## This Week's Storylines

### FACEOFF

The No. 3-ranked Michigan Wolverines head south to Oxford, Ohio, to take on Miami (Ohio) this weekend (Dec. 2-3). The Maize and Blue will be playing its final games at Goggin Ice Arena, as Miami will open a new arena in 2006-07. Both games this weekend will feature 7:35 p.m. puck drops.

### SCOUTING REPORT: MIAMI (OHIO)

Head coach Enrico Blasi is in his seventh season coaching at Miami. The CCHA leading RedHawks have jumped out to an 8-1-1 record following a weekend sweep of Bowling Green. Senior captain Andy Greene and sophomore Mitch Ganzak have been offensive catalysts for Miami, co-leading the team in scoring from the blue line. Sophomore forward Nathan Davis rounds out the triumvirate at the top of the RedHawk scoring attack. Dangerous junior forwards Matt Christie and Marty Guerin were key contributors to the 11-goal weekend against the Falcons. Sophomore Charlie Effinger and freshman Jeff Zatkoff have been splitting time in goal. Effinger leads the nation in GAA (1.38) and save percentage (.945). Zatkoff is third in both GAA (1.58) and save percentage (.936).

The Wolverines got off to a very quick start when **T.J. Hensick** scored 20 seconds into the game. It would be Michigan's only lead of the game, however, as the Golden Gophers scored four goals, three on the power play, over a 6:14 span later in the period. **Brandon Naurato** cut the margin to 4-2 before the first intermission. **Matt Hunwick** capitalized on a two-man advantage at 11:57 of the second frame to trim the deficit to one goal. The U-M comeback was halted with 3:45 left in the stanza as Ryan Potulny finished his hat trick. The Gophers potted one more goal, their fifth power-play tally, in the third to finalize the scoring.

Just over a minute later **Tim Miller** scored his first career goal on a wraparound to cut the deficit in half. **Brandon Naurato** knotted the game at 2-2 when he knocked in rebound while U-M was on the power play early in the third stanza. The remainder of the game was back and forth with each team earning chances. Wisconsin was the only team to capitalize though, when Adam Burish split the U-M defense and scored on a breakaway with 1:58 left on the clock.

**LEADERS VERSUS THE REDHAWKS**

Against Miami, **T.J. Hensick** leads the current group of Wolverines with three goals, including two on the power play, and four assists. **Andrew Ebbett** has a 1-5-6 line in eight career games against the RedHawks. **Matt Hunwick** has a goal and four assists in six career games.

**LAST YEAR'S SERIES**

Michigan swept the RedHawks by scores of 5-2 and 5-3 on Nov. 5-6, 2004, respectively. On the first night, Jeff Tambellini lit the lamp three times, twice on the power play. With the score tied 1-1, Michigan rattled off four straight power-play goals to earn the win on Nov. 5. David Moss

assisted on each of Tambellini's tallies. **T.J. Hensick** and **Chad Kolarik** had U-M's other scores. Game two was a closer affair. U-M staked a 3-0 lead in the second period, but Miami battled back to make it 3-2 early in the final frame. U-M scored in the last few minutes, but again the RedHawks cut the lead to one. An empty-net goal sealed the win. Michigan outshot Miami 39-15. Tambellini and Moss teamed up for three goals and two assists and were +6 for the game.

**ALL-TIME AGAINST MIAMI**

The Maize and Blue is 63-15-2 against Miami in the all-time series, which began in 1981 when Michigan joined the CCHA. In Oxford, U-M leads 21-13-1. There have been 11 combined sweeps, seven by the Wolverines and four by the RedHawks. At Yost Ice Arena, U-M is a phenomenal 40-2-1. In two neutral site contests, Michigan is 2-0-0. Michigan and Miami have met just three times outside of CCHA regular season play

with each bout occurring in the CCHA Tournament. In those games, U-M is 3-0-0.

The Wolverines are on a five-game winning streak against the RedHawks. The last loss came in Oxford, Ohio, on Oct. 10, 2003, which is also Michigan's lone blemish over the last 20 games (19-1-0) of the series dating back to 1997-98. ### BERENSON VS. THE REDHAWKS

Red Berenson is 57-13-2 in his career against Miami. He's 19-11-1 at Goggin Ice Arena. With Enrico Blasi behind the RedHawk bench, Berenson is 15-1-0.

### CLIMBING THE CHARTS

After just 13 games **Jack Johnson** has already earned a spot in the Michigan annals for freshmen defensemen. With his assist vs. Wisconsin, he tallied his 17th point (4-13-17), which ties him with Greg Fox (1972-73) and Harold Schock (1993-94) for 14th on the all-time freshman defenseman points list.

Should Johnson continue his pace he would obliterate the record of 31 points held by Dean Turner (1976-77). With another goal he will tie for seventh with four other freshmen rearguards. The goal record is 13 by Dean Turner in 1976-77. Finally, Johnson needs two assists to tie Greg Fox (1972-73) for 10th and 10 to tie the record holder, Pat Neaton (1989-90).

### AND STILL MORE FIRSTS

**Tim Miller** scored the first goal of his career when his wraparound shot vs. Wisconsin found the back of the net. It was the first U-M marker of the game. On Miller's score, **Tyler Swystun** recorded his first career assist. The lone freshman still waiting for his first career goal is defenseman **Mark Mitera**.

### POWER PLAY STREAK STILL INTACT

The U-M power play unit extended its season-long goal streak to 13 games. However, the nation's top-ranked power-play unit (29.5% heading into the week-end) was unable to maintain its pace, tallying only one power-play goal in each game versus Minnesota and Wisconsin. Collectively, Michigan was 2-for-17 on the power play (11.7%) during the College Hockey Showcase.

### POINT STREAKS ENDED

**Chad Kolarik** pushed his career-best point streak to six games with an assist vs. Minnesota on Friday before it came to an end the next night vs. Wisconsin. The





**Head Coach Red Berenson**



A 17-year veteran of the NHL, Red Berenson (U-M, 1962) is in his 22nd season at the helm for the Wolverines, where he owns a 573-266-59 record. Berenson is currently in 8th place on college hockey's coaching win list and is one of 14 head coaches in college hockey history to accumulate 500 wins. A former Michigan

captain and two-time All-American for U-M from 1960-62, Berenson has averaged more than 26 wins per season in his collegiate coaching career. He has led Michigan to a pair of NCAA Championships (1996, 1998) and 14 consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, the longest active streak of any school in college hockey. He spent three seasons (1980-82) as head coach of the NHL's St. Louis Blues before coming back to Michigan, earning NHL Coach of the Year honors in 1981.

streak began at Alaska Fairbanks on Oct. 29 and went through Nov. 25 vs. the Gophers. Kolarik had four goals and four assists over that span. He also tied his career-best goal streak of three games (Nov. 4-11).

**Jack Johnson's** career-best point streak ended at five games after he was held off the scoresheet on Friday vs. the Gophers. Over the five-game span he had two goals and six assists.

On Saturday, **T.J. Hensick** was held off the scoresheet for just the third time this season. The point-less night ended a six-game point streak in which he had five goals and seven assists. The Wolverines are 0-2-1 this season when Hensick does not tally a point.

**POINT STREAK STARTED**

**Brandon Naurato** is riding career-best goal and point streaks. Over the last three games he has deposited four goals. Going back four games he has a 4-1-5 line. Naurato had a career-high two goals, including the game winner at NMU on Nov. 12. He then scored once each vs. Minnesota and Wisconsin.

**BULL PENNED**

**Brandon Kaleniecki** did not dress on Saturday night vs.

Wisconsin due to injury, snapping his 108-game streak in the lineup, which was the longest active stretch for any Wolverine. Kaleniecki last sat out a game during his freshman season on Feb. 22, 2003. He lost five straight games due to injury then.

The new consecutive games played leader for U-M is **Jason Dest**, who has skated in 97 straight games for the Maize and Blue since sitting out the first game of his freshman year in 2003-04.

**No. 1 JINX**

Michigan's struggles when it is the No. 1 team in the nation continued during the College Hockey Showcase. With the weekend-opening defeat vs. Minnesota, U-M's winless streak was extended to 0-5-1 in its first game after being tabbed No. 1. The last time Michigan won its next game after being No. 1 was in 1996-97, when they Wolverines were tops in the nation 20 out of 21 weeks. Since then the outcomes have included: lost vs. Michigan State on Nov. 4, 2000; lost to Northeastern on Oct. 8, 2004; lost at Minnesota on Nov. 26, 2004; tied vs. Michigan State on Oct. 22, 2005; lost at Alaska Fairbanks on Oct. 28, 2005; lost vs. Minnesota on Nov. 25, 2005.

Even in the four weekends in which Michigan has had a chance to redeem itself the next night, it is just 2-2-0, giving the Maize and Blue a cumulative record of 2-7-1 when No. 1.

**13TH COLLEGE HOCKEY SHOWCASE**

With the 6-3 defeat at the hands of Minnesota and the 3-2 loss to Wisconsin, the Wolverines have now lost six straight games in the College Hockey Showcase. Their last win came on Dec. 1, 2002 against Minnesota in Minneapolis.

Over the weekend, Wisconsin went 2-0-0, Minnesota went 1-0-1, Michigan State went 0-1-1 and U-M went 0-2-0. As a result, U-M dropped from first place in the all-time CHS standings into a tie for second. Minnesota is now first at 14-9-3 (.596). U-M (14-11-1, .558) and Michigan State (13-10-3, .558) are tied. Wisconsin, which was at one point winless (0-9-1) in the CHS over a five-year span from 1994-98 and has been swept a total of seven times, has won three games in a row and five of six to stand at 7-18-1, .288).

Minnesota's Ryan Potulny scored the eighth hat trick in CHS history on Friday against Michigan. The last hat trick had been tallied by Thomas Vanek (Minnesota) in 2002 vs. Michigan State.

**QUINTET RATED BY CENTRAL SCOUTING**

The NHL's Central Scouting Service released its rankings for the 2006 Entry Draft last week, rating prospects by the league they play in. Lebler skates for the Penticton Vees of the British Columbia Hockey League. Kampfer plays for the Sioux City Musketeers of the United States Hockey League. Summers is with the U.S. National Team Development Program.

Michigan has welcomed at least one alumnus of the Ann Arbor-based U.S. NTDP in each of the past seven seasons.

**BERENSON, TEAM CANADA 1972 IN CANADIAN SPORTS HALL OF FAME**

Red Berenson was one of 35 players from Team Canada's 1972 Summit Series squad inducted into the Canadian Sports Hall of Fame on Wednesday, Nov. 2. At the time, the Summit Series, which pitted Canada against Russia in an eight-game series won by Canada, 4-3-1, was the landmark hockey event in Canada. In 2000, the Canadian Press voted the 1972 Summit Series squad the "Team of the Century" for its triumphant come-from-behind series victory. Canada trailed in the series 1-3-1 before winning three straight games in Russia.

**SECOND FIDDLE**

The Wolverines were picked to finish second in the CCHA behind the Ohio State Buckeyes in both the coaches and media polls at CCHA Media Day on Sept. 27. After OSU and U-M, the other consensus top five teams in both polls were Northern Michigan, Michigan State and Nebraska-Omaha, respectively.

This is the first time since the 2001-02 season that the Wolverines are not the favorites in the CCHA preseason polls. Michigan has finished the year in either first or second place in the CCHA for 15 consecutive seasons including nine regular season conference titles.

**DONNING THE 'C'**

Senior center **Andrew Ebbett** is the 85th captain in Michigan hockey history. He takes over the captain duties following the graduation of Eric Nystrom. Wearing 'A's as alternate captains will be senior left wing **Brandon Kaleniecki**, junior center **T.J. Hensick** and junior defenseman **Matt Hunwick**. None of the four players were captains a season ago, making this the first campaign since 2001-02 that there are no returning captains. Ebbett, who hails from Vernon, B.C., is the first Canadian captain since Sean Peach (Langley, B.C.) wore the 'C' for the Wolverines in 1999-2000.

**WE LOVE ANN ARBOR**

The U.S. National Team Development Program, based in Ann Arbor at the Ann Arbor Ice Cube, trains 15-18-year-old hockey players from across the nation. Five members of its roster from last season -- **Jason Bailey**, **Danny Fardig**, **Jack Johnson**, **Zac MacVoy** and **Mark Mitera** -- are joining Michigan this year. With **T.J. Hensick**, **Matt Hunwick**, **Chad Kolarik** and **Kevin Porter**, the Maize and Blue have nine current players from the NTDP. In the eight years of the program, 17 U.S. NTDP alumni have skated for the Maize and Blue.

**HISTORY MAKERS**

Freshmen **Jack Johnson** and **Andrew Cogliano** made Michigan history this summer by becoming the first duo selected in the first round of the NHL Entry Draft.

Johnson, who was drafted third overall by the Carolina Hurricanes in 2005, made even more history by becoming the highest U-M draftee. Aaron Ward was drafted fifth overall by the Winnipeg Jets in 1991. Cogliano was drafted 25th overall by the Edmonton Oilers.

**LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON**

Freshman **Travis Turnbull** is following in the steps of his father Perry, a former NHL player. Perry was coached by Red Berenson from 1980-82 while playing for the St. Louis Blues. Now the younger Turnbull will have his turn learning from the legendary coach.

**LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON, LIKE UNCLE**

Freshman **Danny Fardig** is no stranger to Michigan hockey. As an Ann Arbor native, he has been witness to nearly 100 Michigan hockey games already in his life. He also is a second generation Michigan hockey player as his father, Don, lettered for the Maize and Blue from 1973-76 and his uncle, Dave, played in 1981. Both also were members of the Michigan golf team.

**NCAA TRADITION**

Michigan made it 15 straight seasons with an NCAA appearance in 2004-05. The longest active NCAA streak began in 1990-91. Over the past 11 campaigns, U-M has at least one NCAA Tournament win. The Wolverines have reached the Frozen Four on nine occasions during the streak and have gone on to capture national titles (1996, '98).
