Radio Coverage: The Michigan Sports Network is comprised of 29 stations. Frank Beckmann (play-by-play), Jim Brandstatter (analyst) and Steve Courtney (sideline reports) will originate the game on NewsTalk 760 WJR-AM in Detroit.

TV Coverage: ESPN will broadcast the game to a national audience. Ron Franklin (play-by-play), Bob Davie (color commentary) and Holly Rowe (sideline reports and analysis) will call the game.

Internet: Michigan (MGoBlue.com), Northwestern (NUsports.com)

Series History: This will be the 66th meeting between Michigan and Northwestern. The Wolverines have a 49-14-2 advantage in the all-time series and are 16-7 against the Wildcats at Ryan Field (17-8 mark at Northwestern). U-M has won seven of the last 10 games in the series.

Last Meeting: (#9 Michigan 42, Northwestern 20 -- Michigan Stadium, Nov. 13, 2004) The Wolverines put the final touches on its perfect 6-0 home record for the 2004 season (9-1 overall, 7-0 Big Ten) with a 42-20 victory over Northwestern. Michigan scored 35 second half points, including 28 unanswered points.

With Michigan State's 49-14 upset of previously unbeaten and fourth-ranked Wisconsin later in the day, the Wolverines sat alone atop the Big Ten standings and were assured of at least a share of the Big Ten championship, the 42nd in the program's history and fifth in the last eight seasons under coach Lloyd Carr.

Freshman Michael Hart had a career high three touchdown scores on 151 yards rushing, and Steve Breaston had five catches for 49 yards and one touchdown while also returning a punt for a touchdown.

Chad Henne completed 19 of his 26 pass attempts for 187 yards and two touchdowns with no interceptions. Braylon Edwards contributed seven catches for 54 yards to become the ninth player in NCAA history -- and first in the Big Ten -- to amass 1,000 receiving yards (1,049) in three consecutive seasons.

After a 7-6 U-M halftime lead, the scoring picked up with a four-yard touchdown run by Hart. The Wildcats responded with a touchdown run that brought the score to 14-13. Michigan countered with four straight touchdowns, highlighted by the two Breaston scores. Jason Avant also added a 14-yard touchdown catch to go along with Hart's second scoring run of the day.

Did You Know?

Michigan's 2005 schedule is ranked as the second toughest in all of college football, trailing only Oklahoma. The Wolverines' cumulative opposition has a .686 winning percentage while the Sooners' opponents boast a .708 winning clip this season. U-M's opponents have a 48-22 mark while OU's has compiled a 46-19 record.

Lloyd Carr has a 5-3 record in his 11th year as Michigan's head coach and his 26th overall season with the Wolverine program. The fifth-winningest active Division I-A coach with a .758 winning percentage, Carr has a 100-32 career record and a 66-19 Big Ten Conference mark. Carr became the third coach in Michigan history and the 11th in Big Ten history to amass 100 victories at his institution with the Wolverines' 23-20 overtime victory at Iowa (Oct. 22). He has guided the program to five Big Ten titles in the last eight years (1997-98-2000-03-04) and has led the Wolverines to nine consecutive Jan. 1 bowl games. Carr was named the 1997 national coach of the year after guiding the program to a perfect 12-0 record and the *Associated Press* national championship. Carr led the Wolverines to back-to-back Big Ten Conference titles (1997-98), a share of the 2000 championship and back-to-back conference crowns in 2003 and 2004. His teams have finished in the top 20 nationally each of his first 10 years. Carr, previously a Michigan assistant coach for 15 years, began his college coaching career as a defensive backs coach at Eastern Michigan (1976-77) before joining Gary Moeller's staff at Illinois in the same role (1978-79). Carr came to Michigan in 1980 as Bo Schembechler's secondary coach. Carr served as defensive coordinator (1987-94) and was elevated to assistant head coach for five seasons under Moeller (1990-94).

U-M Ranked 25th in AP Poll; Faces Top 25 Foe in Northwestern

The University of Michigan football team returned to the top 25 of the Associated Press poll following its 23-20 overtime victory at Iowa (Oct. 22). The Wolverines are ranked No. 25 in the AP poll but are not listed in the top 25 of the USA Today Coaches poll this week (Oct. 23).

U-M received 134 votes in the Associated Press poll and collected 59 votes in the USA Today Coaches poll this week (Oct. 23). The Wolverines would list No. 27 in the coaches rankings. Northwestern is ranked 21st in the AP poll and No. 23 in the coaching poll.

The Wolverines returned to the AP poll for the first time since the Oct. 2 listing, when U-M was 21st according to the AP and 24th by the coaches. Michigan was not ranked in the Sept. 25 national polls for the first time since Oct. 18, 1998, a streak that was snapped at 114 consecutive weeks ranked in the AP poll.

Associated Press Poll Notes:

- Michigan has the most weekly appearances in the AP poll, appearing 717 times (including preseason poll).
- Since the preseason 1988 poll, U-M has been listed in every poll except three in 1993, four in 1998 and three in 2005.
- Michigan has been listed in the top 10 of the polls 62 times during Carr's tenure.
- The Wolverines have been ranked in the top 25 for all but seven of Lloyd Carr's 132 career games (four in 1998 and three in 2005).
- U-M ranks No. 1 all-time in composite AP final football polls (1936-2004).
- The Wolverines have finished in the top 10 of the AP poll 36 times since its inception in 1936.
- Michigan has finished in the final top 25 rankings 53 times since the inception of the AP poll in 1936.
- U-M has finished in the top 25 rankings each of the past 20 seasons and 35 of the past 36 years (was not ranked in 1984 and did not receive a final AP ranking in 1982).

U-M vs. NW Game Notes

U-M Seeks 50th Win vs. Northwestern

The Wolverines enter Evanston looking to capture their 50th victory in 66 all-time games against Northwestern. Michigan holds a 49-14-2 lead in the all-time series, including a 7-3 edge in the last 10 meetings. The Wolverines are 16-7 at Ryan Field and have a 17-8 all-time record in games played at Northwestern. U-M is 2-2 against the Wildcats at Ryan Field under Lloyd Carr, losing in 1996 and 2000, with victories coming in 1998 and 2003. Michigan had an 18-game winning streak from 1966-92, but Northwestern has fared a little better during the Carr era. In the eight meetings under Carr, the Wolverines hold a 5-3 advantage.

Wolverines from Illinois

Seven members of the 2005 Michigan football team hail from the state of Illinois, with three of those individuals listed on the depth chart. Senior wide receiver and co-captain **Jason Avant** (*Chicago, Ill./Carver HS*) is a three-year starter at wide receiver, senior **Mike Kolodziej** (*Joliet, Ill./Joliet Catholic Academy*) is a backup at both offensive tackle positions and sophomore **Tim Jamison** (*Riverdale, Ill./Harvey Thornton HS*) has been a contributor at both rush linebacker and defensive end this season. The four other Wolverines from Illinois are: freshman offensive lineman **Tim McAvoy** (*Bloomington, Ill./Bloomington HS*), freshman offensive lineman **David Moosman** (*Libertyville, Ill./Libertyville HS*), sophomore fullback **Eric Van Beek** (*Edwardsville, Ill./Edwardsville HS*) and sophomore defensive lineman **Marques Walton** (*Chicago, Ill./Hubbard HS*).

Carr-Diac Kids: U-M Games Decided at the Wire

All five of Michigan's conference games have gone down to the wire this season, with the Wolverines claiming victory in three of those five contests. All three of U-M's wins came on the last play of the game as Garrett Rivas converted a game-ending 35-yard field goal in the first overtime session at Michigan State, Mario Manningham caught a 10-yard touchdown pass from Chad Henne with no time remaining in regulation against Penn State and Jerome Jackson scored on a one-yard run in the first overtime session at Iowa. Henne Comes Through in the Clutch

Sophomore quarterback **Chad Henne** (*Wyomissing, Pa./Wilson HS*) has a flair for the dramatics, guiding the Wolverines to comeback victories in three of the last four games. Henne directed fourth quarter rallies and overtime wins in road games at Michigan State and Iowa and rifled the game-winning touchdown pass to Mario Manningham as time expired vs. Penn State. Henne completed 14-of-21 passes for 207 yards and two touchdowns against the Hawkeyes, including three-of-four passes for 68 yards and the go-ahead score on a 52-yard play to Steve Breaston. Henne has directed six game-winning drives/series during his career, all in Big Ten play, with three coming in overtime games. He has completed 143-of-249 passes (57.4 pct.) for 1,685 yards with 15 touchdowns and four interceptions this season. Henne has thrown for over 200 yards in six of the eight games this season, including a pair of 250-yard outputs at Wisconsin (258) and Michigan State (256).

Henne Climbs Into Top 5 in Passing TDs

With a pair of touchdown passes at Iowa, **Chad Henne** reached 40 career passing touchdowns and currently sits in fifth place on Michigan's career touchdown passes list. Henne is fifth with 40 passing scores and is 33 TDs from breaking John Navarre's school record of 72 passing scores attained from 2000-03. Henne has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 19 of his 20 career games. His school record streak of 17 straight games with a touchdown pass was snapped earlier this season against Minnesota. Henne has 14 multi-touchdown passing games, including school-record-tying four passing TD games against Michigan State (2004) and Texas in the 2005 Rose Bowl game.

Henne Climbing Career Passing Charts

Chad Henne heads into the Northwestern game ranked among the top seven in career passing at Michigan. In addition to ranking fifth in career passing TDs, Henne is tied for fifth in career pass attempts (648), sixth in career pass completions (383) and lists seventh in passing yards (4,428). Henne has thrown for at least 200 yards in 13 of his 20 career starts, including career-best 328-yard efforts at Indiana and Ohio State last year. He reached 3,000 and 4,000 career passing yards faster than any quarterback in Michigan history, achieving the feat in just 14 and 18 games respectively. Henne averages a school record 221.4 passing yards per contest.

Hart Among National Leaders

Sophomore tailback **Mike Hart** (*Syracuse, N.Y./Onondaga Central HS*) ranks among the top rushers nationally despite missing two full games and three quarters of two additional games because of injury. Hart is sixth in the Big Ten and 31st nationally in rushing yards per contest, averaging 95.9 yards over six games. He leads the team in rushing with 122 carries for 573 yards (4.7 avg.) and four rushing touchdowns. Hart rushed five times for 17 yards and added a nine-yard reception before leaving the Iowa game in the first quarter due to injury. A Doak Walker Award candidate, he has cracked the 100-yard barrier in all four games that he has completed (six total games played). Hart has also been a major contributor in the passing game, listing tied for fourth on the team with 12 receptions for 108 yards (9.0 avg.) and one score. Hart has scored at least one touchdown in every game that he has completed this season. He caught a receiving TD against Northern Illinois and scored rushing TDs against Northern Illinois, Michigan State, Minnesota and Penn State.

Hart Protecting the Pigskin

Mike Hart heads into the Northwestern game with 386 consecutive offensive touches without a fumble. Hart has 134 touches this season, 122 carries and 12 receptions without a miscue, after carrying the ball 230 times and adding 22 receptions in eight-plus games last year following his only career fumble. The only time Hart fumbled the ball in his career was on a running play near the Iowa end zone during the fourth quarter of the Big Ten opener (Sept. 25, 2004).

Hart Leads Nation in All-Purpose Attempts, Second in Carries

Mike Hart is the nation's active career leader in all-purpose plays per game (24.6 avg.) and lists second in rushing attempts with 22.4 per contest. He trails Oklahoma's Adrian Peterson (22.7 avg.) in carries per game and lists fifth in rushing yard per game (112.7 avg.). Hart is 10th in all-purpose yards with an average of 131.8 yards per contest.

Hart Dominating Big Ten Play

Mike Hart has been a productive back in Big Ten play during his short career, cracking the century mark in rushing during eight of his 12 career games. Hart has rushed 317 times for 1,666 yards (5.3 avg.) in conference play during his career for an average of 139 yards per contest. He has carried the ball 89 times for 452 yards (5.1 avg.) and scored three touchdowns in four games this season. Hart is fifth in conference play in rushing at 115 yards per contest. The 2004 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and first-team all-conference selection, Hart led the conference in rushing attempts (228) and yards (1,214) during Big Ten action last year. He has four 200-yard rushing efforts in those 12 career conference games.

Hart Surpasses 2,000 Career Yards

Mike Hart heads into the Northwestern game in 20th place on Michigan's career rushing list with 2,028 yards. He has rushed 404 times for 2,028 yards (5.0 avg.) and scored 13 rushing touchdowns during his career. Hart has cracked the century mark in rushing 10 times during his career including a school record four 200-yard rushing efforts. Eight of his 10 career 100-yard rushing games have come in Big Ten contests, including all four 200-yard rushing efforts. Hart needs 107 rushing yards to move ahead of 1940 Heisman Trophy winner Tom Harmon (1938-40) for 19th on Michigan's career rushing list.

Jackson Provides Spark

Junior tailback **Jerome Jackson** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) provided the Wolverines with an offensive spark in the fourth quarter and overtime at Iowa, and was rewarded for his stellar play with the one-yard game-winning touchdown run in overtime. Jackson set season highs with 11 carries for 44 yards against the Hawkeyes, all coming in the final stanza and overtime. He opened the Wolverines go-ahead touchdown drive in the fourth quarter with a 19-yard run and gained one-yard on the very next play. Jackson rushed five times for 17 yards on U-M's final series of regulation. In the extra session, he carried the ball four times for seven yards, including the one-yard winner on third-and-goal.

Breaston Nears 1,000 Career Receiving Yards

Senior wide receiver **Steve Breaston** (*North Braddock, Pa./Woodland Hills HS*) is within striking distance of the third of his elusive 1,000 career categories heading into Northwestern. Breaston has 84 receptions for 895 yards (10.7 avg.) and seven touchdowns during his career. He has at least one reception in 28 of his 31 career games. Breaston needs 105 receiving yards to join Wisconsin's Nick Davis as the only player in Big Ten history to gain 1,000 career yards in three different categories.

Breaston Fourth in Receiving

Steve Breaston heads into the Northwestern game fourth on the team in receptions and receiving yards this season. Breaston has 12 catches for 160 yards (13.3 avg.) and one TD. He caught two passes for 62 yards at Iowa, and showed his big-play capability as he turned a short pass in the left flat from Henne into a 52-yard touchdown by following the block of Carl Tabb and outracing the defense down the left sideline. He was named the ABC Player of the Game for his performance against the Hawkeyes. He has at least one reception in every game played this season and has also rushed five times for 44 yards (8.8 avg.).

Avant Catching 1,000

Senior wide receiver **Jason Avant** (*Chicago, Ill./Carver HS*) is charting a course to 1,000 receiving yards as the Wolverines travel to Northwestern. Avant leads the team, ranks third in the Big Ten and is among the top 25 nationally in all receiving categories. He has career highs in receptions and receiving touchdowns and is five yards shy of his career-best 772 receiving yards attained as a sophomore. Avant has 60 catches for 767 yards (12.8 avg.) and six TDs this season. He made a team-leading seven receptions for 105 yards and one touchdown at Iowa, including an 18-yard reception in overtime that set the stage for Jerome Jackson's game-winning TD run. Avant has five or more receptions and 70 or more receiving yards in all eight games this season, including three 100-yard receiving efforts. He has scored a touchdown in five of the eight contests and has receiving TDs in eight of his past 11 games played dating back to last season.

Avant Three Catches Shy of 150

Jason Avant heads into the Northwestern game three receptions shy of 150 in his career. Avant has 147 receptions for 2,007 career yards and has scored 11 receiving touchdowns. He became the 10th player in school history to surpass 2,000 career receiving yards with his 18-yard reception in overtime at Iowa. Avant is fifth in career receptions, 10th in receiving yards and is tied for 14th in receiving touchdowns. He has four career 100-yard receiving games, two on the road at Iowa (2003, 2005) and at Wisconsin and against Northern Illinois this season. He has made at least one reception in 31 consecutive games played.

Avant Climbing Season Charts

Jason Avant is making his senior season the best and most consistent of his career. A Biletnikoff Award candidate, he has a team-leading 60 receptions for 767 receiving yards (12.8 avg.) this season and has scored a career-best six receiving touchdowns. He has already set career highs in catches and receiving TDs this season and needs six receiving yards to surpass his previous career-best set during the 2003 season. His 60 catches this season rank 11th all-time on Michigan's season reception list and he needs 52 receiving yards to jump into the top 15 on the school's season receiving yardage rankings. He has surpassed the 100-yard barrier three times this year, including a 105-yard effort on seven receptions at Iowa. Avant has hauled in at least six receptions and 70 or more receiving yards in every game this season.

Big Time, Big Ten Performer

Jason Avant heads into the Northwestern game as the Big Ten's fourth-leading receiver in conference play. He has 38 receptions for 457 yards (12.0 avg.) and three touchdowns in five games. Avant is fourth in receptions (7.6 avg.) and receiving yards (91.4 avg.) per contest. Avant has 103 receptions for 1,381 receiving yards and seven touchdowns in 21 Big Ten games. A two-time All-Big Ten second team performer by the coaches, Avant averages five receptions and 66 yards per conference game in his career. He has already surpassed his 2004 Big Ten statistics of 33 receptions for 390 yards and three TDs, with three conference games remaining.

Third Down Performer

A Biletnikoff Award candidate, **Jason Avant** has provided the Wolverines with a new set of downs (or touchdown) on 42 of his 60 catches this season, including 11 plays on third or fourth down. He moved the chains on 27 of his 38 catches during Big Ten action, including all seven receptions at Iowa. He has 41 third- or fourth-down receptions for 646 yards and three touchdowns during his career, with 37 of those catches converting third- or fourth-down opportunities.

Manningham Second in Receiving

True freshman wide receiver **Mario Manningham** (*Warren, Ohio/Warren G. Harding HS*) enters the Northwestern game as an integral part of the Wolverines passing game, listing second on the team in receptions, receiving yards and touchdown receptions. Manningham has 17 catches for 311 yards (18.3 avg.) and five receiving scores. He leads the team with an 18.3-yard average per catch. Manningham has caught at least one reception in seven straight games, including a 15-yard catch at Iowa. He caught three passes for 49 yards vs. Penn State, including a 33-yard TD pass and the game-winning 10-yard TD reception as time expired. Manningham is averaging a touchdown reception every 3.4 receptions. He has 14 catches for 250 yards and four TDs in conference play.

Grady Providing Positive Yards

Freshman tailback **Kevin Grady** (*Grand Rapids, Mich./Grand Rapids East HS*) continues to provide the Wolverine offense with positive yards as the second-leading rusher on the team. Grady has carried the ball 76 times for 297 yards (3.9 avg.) and scored one touchdown. He led the team in rushing at Iowa, rushing 18 times for 62 yards, and had one reception in the contest. Grady set his career high with 79 yards on 18 attempts against Notre Dame earlier this year. In addition to his rushing prowess, Grady has six receptions for 67 yards (11.2 avg.) this season.

Ecker Third in Receptions and Yards

Senior tight end **Tyler Ecker** (*El Dorado Hills, Calif./Oak Ridge HS*) has been a big target for Chad Henne this season, listing third on the team in both receptions and receiving yards. He has 15 catches for a career-best 171 yards (11.4 avg.) and continues to seek his first receiving touchdown of the campaign. Ecker made two receptions for 18 yards at Iowa, including a key 13-yard catch on a fourth-and-three play that led to Garrett Rivas' 26-yard field goal in the third quarter. He needs three receptions to surpass his career-high 17 catches attained last season. Ecker has played in 33 career games and made five starts, collecting 39 receptions for 426 yards and two touchdowns.

Tabb Sets Career High

Senior wide receiver **Carl Tabb** (*Ann Arbor, Mich./Huron HS*) heads into the Northwestern game after setting a career high in receptions. Tabb has grabbed a career-best 11 catches for 93 yards (8.5 avg.) this season and seeks his first career touchdown. He made a 13-yard reception at Iowa and has collected at least one catch in four straight games and in six of the eight contests. Tabb caught a career-high five passes for 35 yards at Michigan State earlier this season. He has played in 33 career games and made one start at wide receiving, collecting 21 catches for 196 yards.

Long Awaited Return

Junior right tackle **Jake Long** (*Lapeer, Mich./Lapeer East HS*) enters the Northwestern game after making his season debut at Iowa. A 2004 Freshman All-American last year, Long was injured during fall camp and missed every game prior to the Iowa game. He made his season debut at the outset of Michigan's second quarter touchdown drive against the Hawkeyes, and played nearly every single play during the second half and overtime. Long has played in 13 career games and made starts at right tackle in the final 10 games of the 2004 season.

Mason Leads Team in Stops

Fifth-year senior cornerback **Grant Mason** (*Pontiac, Mich./Orchard Lake St. Mary's HS*) leads the Wolverines in tackles this season with a career-best 69 stops in eight games. He led the defense with 12 tackles at Iowa, his second straight double digit tackle game and his third of the season. Mason tallied 10 stops against Penn State and set his career high with 16 stops and one PBU vs. Notre Dame. In addition to his 69 stops, Mason has contributed two tackles for loss, one interception and five pass breakups. He has tallied six or more stops in seven of the eight games this season. Mason is tied for ninth in the Big Ten in tackles per contest (8.6 avg.) and is tied for 61st nationally. He is 16th in the nation in solo stops per game (6.5 avg.).

Harris Collecting Stops

Senior inside linebacker **David Harris** (*Grand Rapids, Mich./Ottawa Hills HS*) has been a tackling machine for the Wolverines in his seven games played this season, averaging 8.9 stops per contest. Harris is second on the team with a career-best 62 tackles this season, including five tackles for loss, three pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. He made eight stops at Iowa after collecting 10 stops against Penn State and 18 tackles vs. Minnesota. Harris has six or more tackles in five straight games and in six of his seven contests this season. He has played in 16 career games and started eight contests, tallying 74 stops, five TFLs, one fumble recovery and three PBUs.

Harris Among Big Ten and National Leaders

With a career-best 62 stops in seven games, **David Harris** lists among the conference and national leaders in tackles this season. He is seventh in the Big Ten and tied for 53rd nationally with an average of 8.86 tackles per contest. Harris is 10th nationally in solo stops per contest (6.71 avg.). In conference play, Harris is sixth among players with an average of 10.2 tackles per contest.

Burgess Burying Opposition

Junior outside linebacker **Prescott Burgess** (*Warren, Ohio/Warren G. Harding HS*) heads into the Northwestern game third on the team in tackles this season. Burgess has contributed a career-best 56 tackles this season, in addition to three tackles for loss, one sack, two forced fumbles and two pass breakups. He tallied a career-best 11 tackles and one sack at Iowa, his first career double digit tackle game of his career. Burgess has been one of the most consistent defenders for the Wolverines, tallying six or more stops in all five Big Ten games. He has 39 tackles in five conference games. Burgess needs two stops for 100 in his career. He has played in 31 career contests and started eight contests, tallying 98 tackles, two TFLs, one interception, two fumble recoveries and four PBUs.

Harrison Continues to Step Up

True freshman safety **Brandon Harrison** (*Dayton, Ohio/Chaminade-Julienne HS*) has stepped up at safety with the injuries to regular starters Brandt Englemon and Willis Barringer. Harrison doubled his tackle output at Iowa, recording a career-best eight tackles and his first career interception. He set up Michigan's third quarter field goal by intercepting Iowa's Drew Tate and returning the pick 11 yards to the Hawkeyes' 42-yard line. Harrison has contributed all of his defensive statistics in the past five games and enters the Northwestern game with 16 stops, one interception, two pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

Watson Manning the Middle

Senior nose tackle **Gabe Watson** (*Novi, Mich./Southfield HS*) has been clogging the middle of the Wolverine defense in the past few weeks, tallying at least two stops in every game this season. Watson has contributed 22 of his 30 tackles in conference play, including six tackles and a career-best two sacks at Iowa. He registered his season high with seven stops and one sack vs. Minnesota. Watson has contributed 30 tackles, five tackles for loss and three sacks this year. He needs eight stops to surpass his season-best 37 stops from last year. Watson has played in 41 career games and made 15 starts along the defensive line. He has posted 82 tackles, 13 TFLs and five sacks during his career.

Adams Accumulating Stops

Sophomore safety **Jamar Adams** (*Charlotte, N.C./David W. Butler HS*) enters the Northwestern game after starting the past three games in the secondary for the Wolverines. Adams tallied seven tackles and one tackle for loss at Iowa after setting his career high with eight stops and one pass breakup against Penn State. He has 21 tackles, one tackle for loss and two pass breakups this season, including 18 stops and one PBU in Big Ten play. Adams has played in 17 straight games for the Wolverines, tallying 27 tackles, one TFL and one pass breakup.

Woods Walloping Opponents

Fifth-year senior rush linebacker **Pierre Woods** (*Cleveland, Ohio/Glenville HS*) has amassed 60 percent of stops this season in the opposition's back-field. Woods has registered 10 stops, six of which are tackles for loss, including two sacks. He has also forced one fumble and collected one pass breakup. Woods started the Iowa game for an injured LaMarr Woodley and turned his best performance of the year, tallying a season-best four stops, two TFLs, one sack and one PBU. His pass defended came on the first play of overtime as he swatted down Iowa quarterback Drew Tate's attempted screen pass in the right flat. Woods also forced Tate into an intentional grounding penalty that stopped a potential drive. Woods has played in a team-leading 46 career games and made 18 starts, registering 107 stops, 22 TFLs, nine sacks, two fumble recoveries and two PBUs.

Woodley Leads League in Tackles for Loss

Junior rush linebacker **LaMarr Woodley** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) leads the Big Ten Conference and lists 16th nationally in tackles for loss this season. He leads the Wolverines in stops behind the line of scrimmage (14) and sacks (five) while ranking fourth on the team in tackles with 41 stops. Woodley lists sixth in the conference with a career-best five sacks. In addition, he has contributed two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Woodley has more than doubled the TFLs of the second closest player on the team, Pierre Woods with six TFLs, and has tallied at least one stop behind the line of scrimmage in all but one game this season. Woodley had

his seven-game streak this season and 12-game overall streak with at least one TFL snapped at Iowa, as he saw action in only two plays, a pair of second half third down plays by the Hawkeyes. He has played in 33 career games and made 19 starts, contributing 134 stops, 34 TFLs, 10 sacks, one fumble recovery and four PBUs. Woodley looks to make his 20th career start in Michigan's defense at Northwestern.

Hall Fifth in Stops

Junior cornerback **Leon Hall** (*Vista, Calif./Vista HS*) enters the Northwestern game fifth on the team in tackles this season. The second part of Michigan's hard-hitting cornerback duo, Hall has 40 stops this season, including a pair of sacks, and is eight tackles from equaling his career-best 48 stops attained last year. Hall leads the team with seven pass breakups and is tied for team-high honors with two interceptions. He made six solo stops and one PBU at Iowa and has contributed six or more tackles in four of the five conference games. Hall had seven stops and an interception against Penn State after registering a career-high eight tackles vs. Minnesota. Hall has started all eight games at cornerback this season and has made 20 starts in Michigan's secondary during his career, contributing 114 tackles, three TFLs, three sacks, six interceptions, two fumble recoveries and 23 PBUs in 33 career games of action.

Hall Climbing Career PBU List

With one pass breakup at Iowa, **Leon Hall** collected his team-leading seventh pass defended on the year. He lists tied for seventh in the Big Ten in pass breakups per game (0.88 avg.) and is tied for 97th nationally. Hall needs three PBUs to reach double digits in breakups for the second straight season, joining Marion Body (1979-82) and Todd Howard (1998-2001) as the only Wolverines to collect 10 or more PBUs in a season twice during their career. Howard accomplished the feat a record three times and holds the Michigan career PBU record with 41. Hall lists tied for ninth all-time at Michigan with 23 career passes defended, seven of which are interceptions. He needs four breakups to reach the top five in school history and 19 to eclipse Howard for the school record.

Massey Nears 100 Career Tackles

Fifth-year senior defensive tackle and co-captain **Pat Massey** (*Brecksville, Ohio/St. Ignatius HS*) enters the Northwestern game closing in on 100 stops in his career. Massey needs 12 tackles to eclipse the 100-tackle plateau. He has contributed 88 tackles during his career, including 17 tackles for loss and 10 sacks. Massey tallied four stops at Iowa. He set his career high with seven stops vs. Minnesota earlier this month. He is third among defensive linemen with 23 tackles this season. Massey has also contributed one TFL, one sack, one forced fumble and one pass breakup. He has played in 44 career games and leads the defense with 28 career starts along the defensive line.

Thompson Tattoos Ball Carriers

Sophomore inside linebacker **John Thompson** (*Detroit, Mich./Crockett HS*) has continued to make a contribution both defensively and on special teams as the season progresses. Thompson played the majority of the game at linebacker against Iowa, registering a career-best eight tackles and a team-leading three tackles for loss in the contest. He contributed five of his eight stops on one Iowa series, including three solo stops and one TFL. Thompson has tallied 17 tackles, three TFLs, one pass breakup and one blocked field goal attempt in his first season of action.

Rivas Leads Team in Scoring

A Lou Groza Award candidate, junior placekicker **Garrett Rivas** (*Tampa, Fla./Jesuit HS*) is pacing the Wolverines in scoring this season and is drawing closer to his third consecutive 75-point season. Rivas has 59 points on 13-of-18 field goals and 20-of-21 extra point attempts this season. He tallied five points at Iowa, hitting a pair of PATs and a 26-yard field goal during the third quarter. Rivas has scored seven or more points in five of the past six games. Rivas is third in the Big Ten and 18th nationally in field goals per game (1.63 avg.). He is 78th nationally in scoring at 7.83 points per game.

Rivas Third in Field Goals Scored

Garrett Rivas enters the Northwestern game in third place on Michigan's career field goals scored list with 41. Rivas lists third in field goals scored (41) and is fourth in field goals attempted (54) and field goal percentage (75.9 pct.). Rivas has converted 72.2 percent of his field goals this season and trails record holder Bob Bergeron (82.9 pct, 1981-84), Jay Feely (76.9, 1995-98) and Remy Hamilton (76.8, 1993-96) on the career list. Rivas has connected on 41-of-54 field goal attempts in his career and is 31-of-38 from inside 40 yards (81.6 pct.). He is tied for fourth in school history with 10 field goals from 40 yards or more. Rivas has converted on 20 of his last 25 field goal attempts dating back to last season.

Rivas Ranks 10th in Career Scoring

With five points at Iowa, **Garrett Rivas** inched closer to a quartet of Michigan greats on the school's career scoring list. Rivas lists 10th all-time at Michigan with 230 career points, and needs seven to pass 2004 Biletnikoff Award winner Braylon Edwards (2001-04) and eight tallies to move ahead of 1940 Heisman Trophy winner Tom Harmon (1938-40). Rivas is 10 points shy of seventh place, where 2003 Doak Walker Award winner Chris Perry (2000-03) sits, and is 15 points from moving past three-time All-American Anthony Carter (1979-82) for sixth place on the career scoring list. Rivas is fourth among U-M kickers in points scored, trailing only third-place Mike Gillette (307, 1985-88), fourth-place Remy Hamilton (280, 1993-96) and fifth-place J.D. Carlson (254, 1988-91). Current Dallas Cowboys running back Anthony Thomas holds Michigan's career scoring record with 336 total points (1997-2000).

Breaston Chasing Big Ten Punt Return Mark

Steve Breaston heads into the Northwestern game in sixth place on the Big Ten's career punt return yardage list. He has returned 14 punts for 153 yards (10.9 avg.) this season, with nearly half of his yardage coming on a 72-yard return against Eastern Michigan (Sept. 17). Breaston is eighth in the conference in punt return average (10.9 avg.) this season and ranks 32nd nationally. In the conference annals, Breaston needs 12 yards to pass Northwestern's Brian Musso (1994-97) for fifth place, 25 yards to climb past Michigan

State's Gari Scott (1996-99) for the fourth spot and 39 yards to move ahead of Iowa's Tim Dwight (1994-97) for third place. Breaston needs 284 yards to eclipse Wisconsin's Jim Leonhard for the Big Ten career punt return yardage record. He is second among active players nationally in career punt return yards, trailing only Ryne Robinson of Miami (Ohio).

With the Wolverines 23-20 overtime victory at Iowa, **Lloyd Carr** became the third coach in Michigan history and 11th in Big Ten history to amass 100 victories at his institution. Carr has compiled a 100-32 record during his 11 seasons at Michigan. He joined Fielding H. Yost (165-29-10) and Bo Schembechler (194-48-5) as the only Wolverine coaches to reach the century mark in career victories. Carr has joined current conference coaches Barry Alvarez and Joe Paterno on the Big Ten's exclusive list of 100-game winners.

Carr vs. Big Ten Conference

The Big Ten's active leader in conference wins, **Lloyd Carr** will direct his 86th Big Ten game when the Wolverines face Northwestern. Carr has a 66-19 career Big Ten record and has guided U-M to victories in 16 of his last 19 conference games. He has led the Wolverines to five conference titles (1997, 1998, 2000, 2003 and 2004) in the past eight years. Carr has compiled a 36-6 record against Big Ten foes at Michigan Stadium and has won 26 of his last 29 at the "Big House."

Carr on the Road in the Big Ten

Lloyd Carr has a 30-13 conference mark on the road in Big Ten play. He posted a 3-1 record last season, defeating Indiana, Illinois and Purdue before having his 13-game conference winning streak snapped at Ohio State. Carr's teams have claimed 3-1 road records in the Big Ten each of the past four seasons and won 15 of 22 road games in the 2000s. The Wolverines have a 2-1 record this season and finish the conference road slate at Northwestern Saturday (Oct. 29).

Carr in Elite Company

By winning the 2004 Big Ten title, Lloyd Carr became the eighth coach in conference history to claim five or more Big Ten championships during his head coaching career. He joined Michigan coaches Fielding H. Yost and Bo Schembechler among the elite list of conference coaches to claim at least five titles. Carr is the active career leader in Big Ten wins, boasting a 66-19 record in conference play, and his teams have not finished below third in the league in the past eight years.

Wolverines Seek Third Consecutive Big Ten Title

The Michigan Wolverines are looking to capture their third straight Big Ten championship. The Wolverines have a long history of winning consecutive crowns. In fact, they have created streaks of conference championships 10 times. That includes four streaks of two titles in a row (including back-to-back titles in 2003-04), one streak of three titles in a row, four streaks of four titles in a row, and from 1988-92 Michigan won an incredible five Big Ten Conference championships in a row.

U-M in October

Michigan has compiled an impressive 395-113-13 (.771) all-time record in October. The Wolverines have a 32-8 mark in the 10th month of the year under head coach **Lloyd Carr** and have won 18 of their last 22 contests in October. U-M is 3-1 this season.

Michigan in Night Games

The Wolverines have compiled a 17-9 overall record in night games starting after 5 p.m. local time. The match-up with Northwestern will be the 27th night game in Michigan history. The Wolverines defeated the Wildcats, 12-6, in the only previous evening contest played between the two schools (Oct. 17, 1998). Michigan had its seven-game winning streak in night games snapped earlier this season, losing 23-20 at Wisconsin in the Big Ten opener (Sept. 24). The Wolverines have won seven of their last eight evening games and 10 of their last 12.
