Radio Coverage: The Michigan Sports Network is comprised of 29 stations. Frank Beckmann (play-by-play), Jim Brandstatter (analyst) and Steve Courtney (sideline reports) will originate the game on NewsTalk 760 WJR-AM in Detroit.

TV Coverage: ESPN2 will broadcast the game to a national audience. Pam Ward (play-by-play), David Norrie (color commentary) and Jimmy Dykes (sideline reports and analysis) will call the game.

Internet: Michigan (MGoBlue.com), Indiana (iuhoosiers.com)

Series History: This will be the 58th meeting between Michigan and Indiana. The Wolverines have a 48-9 advantage in the all-time series and are 33-7 in Ann Arbor against the Hoosiers (27-5 at Michigan Stadium). U-M has won 13 straight games against IU and has claimed victories in 28 of the last 29 contests (only setback was a 14-10 loss in 1987). Head coach Lloyd Carr has a 8-0 record against the Hoosiers.

Last Meeting: (#19 Michigan 35, Indiana 14 -- Memorial Stadium, Oct. 2, 2004) Michigan scored on three straight third-quarter possessions to blow the Indiana game wide open in a 35-14 victory that gave Lloyd Carr his 90th win as Michigan head coach.

The freshman duo of quarterback Chad Henne and tailback Michael Hart shouldered the load early. Henne completed 17-of-21 passes for a then career-high 316 yards and three touchdowns, while Hart rushed 20 times for 79 yards and scored on a one-yard run. Braylon Edwards was Henne's primary target in the second half as the pair combined on touchdown passes of 69 and 38 yards. Edwards made eight receptions for a career-high 165 yards.

Defensively, the Wolverines were led by linebackers Scott McClintock and LaMarr Woodley with six solo tackles apiece. Woodley added two tackles for loss. Senior inside linebacker Lawrence Reid contributed five solo stops and the team's lone sack.

U-M marched down the field and took a 7-0 lead on its opening series, a 40-yard TD pass from Henne to fifth-year senior receiver Jermaine Gonzales down the right sideline. Sophomore cornerback Leon Hall, subbing for an injured Steve Breaston as punt returner, extended the lead to 14-0 with 4:37 left in the second quarter on a 76-yard touchdown return.

The return game struck again when senior cornerback Grant Mason took the opening kickoff of the third quarter at the goal line and returned it 97 yards to the Indiana three-yard line. The Wolverines capped the drive with a Hart TD run and went on to score two more times for the 35-14 win.

Did You Know?

Six of Michigan's nine games have been decided by seven or less points this season, including five straight contests by three points or less. The Wolverines are 3-3 in those games and have a 3-2 conference mark.

Lloyd Carr has a 6-3 record in his 11th year as Michigan's head coach and his 26th overall season with the Wolverine program. The fifth-winningest active Division I-A coach with a .759 winning percentage, Carr has a 101-32 career record and a 67-19 Big Ten Conference mark. Carr became the third coach in Michigan history and the 11th in Big Ten history to amass 100 victories at his institution with the Wolverines' 23-20 overtime victory at Iowa (Oct. 22). He has guided the program to five Big Ten titles in the last eight years (1997-98-2000-03-04) and has led the Wolverines to nine consecutive Jan. 1 bowl games. Carr was named the 1997 national coach of the year after guiding the program to a perfect 12-0 record and the *Associated Press* national championship. Carr led the Wolverines to back-to-back Big Ten Conference titles (1997-98), a share of the 2000 championship and back-to-back conference crowns in 2003 and 2004. His teams have finished in the top 20 nationally each of his first 10 years. Carr, previously a Michigan assistant coach for 15 years, began his college coaching career as a defensive backs coach at Eastern Michigan (1976-77) before joining Gary Moeller's staff at Illinois in the same role (1978-79). Carr came to Michigan in 1980 as Bo Schembechler's secondary coach. Carr served as defensive coordinator (1987-94) and was elevated to assistant head coach for five seasons under Moeller (1990-94).

U-M Ranked 21 in AP Poll; 22nd in Coaches

The University of Michigan football team heads into the Indiana game ranked in the top 25 of both national polls. The Wolverines are listed No. 21 in the Associated Press and No. 22 in the USA Today Coaches polls released Sunday, Nov. 6. U-M received 372 votes in the Associated Press poll and collected 275 votes in the USA Today Coaches poll this week (Nov. 6).

Michigan was not ranked in the Sept. 25 national polls for the first time since Oct. 18, 1998, a streak that was snapped at 114 consecutive weeks ranked in the AP poll.

Associated Press Poll Notes:

-- Michigan has the most weekly appearances in the AP poll, appearing 719 times (including preseason poll).

-- Since the preseason 1988 poll, U-M has been listed in every poll except three in 1993, four in 1998 and three in 2005.

-- Michigan has been listed in the top 10 of the polls 62 times during Carr's tenure.

-- The Wolverines have been ranked in the top 25 for all but seven of Lloyd Carr's 133 career games (four in 1998 and three in 2005).

-- U-M ranks No. 1 all-time in composite AP final football polls (1936-2004).

-- The Wolverines have finished in the top 10 of the AP poll 36 times since its inception in 1936.

-- Michigan has finished in the final top 25 rankings 53 times since the inception of the AP poll in 1936.

-- U-M has finished in the top 25 rankings each of the past 20 seasons and 35 of the past 36 years (was not ranked in 1984 and did not receive a final AP ranking in 1982).

U-M vs. IU Game Notes

Nation's Toughest Schedule

Michigan's 2005 schedule is ranked as the toughest in all of college football. The Wolverines cumulative opposition has compiled a 58-30 overall record for a .659 winning percentage. Stanford (.658), Oklahoma (.655), Ohio State (.640) and North Carolina (.635) round out the top five in toughest schedules in Division I-A football.

Michigan in November

Michigan has compiled an impressive 293-112-20 (.713) all-time record in November. The Wolverines have a 25-10 mark in the 11th month of the year under head coach Lloyd Carr and have won 15 of their last 20 contests in November.

Michigan Following a Bye Week

The Wolverines have a 21-6-2 record since 1990 in games following an open week on their schedule. Michigan is 9-2 after a bye week under Lloyd Carr and has a 10-4 record since the bye week returned to fashion in 1986. The Wolverines have had two bye weeks in one season only twice during the 126 years of football at the University, with both coming under Carr. They defeated Miami-Ohio (38-19) and Indiana (34-17) during the 1995 season and the following year defeated Colorado (20-13) and Indiana (27-20) after bye weeks. U-M played without an open date on its schedule for 40 seasons (1946-85).

Wolverines vs. Hoosiers

The Wolverines have been very successful throughout the years in their series with the Indiana Hoosiers. In the 57 previous meetings the Wolverines hold a 48-9 record, which is an impressive .842 winning percentage. Last year at Memorial Stadium, the Wolverines won a hard-fought 35-14 game. Michigan has won 13 straight games and 28 of the last 29 contests against the Hoosiers, including an 8-0 mark during the Lloyd Carr era.

Michigan vs. Indiana at Michigan Stadium

The Wolverines have dominated the series at Michigan Stadium, posting a 27-5 record. U-M has a 33-7 all-time record against IU in Ann Arbor. Michigan has won 14 straight home games against Indiana dating back to 1960. The Wolverines last home loss to the Hoosiers was a low scoring 8-6 affair in 1958. U-M played 24 of the first 25 games in the series with IU at home and claimed victories in 19 of those 25 contests.

Wolverines from Indiana

Two players on the 2005 Michigan football team hail from the state of Indiana, with both listed on the depth chart. Sophomore **Chris Graham** (*Indianapolis, Ind./Warren Central HS*) is the team's starting inside linebacker and senior **Jeremy Van Alstyne** (*Greenwood, Ind./Center Grove HS*) is the backup at defensive end.

Carr vs. Big Ten Conference

The Big Ten's active leader in conference wins, **Lloyd Carr** will direct his 87th Big Ten game when the Wolverines host the Hoosiers. Carr has a 67-19 career Big Ten record and has guided U-M to victories in 17 of his last 20 conference games. He has led the Wolverines to five conference titles (1997, 1998, 2000, 2003 and 2004) in the past eight years. Carr has compiled a 36-6 record against Big Ten foes at Michigan Stadium and has won 26 of his last 29 at the "Big House." He has a 31-13 conference mark on the road.

Carr at Home in the Big Ten

Lloyd Carr has enjoyed considerable success against Big Ten foes at Michigan Stadium, compiling an impressive 36-6 record (.857). He has won 11 of his last 12 games against conference foes with the only loss coming in a 23-20 game against Minnesota earlier this season (Oct. 8). Carr has won all four Big Ten home games five times during his career, and has claimed 3-1 marks on the other five occasions.

Carr Piling Up Big House Victories

Lloyd Carr will roam the sidelines in his 70th home game at Michigan Stadium when the Wolverines host Indiana on Saturday (Nov. 12). Carr is looking to capture his 62nd victory in 70 games at the Big House. He has compiled a 61-8 career record at the Big House, with his .884 winning percentage ranking as the top mark among Wolverine coaches at Michigan Stadium.

Henne Nears 2,000 Passing Yards

Sophomore quarterback **Chad Henne** (*Wyomissing, Pa./Wilson HS*) nears his second straight 2,000-yard passing season as the Wolverines face the Hoosiers on Saturday (Nov. 12). Henne needs 142 passing yards against Indiana to eclipse 2,000 passing yards this season. He has completed 160-of-279 passes (57.3 pct.) for 1,859 yards with 16 touchdowns and seven interceptions this season. Henne has thrown for over 200 yards in six of the nine games this season, including a pair of 250-yard outputs at Wisconsin (258) and Michigan State (256). He completed 17-of-30 passes for 174 yards and one TD at Northwestern. Henne ranks 10th in U-M's season annals in pass attempts, 12th in completions, 15th in passing touchdowns and 16th in passing yards this season.

Henne Climbs Into Top 5 in Passing TDs

With one touchdown pass at Northwestern, **Chad Henne** needs two passing touchdowns to move ahead of Steve Smith (1980-83) on Michigan's career passing touchdown list. Henne is fifth with 41 passing scores, one TD shy of tying Smith for fourth place in the annals. Henne has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 20 of his 21 career games. His school record streak of 17 straight games with a touchdown pass was snapped earlier this season against Minnesota. Henne has 14 multi-touchdown passing games, including school-record-tying four passing TD games against Michigan State and Texas in the Rose Bowl game last year.

Henne Climbing Career Passing Charts

Chad Henne heads into the Indiana game ranked among the top seven in career passing at Michigan. In addition to ranking fifth in career passing TDs, Henne is fifth in career pass attempts (678) and career pass completions (400) and lists seventh in passing yards (4,602). Henne has thrown for at least 200 yards in 13 of his 21 career starts, including career-best 328-yard efforts at Indiana and Ohio State last year. He reached 3,000 and 4,000 career passing yards faster than any quarterback in Michigan history, achieving the feat in just 14 and 18 games respectively. Henne averages a school record 219.1 passing yards per contest.

Jackson Continues to Make Major Contribution

Junior tailback **Jerome Jackson** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) has made a major contribution to the running attack over the past two games. Inserted into the lineup for an injured Mike Hart at Iowa, Jackson rushed 11 times for 44 yards during the fourth quarter and overtime. He scored the game-winning touchdown during the first extra session against the Hawkeyes, crossing the goal line on a one-yard run over right tackle. Jackson followed up his game-winning effort with a career-high 105 rushing yards on 24 attempts at Northwestern. He is fourth on the team in rushing with a career-best 46 carries for 206 yards (4.5 avg.) and two touchdowns. Jackson needs 18 rushing yards to eclipse 500 in his career. He has rushed 107 times for 483 yards and five touchdowns in 26 career games.

Grady Grounding Out Yards

Freshman tailback **Kevin Grady** (*Grand Rapids, Mich./East Grand Rapids HS*) heads into the Indiana game second on the team in rushing this season. Grady has 361 rushing yards on 96 carries (3.8 avg.) and has scored two rushing touchdowns. He has also contributed eight receptions for 86 yards (10.8 avg.). Grady made his first career start at Northwestern, rushing a career-best 20 times for 64 yards and scored on a one-yard TD run. He also added two receptions for 19 yards against the Wildcats. Grady has 50 or more rushing yards in four contests this season, including a career-high 79 yards on 18 attempts vs. Notre Dame (Sept. 10). Grady is 10th all-time at Michigan among true freshmen rushers.

Hart Leads Team in Rushing

Sophomore tailback **Mike Hart** (*Syracuse, N.Y./Onondaga Central HS*) looks to return to the lineup against Indiana after missing the past seven quarters due to injury. He leads the team in rushing with 122 carries for 573 yards (4.7 avg.) and four rushing touchdowns. A Doak Walker Award candidate, he has cracked the 100-yard barrier in all four games that he has completed (six total games played). Hart has also been a major contributor in the passing game, listing tied for fifth on the team with 12 receptions for 108 yards (9.0 avg.) and one score. Hart has scored at least one touchdown in every game that he has completed this season. He caught a receiving TD against Northern Illinois and scored rushing TDs against Northern Illinois, Michigan State, Minnesota and Penn State.

Hart Dominating Big Ten Play

Mike Hart has been a productive back in Big Ten play during his short career, cracking the century mark in rushing during eight of his 12 career games. Hart has rushed 317 times for 1,666 yards (5.3 avg.) in conference play during his career for an average of 139 yards per contest. He has carried the ball 89 times for 452 yards (5.1 avg.) and scored three touchdowns in four games this season. Hart is fifth in conference play in rushing at 115 yards per contest. The 2004 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and first-team all-conference selection, Hart led the conference in rushing attempts (228) and yards (1,214) during Big Ten action last year. He has four 200-yard rushing efforts in those 12 career conference games.

Hart Surpasses 2,000 Career Yards

Mike Hart heads into the Indiana game in 20th place on Michigan's career rushing list with 2,028 yards. He has rushed 404 times for 2,028 yards (5.0 avg.) and scored 13 rushing touchdowns during his career. Hart has cracked the century mark in rushing 10 times during his career including a school record four 200-yard rushing efforts. Eight of his 10 career 100-yard rushing games have come in Big Ten contests, including all four 200-yard rushing efforts. Hart needs 107 rushing yards to move ahead of 1940 Heisman Trophy winner Tom Harmon (1938-40) for 19th on Michigan's career rushing list.

Hart Protecting the Pigskin

Mike Hart heads into the Indiana game with 386 consecutive offensive touches without a fumble. Hart has 134 touches this season, 122 carries and 12 receptions without a miscue, after carrying the ball 230 times and adding 22 receptions in eight-plus games last year following his only career fumble. The only time Hart fumbled the ball in his career was on a running play near the Iowa end zone during the fourth quarter of the Big Ten opener (Sept. 25, 2004).

Avant Catching 1,000

Senior wide receiver **Jason Avant** (*Chicago, Ill./Carver HS*) is charting a course to 1,000 receiving yards as the Wolverines host Indiana. Avant leads the team, ranks third in the Big Ten and is among the top 25 nationally in all receiving categories. He has career highs in every major receiving category this season. Avant has 65 catches for 834 yards (12.8 avg.) and six TDs this season. He made a team-leading five receptions for 67 yards at Northwestern. Avant has five or more receptions and 65 or more receiving yards in all nine games this season, including three 100-yard receiving efforts. He has scored a touchdown in five of the nine contests and has receiving TDs in eight of his past 12 games played dating back to last season. His 65 catches this season rank ninth all-time on Michigan's season reception list and he needs 191 receiving yards to jump into the top 10 on the school's season receiving yardage rankings.

Big Time, Big Ten Performer

A Biletnikoff Award candidate, **Jason Avant** enters the Indiana game nearing 50 receptions in conference play this season. He has 43 receptions for 524 yards (12.2 avg.) and three touchdowns in six games. Avant is third in receptions (7.17 avg.) and fifth in receiving yards (87.3 avg.) per contest. Avant has 108 receptions for 1,448 receiving yards and seven touchdowns in 22 Big Ten games. A two-time All-Big Ten second team performer by the coaches, Avant averages five receptions and 66 yards per conference game during his career. He has already surpassed his 2004 Big Ten statistics, 33 receptions for 390 yards and three TDs, with two conference games remaining.

Third Down Performer

Jason Avant has provided the Wolverines with a new set of downs (or touchdown) on 45 of his 65 catches this season, including 13 plays on third or fourth down. He moved the chains on 30 of his 43 catches during Big Ten action, including all three receptions at Northwestern. He has 43 third- or fourth-down receptions for 687 yards and three touchdowns during his career, with 39 of those catches converting third- or fourth-down opportunities.

Avant Chasing Top 3 in Receptions

Jason Avant heads into the Indiana game 10 receptions shy of third place on Michigan's career receptions list and needs 90 receiving yards to move from 10th to 7th place on the school's career receiving yardage list. Avant has 152 receptions for 2,074 career yards and has scored 11 receiving

touchdowns. He became the 10th player in school history to surpass 2,000 career receiving yards with his 18-yard reception in overtime at Iowa. Avant is tied for fourth in career receptions, 10th in receiving yards and is tied for 14th in receiving touchdowns. He has four career 100-yard receiving games, two on the road at Iowa (2003, 2005) and at Wisconsin and against Northern Illinois this season. He has made at least one reception in 32 consecutive games played.

Massaquoi Nears 500 Career Yards

Fifth-year senior tight end **Tim Massaquoi** (*Allentown, Pa./Parkland HS*) enters the Indiana game 41 yards shy of 500 in his career. He has 43 receptions for 459 yards (10.7 avg.) and two touchdowns during his career. Limited this season due to injury, Massaquoi has eight receptions for 59 yards (7.0 avg.) in seven games. He had two catches for a season-best 21 yards at Northwestern. He has started 27 games at tight end and played in 45 career contests. He needs seven catches for 50 in his career.

Ecker Snagging Passes

Senior tight end **Tyler Ecker** (*El Dorado Hills, Calif./Oak Ridge HS*) has become a favorite receiving target of Chad Henne this season, setting career highs in both receptions and receiving yards. Ecker is tied for second on the team in receptions (17) and is third in receiving yards (196). He has caught at least two passes in each of the past three games and in four of the last five contests for the Wolverines. Ecker made two receptions for 25 yards at Northwestern. He set his career highs early this season, catching seven passes for 74 yards vs. Notre Dame. Ecker needs nine catches for 50 in his career and 49 receiving yards to reach 500 career yards. He has contributed 41 receptions for 451 yards (11.0 avg.) and scored two touchdowns in 35 career games.

Breaston Nears 1,000 Career Yards

Senior wide receiver **Steve Breaston** (*North Braddock, Pa./Woodland Hills HS*) needs 81 receiving yards in the Indiana game to reach 1,000 career yards, the third of his elusive 1,000-yard career categories. He has 87 receptions for 919 yards (106 avg.) and seven touchdowns during his career. Breaston has at least one reception in 29 of his 32 career games. With 81 receiving yards, Breaston would join Wisconsin's Nick Davis as the only players in Big Ten history to gain 1,000 career yards in three different categories.

Breaston Fourth in Receiving

Steve Breaston enters the Indiana game fourth on the team in receptions and receiving yards this season. He has 15 catches for 184 yards (12.3 avg.) and scored his only touchdown on a 54-yard pass from Chad Henne at Iowa (Oct. 22). Breaston has at least one reception in all eight games played this season and has carried the ball eight times for 73 yards. He caught three passes for 24 yards and added three laterals for 29 yards at Northwestern. Breaston has started five games at wideout.

Manningham Making Moves

Freshman wide receiver **Mario Manningham** (*Warren, Ohio/Warren G. Harding HS*) continues to provide big plays offensively whether it's as a ball carrier or receiver. Manningham is second on the team in receptions (17), receiving yards (311) and receiving touchdowns (five). He leads the squad with an 18.3-yard average per catch. In addition, Manningham has been credited with five carries for 37 yards (7.4 avg.). He made three of those five rushes at Northwestern, catching a trifecta of laterals for 35 yards, including a 20-yarder that set up Michigan's opening score on a one-yard Grady run. Manningham has seven receptions and one rushing attempt of 20 yards or more this season. He is averaging a TD catch every 3.4 receptions and has 14 receptions for 250 yards and four touchdowns in conference play. He needs two touchdown receptions to equal Anthony Carter for the most receiving scores by a freshman receiver.

Freshman wide receiver **Antonio Bass** (*Jackson, Mich./Jackson HS*) has become a multiple threat in the Wolverines offensive scheme as the season progresses with his running, passing and receiving abilities. Bass has 10 carries for 68 yards and completed his only career pass for 13 yards to Jason Avant at Iowa (Oct. 22). Bass gained 11 yards on two runs at Northwestern and added one tackle. He has converted from a high school quarterback to wide receiver and seeks his first career reception when the Wolverines face Indiana.

Tabb Totals Career Highs

Senior wide receiver **Carl Tabb** (*Ann Arbor, Mich./Huron HS*) has caught a pass in five straight conference tilts entering the Indiana game. He has a career-high 12 receptions for 96 yards (8.0 avg.) this season, and grabbed a career-best five passes for 35 yards in the overtime victory at Michigan State (Oct. 1). Tabb made a three-yard catch at Northwestern and added one special teams tackle. He has also contributed one carry for three yards and three special teams stops this season. Tabb has 22 receptions for 199 yards (9.0 avg.) in 34 career games and seeks his first career receiving touchdown.

Massey Collects First Career TD

Sophomore tight end **Mike Massey** (*Brecksville, Ohio/St. Ignatius HS*) enters the Indiana game after collecting his first career touchdown reception. Massey made his only reception of the Northwestern game a memorable one, catching a pass in the left flat from Chad Henne and he dove into the end zone for a 10-yard touchdown during the second quarter. It was also Massey's first career reception in conference play. He has five receptions for 35 yards this season. Massey made two receptions for 23 yards vs. Eastern Michigan (Sept. 17) and caught two passes for three yards against Notre Dame (Sept. 10).

Stenavich Leads Team in Career Starts

Fifth-year senior left tackle **Adam Stenavich** (*Marshfield, Wis./Marshfield HS*) heads into the Indiana game looking to make his team-leading 37th career start along the offensive line. Stenavich has started all eight games at left tackle this season and has started 33 of his last 34 games over the last three years. He is a returning All-Big Ten first team selection from last year.

Lentz Anchors Offensive Line

Fifth-year senior right guard **Matt Lentz** (*Ortonville, Mich./Brandon HS*) looks to make his 34th career start when Michigan battles the Hoosiers this weekend. Lentz has started 32 of the past 33 games at right guard for the Wolverines. He had his streak of 27 consecutive starts snapped against Eastern Michigan earlier this season due to injury. Lentz was a candidate for the Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award this season. He was a first-team All-Big Ten selection by the coaches in 2004.

Rivas Notching Field Goals

Junior kicker **Garrett Rivas** (*Tampa, Fla./Jesuit HS*) has attempted and converted more field goals than any other Big Ten kicker this season. Rivas is 17-22 on field goals this season, and is 14-16 from inside 40 yards. He matched his career high with four field goals at Northwestern, converting on field goals from 26, 19, 38 and 28 yards. A Lou Groza Award candidate, Rivas leads the Big Ten and is seventh nationally in field goals per game (1.89 avg.). He leads the team in scoring with 74 points this season and needs one tally to reach 75 or more points for the third straight season.

With a career-best 15 points at Northwestern, **Garrett Rivas** moved from 11th to sixth place on Michigan's career points list. Rivas has 245 career points and moved ahead of four Michigan greats following his performance at Northwestern: Braylon Edwards, Tom Harmon, Chris Perry and Anthony Carter. Rivas needs 10 points against Indiana to move past kicker J.D. Carlson (1988-91) for fifth place on the school's career scoring list. Rivas has scored 10 or more points in eight career games. Rivas is fourth among U-M kickers in points scored, trailing only third-place Mike Gillette (307, 1985-88), fourth-place Remy Hamilton (280, 1993-96) and fifth-place J.D. Carlson (254, 1988-91). Current Dallas Cowboys running back Anthony Thomas holds Michigan's career scoring record with 336 total points (1997-2000).

Breaston Nears 1,000 All-Purpose Yards

Steve Breaston heads into the Indiana game 99 all-purpose yards shy of his third consecutive 1,000-yard season. Breaston has 901 all-purpose yards on

59 touches (15.3 avg.) this season, with a pair of touchdowns on a 95-yard kickoff return vs. Minnesota (Oct. 8) and a 54-yard reception at Iowa (Oct. 22). He is 61st nationally in all-purpose yardage (112.6 avg.).

Breaston Making Positive Returns

Steve Breaston lists among the top return specialists nationally this season, lists 31st in punt returns (10.84 avg.) and 33rd in kickoff returns (25.71 avg.). Breaston has 19 punt returns for 206 yards and 17 kickoff returns for 438 yards this season, his third consecutive year with at least 600 return yards. He scored his only return touchdown this season on a 95-yard kickoff return vs. Minnesota (Oct. 8). Breaston has nine kickoff returns and three punt returns of 20 yards or more this season.

Breaston Chasing Big Ten Punt Return Mark

With five punt returns for 53 yards at Northwestern, **Steve Breaston** moved from sixth place to third on the Big Ten's career punt return yardage list. Breaston is sixth in the conference in punt return average (10.8 avg.) this season. He has 88 career punt returns for 1,117 yards (12.7 avg.) and three touchdowns. Already Michigan's career punt return leader, Breaston needs 55 yards to pass Penn State's Bruce Branch (1998-2001) for second place in the conference annals. He is 231 yards shy from eclipsing Wisconsin's Jim Leonhard for the Big Ten career punt return yardage record. Breaston is second among active players nationally in career punt return yards, trailing only Ryne Robinson of Miami (Ohio).

Breaston Nears Total Returns Marks

Steve Breaston enters the Indiana game needing three returns and 76 return yards to surpass Anthony Carter (1979-82) for the Michigan career records. Carter has 144 returns for 2,510 yards while Breaston has 142 touches for 2,435 yards and a school-record-tying four touchdowns. He holds Michigan's career punt return records with 88 returns for 1,117 yards (12.7 avg.) and three touchdowns. Breaston lists second to Carter in kickoff returns with 54 returns for 1,318 yards (24.4 avg.) and one score. Carter holds the U-M record with 63 kickoff returns for 1,606 yards. Breaston needs 10 returns and 289 yards to break Carter's career kickoff return records.

Both Corners in Top 5 in Stops

Michigan's starting cornerback tandem of fifth-year senior cornerback **Grant Mason** (*Pontiac, Mich./Orchard Lake St. Mary's HS*) and junior cornerback **Leon Hall** (*Vista, Calif./Vista HS*) are listed in the top five in tackles for the Wolverines this season. Mason leads the team with 71 stops and Hall is fourth with 46 tackles. The duo shares the lead in pass breakups (seven) and interceptions (two).

Mason Pacing Squad in Stops

Grant Mason is leading the Wolverine in tackles and needs four stops to reach 75 this season. Mason has a career-best 71 stops and two tackles for loss. He is also tied for the team lead in pass breakups (seven) and interceptions (two). Mason was held to a season-low two stops at Northwestern but picked up an interception. He has tallied six or more stops in seven of the nine games this season. Mason is tied for 12th in the Big Ten in tackles per contest (7.9 avg.) and is tied for 92nd nationally. He is tied for 41st in the nation in solo stops per game (5.44 avg.).

Harris Nears 75 Stops on the Year

Senior inside linebacker **David Harris** (*Grand Rapids, Mich./Ottawa Hills HS*) heads into the Indiana game eight stops shy of 75 on the season. Harris is second on the team in tackles this season, tallying a career-best 67 stops, including five tackles for loss, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and three pass breakups. He has contributed five or more stops in all six conference games, including back-to-back double digit tackle efforts against Minnesota (18 stops) and Penn State (10 tackles). Harris made five stops at

Northwestern. He has started the past eight games at inside linebacker after missing the opener vs. Northern Illinois due to injury. Harris has 79 career tackles in 17 games of action.

Harris Among Big Ten and National Leaders

David Harris has been a tackling machine for the Wolverines since the outset of the Notre Dame. He has two double digit tackle efforts and has tallied eight or more stops in five of his eight games this season. Harris lists seventh in the Big Ten and tied for 68th nationally in tackles this season (8.4 avg.). In conference play, Harris is tied for ninth with an average of 9.3 stops per contest. He is tied for 63rd nationally in solo tackles per game, averaging five per contest.

Burgess Burying Opposition

Junior outside linebacker **Prescott Burgess** (*Warren, Ohio/Warren G. Harding HS*) has been one of the team's most consistent performers in conference play, averaging 7.7 stops per contest. Burgess has contributed six or more stops in each of the six Big Ten games thus far, including a career-best 11 tackles at Iowa. He led the team with seven stops at Northwestern, including one tackle for loss and one pass breakup. Burgess is third on the team with a career-best 63 tackles. He has also contributed four TFLs, one sack, two forced fumbles and three PBUs.

Burgess Joins Century Club

With seven stops against the Wildcats, **Prescott Burgess** became the fifth current Wolverine to reach the century mark in career stops. Burgess joined teammates Leon Hall (120), Scott McClintock (143), LaMarr Woodley (134) and Pierre Woods (112) in the century club. Burgess has amassed 105 career stops in 32 games of action, including four tackle for loss, one sack, one interception, two fumble recoveries and five pass breakups.

Woods Walloping Opponents

Fifth-year senior **Pierre Woods** (*Cleveland, Ohio/Glenville HS*) is playing the best football of his Michigan career heading into the final two games of the season. Woods has picked up six of his 15 stops this season in the opposition's backfield, including sacks at Michigan State (Oct. 1) and Iowa (Oct. 22). He tallied a season-high five stops at Northwestern after registering four stops, two TFLs, one sack and one pass breakup at Iowa. Woods has played in all nine games this season and has started the past two contests at rush linebacker. He is the team's career leader in games played with 47 and has started 19 games, recording 112 stops, 22 TFLs, nine sacks, two fumble recoveries and two PBUs.

Hall Eyes 50-Tackle Campaign

The Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week following the Northwestern game, **Leon Hall** has been a steadying force in the Wolverines secondary this season. Hall is fourth on the team in with 46 tackles, two stops shy of his career-best 48-tackle effort from 2004. He has also contributed three tackles for loss, two sacks, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Hall was second on the team with six tackles at Northwestern and set a Michigan record with an 83-yard touchdown return on a fumble to give Michigan a 14-0 lead in the first quarter. On the play, Hall forced the fumble, pounced on the ball and ran 83 yards for the first defensive score of the season for the Wolverines. He also added a tackle for loss against the Wildcats. Hall shares the team lead in pass breakups (seven) and interceptions (two) this season. He has started all nine games at cornerback this season and leads the secondary with 21 career starts. Hall has contributed 120 tackles, four TFLs, three sacks, seven interceptions, three fumble recoveries and 23 pass breakups.

Hall Collecting Pass Breakups

With seven PBUs this season, **Leon Hall** is tied for ninth place on Michigan's career pass breakup list with Thom Darden (23, 1969-71). Hall needs three PBUs to reach double digits in breakups for the second straight season, joining Marion Body (1979-82) and Todd Howard (1998-2001) as the only Wolverines to collect 10 or more PBUs in a season twice during their career. Howard accomplished the feat a school record three times and holds the career record with 41 PBUs. Hall has 23 career passes defended, seven of which are interceptions. He needs four breakups to reach the top

five in school history and 19 to eclipse Howard for the record.

Trent Playing Increasing Role in Secondary

Sophomore cornerback **Morgan Trent** (*Brighton, Mich./Orchard Lake St. Mary's HS*) has stepped into the No. 3 cornerback slot and continues to elevate his game as the season hits the stretch run. He switched from wide receiver to cornerback during spring drills and has played in all nine games in the secondary and started four contests at cornerback. Trent has contributed 18 tackles, one tackle for loss and one interception. His five pass breakups are second only to starters Grant Mason and Leon Hall. He has tallied 12 of his 18 stops in the past three games, making three stops in both the Penn State and Northwestern games and a career-best six stops at Iowa.

Crable Corraling Opponents

Junior outside linebacker **Shawn Crable** (*Massillon, Ohio/Washington HS*) enters the Indiana game after producing the best games of his career at Iowa and Northwestern. Crable tallied a career-best three tackles and the team's only sack against the Wildcats after making two solo stops and one pass breakup against the Hawkeyes. Crable has seven stops, one TFL, one sack and one PBU this season.

Harrison Stepping Up at Safety

Freshman safety **Brandon Harrison** (*Dayton, Ohio/Chaminade-Julienne HS*) has stepped into the starting role at free safety because of injury to regular starter Willis Barringer. Harrison has produced his best performances in the past two games, tallying a career-best eight tackles, one interception and one PBU at Iowa (Oct. 22). He followed up with three stops, two pass breakups and an interception and 36-yard return on the pick. Harrison has played in all nine games and started four contests, registering 19 tackles, two interceptions and four passes defended. He is tied for the team lead in interceptions and is tied for third in PBUs.

Watson Clogging the Middle

Senior nose tackle **Gabe Watson** (*Novi, Mich./Southfield HS*) is playing his best football of the season as the Wolverine reach the stretch run. Watson has been clogging the middle of the defense for the Wolverines and has racked up 19 of his 33 stops in the last four games. He made three tackles at Northwestern and forced three holding penalties by the Wildcats. Watson has contributed 33 stops, five TFLs and three sacks this season. He has started five games and played in all nine games, making at least two stops in every game this season. Watson tallied a season-best seven stops, one tackle for loss and one sack against Minnesota. He also made six stops and a career-high two sacks at Iowa. Watson needs five stops to surpass his season-best 37 stops from last year. He has played in 42 career games and made 16 starts along the defensive line. Watson has posted 85 tackles, 13 TFLs and five sacks.

Woodley Second in Conference in Tackles for Loss

Junior rush linebacker **LaMarr Woodley** (*Saginaw, Mich./Saginaw HS*) is second in the Big Ten Conference and lists 16th nationally in tackles for loss this season. He leads the Wolverines in stops behind the line of scrimmage (14) and sacks (five) while ranking fourth on the team in tackles with 41 stops. Woodley lists sixth in the conference with a career-best five sacks. In addition, he has contributed two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Woodley has more than double the TFLs of the second closest player on the team, Pierre Woods with six TFLs, and has tallied at least one stop behind the line of scrimmage in all but one game this season. Woodley had his seven-game streak this season and 12-game overall streak with at least one TFL snapped at Iowa, as he saw action in only two plays, a pair of second half third down plays by the Hawkeyes. Woodley missed the Northwestern game due to injury, the first game that he missed during his career. He has played in 33 career games and made 19 starts, contributing 134 stops, 34 TFLs, 10 sacks, one fumble recovery and four PBUs. Woodley looks to make his 20th career start in Michigan's defense against Indiana.

Graham Grounding Opponents; Sixth in Stops

Chris Graham enters the Indiana game sixth on the team in tackles this season. The first-year starter has a career-best 37 stops, including three tackles for loss, one fumble recovery and one pass breakup. He has started four of the eight games at inside linebacker, with the non-starting assignments coming when the Wolverines started multiple defensive backs. Graham contributed two stops at Northwestern. Graham has tallied six or more stops in all four of his starts, including a career-high 10 tackles and two TFLs in the opener vs. Northern Illinois, his first career starting assignment. He is seven tackles shy of 50 in his career. Graham has 43 tackles, three TFLs, one fumble recovery and one PBU in 21 career games of action.

Wolverines Seek Third Consecutive Big Ten Title

The Michigan Wolverines are looking to capture their third straight Big Ten championship. The Wolverines have a long history of winning consecutive crowns. In fact, they have created streaks of conference championships 10 times. That includes four streaks of two titles in a row (including back-to-back titles in 2003-04), one streak of three titles in a row, four streaks of four titles in a row, and from 1988-92 Michigan won an incredible five Big Ten Conference championships in a row.
