of downs (or touchdown) on 35 of his 53 catches this season, including 10 plays on third or fourth down. He moved the chains on 20 of his 31 catches during Big Ten action, including four of eight against Penn State. He has 40 third- or fourth-down receptions for 628 yards and three touchdowns during his career, with 36 of those catches converting third- or fourth-down opportunities.

Avant Nears 2,000 Career Receiving Yards

Jason Avant has continued to steadily climb Michigan's career receiving charts as Michigan enters the game at Iowa. He has made at least one reception in 30 consecutive games played and is the team's active career leader with 140 receptions for 1,902 yards (13.6 avg.) and 10 touchdowns. Avant is seventh in receptions and lists 12th in receiving yards. He needs 75 yards to jump into Michigan's top 10 in career receiving yards and 98 yards to become the 10th player in Michigan history to eclipse 2,000 career receiving yards.

Grady Grounding Out Yards

Freshman running back **Kevin Grady** (*Grand Rapids, Mich./East Grand Rapids HS*) enters the Iowa game providing a change of pace to complement starter Mike Hart. Grady rushed five times for 25 yards vs. Penn State, including a 14-yard run on the opening drive of the third quarter that resulted in a two-yard TD run by Hart. Grady is second on the team in rushing with 58 carries for 235 yards (4.1 avg.) and one rushing touchdown. He has only one negative carry in 58 attempts and has also contributed five receptions for 69 yards (13.8 avg.).

Ecker Third in Receiving

Senior tight end **Tyler Ecker** (*El Dorado Hills, Calif./Oak Ridge HS*) continues to be a big target for quarterback Chad Henne. Ecker is third on the team in receptions (13) and receiving yards (153) and looks to crack the end zone for the first time this season. He made three catches for 29 yards vs. Penn State, including a key 20-yard pass on third-and-10 during the third quarter, setting up Mike Hart's two-yard TD run on the following play. Ecker has 37 catches for 408 yards and two receiving scores in 32 career games.

Breaston Nearing 1,000 Receiving Yards

Senior wide receiver **Steve Breaston** (*North Braddock, Pa./Woodland Hills HS*) continues to elevate his game after missing the Michigan State game due to injury. Breaston has four receptions for 55 yards (13.8 avg.) and two rushing attempts for three yards in the past two games. He has 10 recep-

tions for 98 yards (9.8 avg.) this season, including a 10-yard grab vs. Penn State. Breaston has already surpassed 1,000 career yards in punt returns and kickoff returns, and needs 167 receiving yards to eclipse the 1,000-yard barrier. Breaston has 82 receptions for 833 yards (10.2 avg.) and six receiving touchdowns during his career. He has at least one catch in 27 of his 30 career games.

All-Purpose Breaston

The Big Ten co-Special Teams Player of the Week, **Steve Breaston** has gained over 150 all-purpose yards in the past two games. He gained 169 all-purpose yards vs. Penn State and had 231 all-purpose yards against Minnesota, including a 95-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. Breaston returned two punts for 28 yards against the Nittany Lions, including a 23-yard return that set up a 47-yard field goal by Garrett Rivas in the fourth quarter. Breaston returned four kickoffs for 128 yards, with a 39-yarder and a 41-yarder that set up both of Mario Manningham's touchdown receptions in the final stanza. Breaston's 41-yard return with 53 seconds left in regulation gave U-M possession at its 47-yard line and set the stage for the game-winning drive. He gained 113 of his 169 yards in the fourth quarter. Breaston is 10th in the Big Ten and 59th nationally in all-purpose yards (117 avg.).

Stenavich Leads Team in Career Starts

Fifth-year senior left tackle **Adam Stenavich** (*Marshfield, Wis./Marshfield HS*) enters the Iowa game looking to make his team-leading 35th career start along the offensive line. Stenavich has started all six games at left tackle this season and has started 31 of his last 32 games over the last three years. He is a returning All-Big Ten first team selection from last year.

Bass Makes Contribution

Freshman wide receiver **Antonio Bass** (*Jackson, Mich./Jackson HS*) has used his feet to make a few big plays for Michigan's offense this season. Bass has returned to his high school position, quarterback, for a few snaps and rushed six times for 55 yards (9.2 avg.). He rushed twice for 26 yards against Penn State, with both carries coming on the Wolverines second quarter drive that ended with Garrett Rivas' 35-yard field goal. Bass had a 23-yard career long run on the second play of the drive and later added a three-yard rush prior to Rivas' kick. He set up Michigan's opening score at Michigan State with a nine-yard carry that gave U-M a first-and-goal situation. Bass has been playing wideout at Michigan and continues to seek his first career reception.

Harris Hounding Opponents

Senior inside linebacker **David Harris** (*Grand Rapids, Mich./Ottawa Hills HS*) heads into the Iowa game after collecting back-to-back double digit tackle games for the first time in his career. Harris tallied a career-best 18 stops vs. Minnesota and followed up with a shared team-high 10 stops vs. Penn State. He also forced one fumble and tallied a tackle for loss against the Nittany Lions. Harris is second on the team with a career-best 54 tackles, including five tackles for loss, three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Harris has registered at least one TFL in each of the four conference games and his five TFLs are second only to LaMarr Woodley's team- and Big Ten-leading 14 this season.

Harris Among Big Ten and National Leaders

With a career-best 54 tackles in six games, **David Harris** lists among the conference and national leader in tackles this season. He is sixth in the Big Ten and tied for 48th nationally with an average of nine tackles per contest. In addition, Harris ranks fifth nationally in solo stops (7.17 avg.).

Mason Leads Team in Stops

Fifth-year senior cornerback **Grant Mason** (*Pontiac, Mich./Orchard Lake St. Mary's HS*) leads the Wolverines in tackles this season, posting a career-best 57 stops, two tackles for loss, one interception and five pass breakups. Mason tied David Harris for the team lead with 10 tackles vs. Penn State. He has contributed six or more stops in six of the seven games this season, including a career-best 16-tackle effort against Notre Dame. Mason is tied for 10th in the league in tackles per contest (8.1 avg.) and is tied for 90th nationally. He lists tied for 27th nationally in stops per game (6.14 avg.).

Woodley Creating Havoc Behind Line of Scrimmage

Junior rush linebacker **LaMarr Woodley** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) enters the Iowa game among the Big Ten and national leaders in tackles for loss and sacks this season. Woodley leads the Big Ten and lists 16th nationally in TFLs with 14 this season. He is fifth in the conference and ranks tied for 86th nationally with a career-best five sacks. Woodley has tallied at least one tackle for loss in all seven games this year and has stops behind the line of scrimmage in his last 12 games dating back to last year. He is fourth on the team with 41 tackles this season, while contributing two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Woodley made eight tackles, a career-high-tying four TFLs and one sack vs. Penn State. He has played in 32 career games and made 19 starts, contributing 134 stops, 34 TFLs, 10 sacks, one fumble recovery and four PBUs. Woodley looks to make his 20th career start in Michigan's defense and his 12th consecutive contest.

Burgess Nears 50 Stops

Junior outside linebacker **Prescott Burgess** (*Warren, Ohio/Warren G. Harding HS*) needs five stops against the Hawkeyes to reach 50 tackles on the season. He is third on the team with a career-best 45 tackles this season, including two tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and two pass breakups. Burgess matched his season high with eight tackles vs. Penn State, while contributing one forced fumble and one PBU against the Nittany Lions. Burgess has four or more stops in every game this season and has tallied six or more stops in all four league games. He has played in 30 career games, tallying 87 tackles, two TFLs, one interception, two fumble recoveries and four PBUs.

Adams Steps Up in Secondary

Sophomore safety **Jamar Adams** (*Charlotte, N.C./Butler HS*) heads into the Iowa game after registering a career high in tackles. Adams started at safety and recorded a career-best eight tackles vs. Penn State. He also thwarted a potential Nittany Lions touchdown with a diving pass breakup that forced a third quarter field goal. Adams has played in all seven games and started three contests, tallying a career-high 14 stops and one PBU. He has 20 tackles and one pass breakup in 16 career games.

Hall Collecting Pass Breakups, Interceptions

Junior cornerback **Leon Hall** (*Vista, Calif./Vista HS*) enters the Iowa game leading the team in pass breakups and tied for top honors in interceptions. Hall has six pass breakups and two interceptions this season to go along with 34 tackles, two tackles for loss and two sacks. He made seven stops and collected an interception against Penn State after making a career-high eight tackles a week earlier vs. Minnesota. Hall has started all seven games at cornerback this season and has made 19 starts in Michigan's secondary during his career, contributing 108 tackles, three TFLs, three sacks, six interceptions, two fumble recoveries and 22 PBUs in 32 career games of action. His 22 pass breakups rank 10th all-time on Michigan's career list, three better than current New York Jets cornerback Ty Law (1992-94).

Watson Continues to Elevate Game

Senior nose tackle **Gabe Watson** (*Novi, Mich./Southfield HS*) continues to elevate his game every week as the Wolverines head into the second half of the conference season. Watson looks to make his 15th career start when Michigan travels to Iowa on Saturday. He contributed three stops in the last-second victory against Penn State after recording a season-best seven stops, one TFL and one sack vs. Minnesota. He is second among among defensive lineman with 24 stops this season, trailing the 41 stops accumulated by LaMarr Woodley. Watson has also tallied a TFL in three of the past four games. He has played in 40 career games and made 14 starts, contributing 76 tackles, 11 TFLs and three sacks.

Breaston Chasing Big Ten Punt Return Mark

With two punt returns for 28 yards against the Nittany Lions, **Steve Breaston** has moved into sixth place on the career punt return yardage list in the Big Ten annals. Breaston needs 12 yards to pass Northwestern's Brian Musso (1994-97) for fifth place, 25 yards to climb past Michigan State's Gari Scott (1996-99) for the fourth spot and 39 yards to move ahead of Iowa's Tim Dwight (1994-97) for third place on the conference chart.

Breaston needs 284 yards to eclipse Wisconsin's Jim Leonhard for the Big Ten career punt return yardage record.

He is sixth in the league in kick scoring at 6.6 points per game this year.

Michigan Leads League in Pass Defense

The Wolverines lead the Big Ten Conference in pass defense and pass efficiency defense heading into the Iowa game. U-M has allowed the opposition 181 passing yards per contest and has a pass efficiency defensive rating of 109, both tops among conference schools and lists 18th and 24th in the nation, respectively. Michigan has held four of its seven opponents to less than 150 passing yards and yielded touchdown passes in just three of the seven games thus far (2 vs. Notre Dame and 1 apiece by Michigan State and Minnesota).

Scoring First under Carr

The Wolverines have compiled a 64-13 record when scoring first during Lloyd Carr's 11 seasons at the helm. U-M is 41-2 (.953) in Michigan Stadium 23-11 (67.6) on the road when scoring first under Carr.

Carr on the Road in the Big Ten

Lloyd Carr has a 29-13 conference mark on the road in Big Ten play. He posted a 3-1 record last season, defeating Indiana, Illinois and Purdue before having his 13-game conference winning streak snapped at Ohio State. Carr's teams have claimed 3-1 road records in the Big Ten each of the past four seasons and won 15 of 22 road games in the 2000s. The Wolverines have a 1-1 record this season.

Carr in Elite Company

By winning the 2004 Big Ten title, Lloyd Carr became the eighth coach in conference history to claim five or more Big Ten championships during his head coaching career. He joined Michigan coaches Fielding H. Yost and Bo Schembechler among the elite list of conference coaches to claim at least five titles. Carr is the active career leader in Big Ten wins, boasting a 64-19 record in conference play, and his teams have not finished below third in the league in the past eight years.

100th Season of Big Ten Action

Michigan is in its 100th season of competition in the Big Ten Conference. The Wolverines have compiled an impressive 446-162-18 record in conference play during those 100 seasons and have claimed a league-leading 42 championships. U-M also leads the conference with 371 first-team All-Big Ten selections.

Wolverines Seek Third Consecutive Big Ten Title

The Michigan Wolverines are looking to capture their third straight Big Ten championship. The Wolverines have a long history of winning consecutive crowns. In fact, they have created streaks of conference championships 10 times. That includes four streaks of two titles in a row (including back-to-back titles in 2003-04), one streak of three titles in a row, four streaks of four titles in a row, and from 1988-92 Michigan won an incredible five Big Ten Conference championships in a row.

U-M in October

Michigan has compiled an impressive 394-113-13 (.770) all-time record in October. The Wolverines have a 31-8 mark in the 10th month of the year under head coach **Lloyd Carr** and have won 17 of their last 21 contests in October. U-M is 2-1 this season.

Michigan Seeks 50th Win in 21st Century

The Wolverines boast one of the nation's best records since the start of the 21st Century, posting a 49-18 record (.731). U-M ranks tied for 14th among Division I-A schools in winning percentage from 2000-05 and is tied for 16th in victories. In that time span, U-M has two 10-win seasons and has victories in two bowl games: 2001 Citrus and 2003 Outback bowls. The Wolverines have finished in the top 10 of the national poll twice during that five-year stretch and have ranked among the top 20 each season.

Last Meeting in Iowa City: (#23 Iowa 30, #9 Michigan 27, Kimmick Stadium, Oct. 4, 2003) The Wolverines scored on four consecutive first-half possessions to take a 20-10 lead, but the Hawkeyes defense kept Michigan without any points for nine straight series. As it had done two weeks earlier, U-M came up just short in its attempt to pull out a victory in the game's final minutes. With the score 30-20 in favor of Iowa, fifth-year senior quarterback John Navarre completed a 41-yard slant pass to junior receiver Braylon Edwards for a touchdown. After a defensive stop, the Wolverines were able to get to the 49-yard line with 1:07 left, but U-M fell short on a fourth-and-12 play. Navarre was 26 of 49 passing for a school-record 389 yards and two touchdowns. Edwards caught seven passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns, and sophomore Jason Avant grabbed seven receptions for 175 yards. Senior Chris Perry contributed 87 yards and a touchdown on 24 carries. Freshman Garrett Rivas kicked field goals of 47 and 26 yards. Henne looks to make his 20th consecutive start when the Wolverines travel to Iowa.
